#### I. BACKGROUND

- 1. The Program and Budget for the 1998 1999 biennium, <sup>1</sup> approved by the Thirty second Series of Meetings of the Assemblies of Member States of WIPO in 19 97, provided for the establishment of the Advisory Committee on Protection of Industrial Property Rights in Global Electronic Commerce (ACP/IP, Sub program 09.3) and the Advisory Committee on Management of Copyright and Related Rights in Global Information Networks (ACMC, Sub-program 10.5).
- 2. IntheProgramandBudgetforthe2000 -2001biennium,theACP/IPwasrenamed AdvisoryCommitteeonEnforcementofIndustrialPropertyRights(ACE/IP)andprovision wasmadetoincludeenforcementissues inthemandateoftheACMC,whichbecamethe AdvisoryCommitteeonManagementandEnforcementofCopyrightandRelatedRightsin GlobalInformationNetworks(ACMEC).AttheFirstSessionoftheACE/IP,heldinGeneva onOctober19and20,2000,theCommit teeadoptedaSummarybytheChair, <sup>2</sup>which recommendedthatitmeetjointlywiththeACMEC,oncein2001,todiscusstheenforcement ofallintellectualpropertyrights.

- 3. The Joint Meeting of the ACE/IP (Second Session) and of the ACMEC (Third Session) took place in Geneva from December 18 to 20,2001. The Joint Meeting identified and considered an umber of issues to be addressed by the Committees and decided to recommend to the WIPO Assemblies that a Committee or Committees be established to continue discussing is sues related to the enforcement of intellectual property rights.
- 4. TheProgramandBudgetforthe2002 -2003biennium, <sup>5</sup>underSub -program10.4 (IntellectualPropertyEnforcementIssuesandStrategies)asapprovedbytheA ssembliesof MemberStatesofWIPOinSeptember2001,recalledtheapproachinitiatedintheprevious biennium.However,abudgetaryallocationisprovidedunderthisSub- programtoundertake certainactivitiesforthepurposeofexecutingtheresponsibil itiesoftheAdvisoryCommittee onEnforcementofIndustrialPropertyRightsinthebroadercontextofallintellectualproperty rights.

#### A. Structure

- 5. FollowingthediscussionsandrecommendationsofMemberStatesandobservers participatingintheJointMeetingoftheACE/IPandACMECinDecember2001,and subsequentconsultationswithMemberStates,theMemberStatesmightwishtoconsiderthe followingoption swithregardtothestructureoftheAdvisoryCommittee(s)onEnforcement:
- $(a) \quad to establish a single Committee covering both industrial property rights and copy right and related rights;\\$
- (b) toestablishtwoseparateCommittees,oneforindustrialproper tyrightsandone forcopyrightandrelatedrights,whichwouldmeetconcurrentlywithapossiblejointsession attheend:or
  - (c) toestablishtwoseparateCommittees.
- 6. Inviewofthecross -cuttingnatureofenforcementissues,commontoal lintellectual propertyrights,asingleCommitteewouldseemthemostappropriate.However,certain enforcementissuesmightariseinthefuturewhichwouldjustifyamorein -depthdiscussion byexpertsinspecializedareasofintellectualpropertyright s.Toachievethis,itissuggested

#### B. Objective

7. TheCommittee(s)wouldco nstituteaforuminwhichdiscussionsonenforcementissues couldtakeplaceamongMemberStates.Inparticular,theCommittee(s)wouldcontinueand furtherdeveloptheworkcarriedoutbythepreviousAdvisoryCommittees,aswellasthe ConsultationMeet ingscheduledtotakeplaceinSeptember2002,withspecialfocuson: coordinatingwithcertainorganizationsandtheprivatesectortocombatcounterfeitingand piracyactivities;publiceducation;assistance;coordinationtoundertakenationaland regionaltrainingprogramsforallrelevantstakeholdersandexchangeofinformationon enforcementissuesthroughtheestablishmentofanElectronicForum.

#### C. <u>Organizationalandproceduralarrangements</u>

- 8. RulesofProcedure. Atitsfirstsessio n,theACE/IPadoptedthesamerulesof procedureadoptedforWIPObodies,namelythe"WIPOGeneralRulesofProcedure" (PublicationNo.399(FE)Rev.3).Inaddition,theACE/IPexercisedtheoption 8toadopttwo specialrulesofprocedurewhichwere:f irstly,thatmembershipintheACE/IPbeextendedto MemberStatesoftheParisUnionthatwerenotMemberStatesofWIPO,andthatobserver statusbeextendedtoMemberStatesoftheUnitedNationsthatwerenotMemberStatesof WIPOortheParisUnionan d,secondly,thattheChairandthetwoVice -Chairsshouldservea termofoneyearandwouldimmediatelybeeligibleforre -electiontotheofficesthattheyhad heldattheexpirationofthatterm.
- 9. The Joint Meeting of the ACE/IP and ACMEC noted that Rule 42 of the WIPO General Rules of Procedure provides for the possibility of joint meetings "when two or more bodies of the Organization or of the Union smust examine questions of common interest to them." In addition, and for the purpose of consistency, it decided to adopt the same rules of procedure, which we read opted at the First Session of the ACE/IP and to apply them mutatismutand is to the ACMEC.
- 10. Itisproposed, therefore, that for the purpose of consistency, the aboveru les of procedure beadopted *mutatismutandis* for the future Committee (s) on Enforcement.
- 11. *Membershipandobservers*. The Joint Meeting of the ACE/IP and ACMEC adopted the sameworking arrangements with regard to membership and observers, as were adopted by the first meeting of the ACE/IP and invited all Member States of WIPO and/or the Paris Union as members of the ACE/IP, and as Observers, Member States of the United Nations that are not members of WIPO or the Paris Union, and certain intergovernmental organizations and non-governmental organizations accredited with observer status with WIPO. Pursuant to Rules 7 and 8 of the General Rules of Procedure, and in the interest of

consistency, all Member States of WIPO and/or the Berne Union were invited as members of the ACMEC, and as Observers, Member States of the United Nations that are not members of WIPO or the Berne Union and certain intergovernmental organizations and non -governmental organizations accredited with observer status with WIPO. In addition, a number of non-governmental organizations were invited as adhoc observers.

- 12. Inviewoftheabove, it is proposed that the status of members and observers of the future Committee (s) be established according to the above -mentioned Rules. In order to most effectively represent their position, the Member States of WIPO may wish to consider including in their respective delegations other concerned agencies responsible for the enforcement of industrial property rights and copyright and related rights 12 and, if practicable, to consider including those agencies in the delegation. The future Committee (s) might the reby facilitate communication and networking among the relevant stakeholders at the national and international levels.
- 13. Workinggroups .Asindicatedinparagraph6above,itisproposedthatthe Committee(s)may,undertheProgramandBudget,setupWorkingGroupstoassistin its/theirdeliberations.ItiscontemplatedthattheWorkingGroupscouldbeconvened betweensessionsoftheCommittee(s),todiscussspecificissuesofparticulartechnical complexityordifficultythatrelatetotheprojectsthatareincludedintheworkofthe Committee(s).
- 14. Fundingforparticipationofgovernmentofficials . Itisfurthermoreproposed, as in previous meetings of the ACE/IP and ACMEC, that funding be available to facilitate the participation of representatives of developing countries and of certain countries in Europeand Asia.
  - 15. TheWIPOGeneralA ssemblyisinvited to:
  - (i) considerandtakeadecisiononthe optionsproposedinparagraph5, above;
  - (ii) approve the establishment of the Advisory Committee (s) on Enforcement for the purpose sindicated in paragraph 7 and with the proposed membership and the organizational and procedural proposals contained in paragraphs 8 to 14.
