 The Industrial Property office of Lesotho is a division under the Registrar General's Department of the Ministry of Law, Constitutional Affair and Human Rights.

 The office deals with administration of Industrial Property as well as Copy Right issues



Status of automation

Pre-automation

- Before the deployment of IPAS, the office received the trademark applications and then recorded them in the register. The application was then allocated an application number manually.
- The office then issued a notification known as form C (1) which is used to notify the applicant of the application number and the filling date of the application. The said form was issued whether the application met the formalities or not.

- The applications were then compiled and submitted to the publication officer who would then compile a publication manually and allocate it a publication number.
- After the expiry of the opposition period, a registration certificate was then issued.
- There was a lengthy turnaround time for registration of trademarks (11 months or even more)

- There were a lot of errors on the document

- It was very difficult to compare figurative marks during substantive examination and prior search as logos were kept in index books.

- It was very difficult to compile statistical data as well as making reports.



Automation

- Since the deployment of Industrial Property Automation System (IPAS) in September 2014 and the provision of technical support for the system by WIPO, the processing of trademarks has improved its service delivery significantly by reducing the lengthy turnaround times for registration of trademark.
- The office currently uses the IPAS java 2.7 which has helped the office to effectively receive and capture applications into the system, conduct preliminary and substantive examination as well as generate a journal and registration certificate though the system.
- Now when the office receives an application, after conducting formality examination, the system generates "form C (1) or form C (1) (a) depending on whether the application complies with the formalities or not.

Application of a trademark

- The applicant files a trademark application with the office.
- Receiving of an application by the office
- Checking for formalities
- Issue form c (1) or form c (1) (a)
- Conduct search and substantive examination
- Issue a notice of acceptance, conditional acceptance, refusal or provisional refusal
- Publish a journal
- Await opposition period of 3 months
- Issue notice to pay for registration.
- Issue registration certificate.

Strategies for data quality management.
