






Subsequent designations (SD)







- Interim Status Rule 18bis








Average Refusal Rate



- Refusal rates vary between Contracting Parties from 0 to 91.02%
- The average provisional refusal rate in 2012 was 23.70 %

Other services – telephone calls

- From January to September 1
 - Customer service unit 18,556 calls
 - Madrid team 1 2,925 calls
 - Madrid team 2 1,588 calls
 - Madrid team 3 1,262 calls
 - Client Records Unit 482 calls

■ Total 23,240 calls (2,905 per week)




Filing trends II

- Limitations
- In 2013
 - 9.84% of the designations in international applications included a request for limitation
 - 18.19% of subsequent designations included a request for limitation




Filing trends IV

- Length of the list of goods and services in an international application in 2013:
 - The average number of words per international application is 227
 - Longest list: approx. 194,000 words



Filing trends V – average number of words per international application






New services I

 - Subsequent designations: status by designated Contracting Party





Client Records Unit – New services

- Detailed certified extract from the International Register: Analysis of the status of an international registration
- Simple certified extract: Certified copies of all entries published in the WIPO Gazette
- New special services:
 - Certified copy of a certificate of international registration and of a certificate of its renewal
 - Expedited establishment of a certified extract
 - Legalization of a certified extract
- Requests must be sent to the following address:

Other new services

IRREGULARITIES




Types of irregularities

- Classification of goods and/or services Office of origin
 - Goods and services are not in the appropriate classes or not classified (Rule 12)
- Indication of goods and/or services Office of origin
 - Too vague for the purposes of classification or incomprehensible or linguistically incorrect (Rule 13)
- Miscellaneous Office of origin, applicant or both
 - Signature of the Office of origin, entitlement of the applicant, basic registration/application, priority claim, MM18 Form (Rule 11(4))
 - Fees (Rule 11(3))






Breakdown of Irregularity Letters in the Madrid system

Total Number of Irregularity Letters 17,738




Irregularities – trends (2007 -2012)
