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**Louis CHAN**

Mr. Chan is a Legal Counsel in the Intellectual Property Office of Singapore (IPOS). He is the Director at its Registry of Trade Marks. He manages the registry's operations, and oversees both local applications and international registrations for compliance with the relevant laws. In addition to the above, Mr. Chan also assists in trade mark law reviews and conducts trade mark hearings.

He graduated from the National University of Singapore in 1997 with an LLB (Honours). He joined Messrs Allen & Gledhill as a pupil in its Intellectual Property & Technology Department, and after being called to the bar the following year, he remained with the firm for the next seven years, specializing in IP registration, opposition and enforcement. In the course of his work, he had acted for many proprietors of international brands including BP plc, Estee Lauder and the Walt Disney Company.

He took up his previous position as Deputy Director in IPOS in 2004 and was appointed Director from July 2009.
