Memorandum of the Director General

I. INTRODUCTION

- $1. \quad In accordance with Article 13 (1) of the Convention Establishing the World Intellectual Property Organization, any agreement entered into with a view to establishing working relations and cooperation with other intergovernmental organizations shall be approved by the WIPO Coordination Committee.$
- II. COOPERATIONAGREEMENTBETWEENTHEWORLDINTELLECTUAL PROPERTYORGANIZATIONANDTHECOMMONMARKETFOREASTERN ANDSOUTHERN AFRICA
- 2. The Director General of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) and the Secretary General of the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA) have prepared and signed a cooperation agreement to enhance cooperation between WIPO and COMESA and, in particular, to promote the economic, so cial and cultural development of the Member States of COMESA through better use by the mofane ffective intellectual property system. The text of the Cooperation Agreement is set for thin the Annex to the present document.

PREAMBLE

The World Intellectual Property Organization, herein after referred to as `iWIPO, `iand the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa, herein after referred to as `iCOMESA, `iand alternatively both jointly referred to as `ithe Parties: `i

Considering theimportance of trade, industry, science, technology and culture to the economic, social and cultural development of States;

Convinced of the importance of intellec tual property as an instrument for the promotion of trade, industry, science and technology and also culture;

 ${\it Conscious of}\ the need to promote the protection and exploitation of genetic resources, traditional teachings and knowledge and folklore;$

Desiring to cooperate in promoting the economic, social and cultural development of the member States of COMES Athrough better use by the mofane ffective intellectual property system;

Havingregard to the Convention Establishing the World Intellectual Proper ty Organization (signed at Stockholm, Sweden, on July 14, 1967) and to the Treaty establishing the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (signed at Kampala, Uganda, on November 5, 1993);

Now, therefore, the Partie shere by a gree as follows:

ARTICLE1

Cooperation

- 1. The Parties shall work in close cooperation and consultation on matters of common interestin order to harmonize their efforts to contribute to the economic, so cial and cultural development of the COMESAM ember States, due regard being iven to their respective mandates.
- 2. WithinthelimitsoftheframeworklaiddowninArticle2,theareasofcooperationshall bethefollowing:
 - (a) The Parties shall work on the establishment of a legal environment commensurate with the international commitments of the COMESAM ember States in such a way as to promote better use of intellectual property and the rebytocontribute to the development of trade, industry, science and technology and also culture.
 - (b) Withintheirrespectivemandates,th ePartiesshallcooperateintakingappropriate actiontopromoteinventionandinnovationinthememberStates.

- (c) The Parties shall cooperate in the implementation of a program of intellectual property training and awareness promotion consistent with the achievement of the aims of this Agreement.
- (d) The Parties shall promote free -of-charge access to the information available to the mand to their respective databases of laws, regulations and technical information, subject to Article 3.
- (e) The Part ies shall cooperate in implementing a program of awareness promotion on the protection and exploitation of genetic resources, traditional teachings and knowledge and folklore.
- (f) The Parties shall agree on any other area of cooperation within the frame work or their work programs.

ARTICLE2

Representation

- 1. COMES Ashallbeinvitedtotakepart, as an observer, in meetings convened by WIPO that deal with matters of particular interest to it.
- 2. Following COMESARules of Procedure for granting observe restauts to cooperating partners, WIPO shall be invited to take part, as an observer, in meeting sconvened by COMESA that deal with matters of particular interest to it.
- 3. The participation of representatives of COMESA or WIPO in the meetings of the othe party shall be financed by their respective organizations.

ARTICLE3

ExchangeofInformationandDocuments

The Parties shall exchange relevant information and documents, free of charge, subject to any restrictions and conditions that either party may consider necessary in order to preserve the confidentiality of certain such information and documents.

ARTICLE4

FinancialImplications

1. Notwithstandinganyotherprovision of this Agreement, nothing in this Agreement shall betaken ascreating any financial obligation for either Partyprior to such obligation being mutually and expressly agreed in writing.

- 2. AnyexpenditurearisingfromtheimplementationofthisAgreementthatisroutineorof negligibleamountshallbebornebythePartyconcer ned.
- 3. WherecooperationproposedbyoneofthePartiestotheotherunderthisAgreementhas greaterfinancialimplicationsthantheexpenditurereferredtoabove,WIPOandCOMESA shallconsulteachotherwithaviewtodeterminingthemeansofmobilizi ngthenecessary funds,themostequitablewayofdefrayingtheexpenditureand,wherethenecessaryfunds cannotbereadilyfound,shalldecideonthemostsuitablemeansofprocuringthem.

ARTICLE5

Implementation

 $The Director General of WIPO and the \\ Executive Secretary of COMESA shall take the \\ necessary action to ensure the proper implementation of this Agreement.$

ARTICLE6

Amendment

This Agreement may be amended by mutual consent evidence din writing.

ARTICLE7

Termination

- 1. AnyPartymayt erminatethisAgreementbygivingnoticeofitsintentiontotheother Party.
- 2. Anytermination of this Agreement shall come into effect on the expiry of a period of two months following the date of the above notice, except where the two organizations agon another date. Termination shall innow a yaffect obligations as sumed inconnection with projects already initiated under this Agreement.
