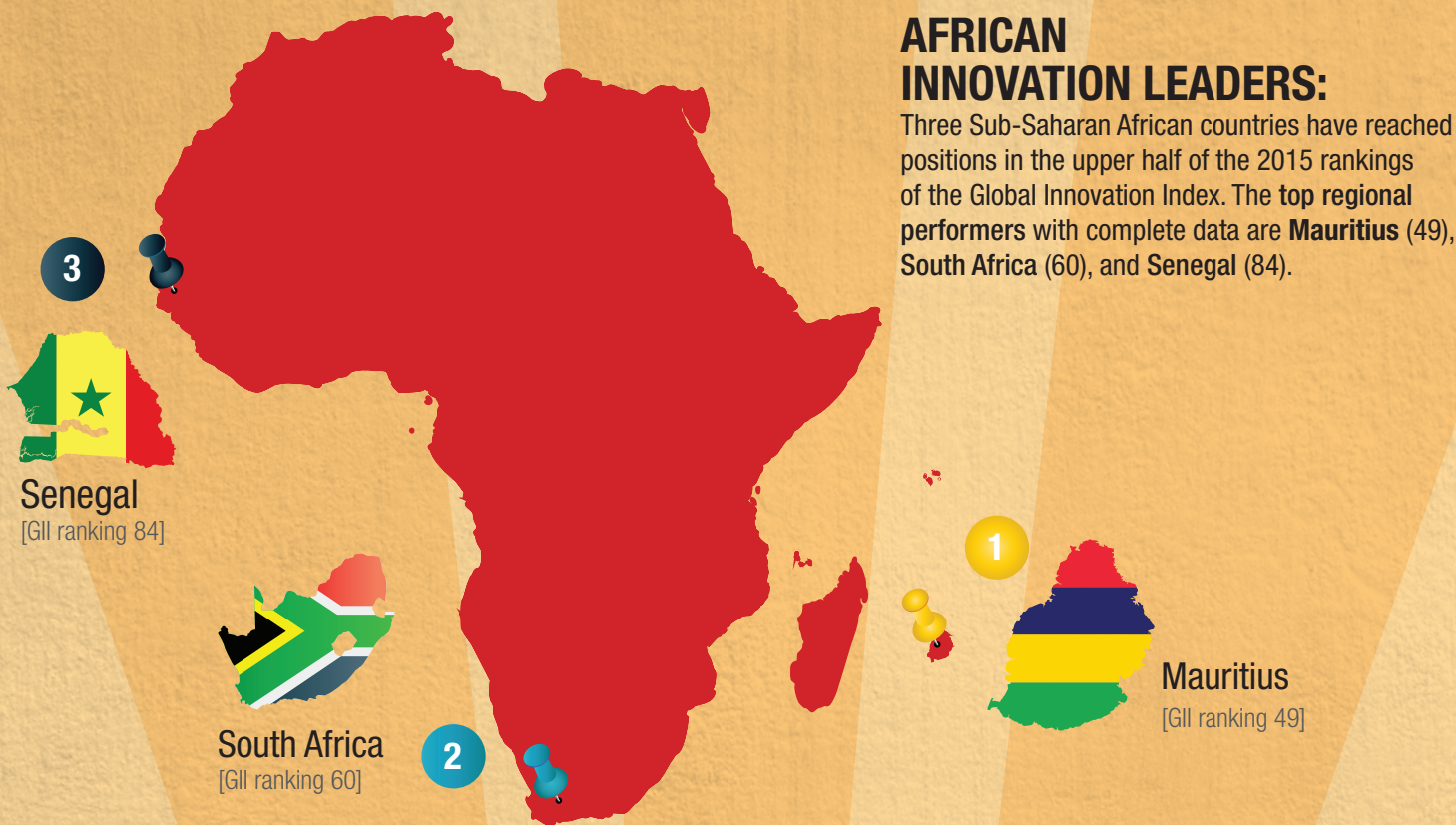


INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY FOR AN EMERGING AFRICA:
