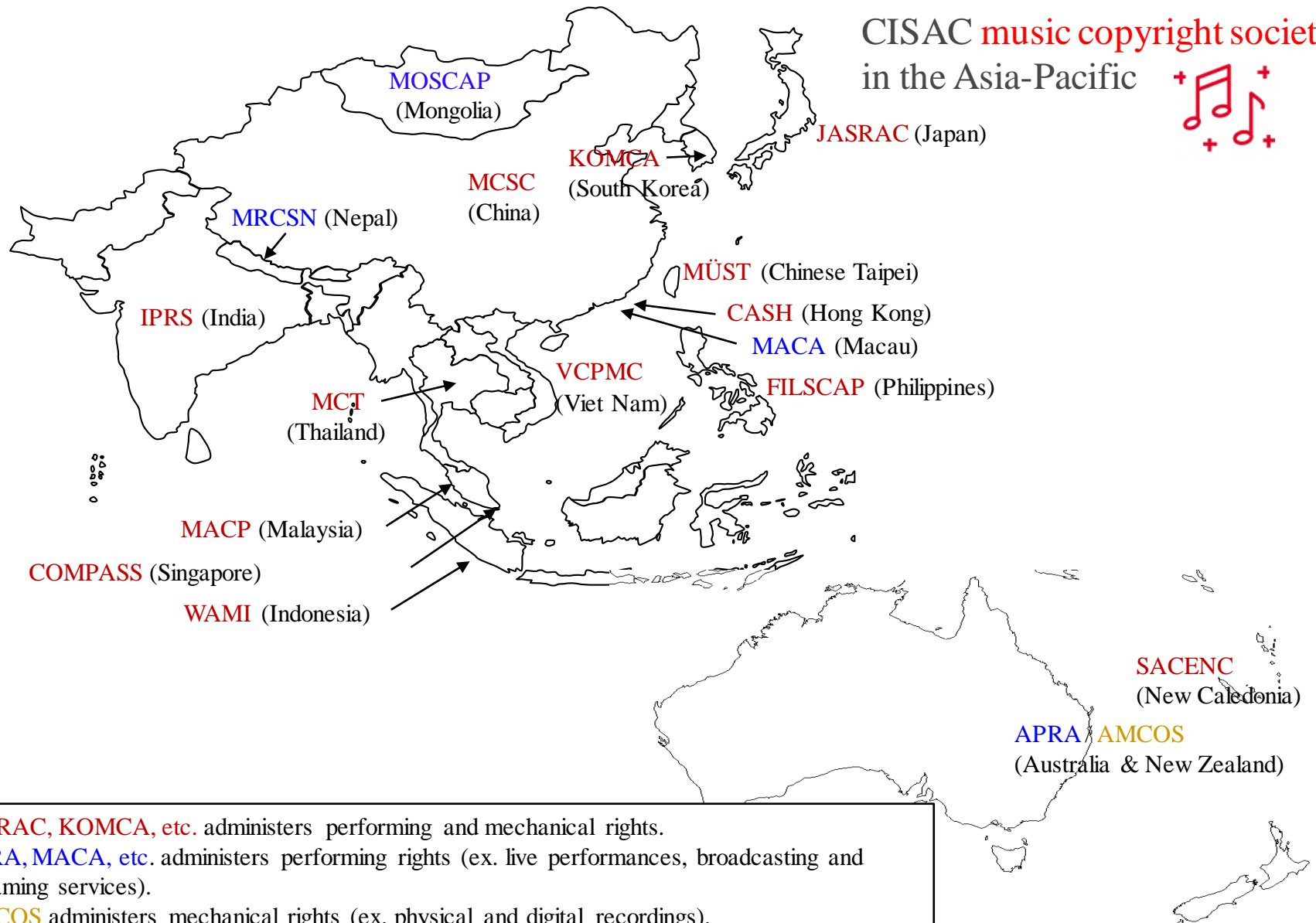

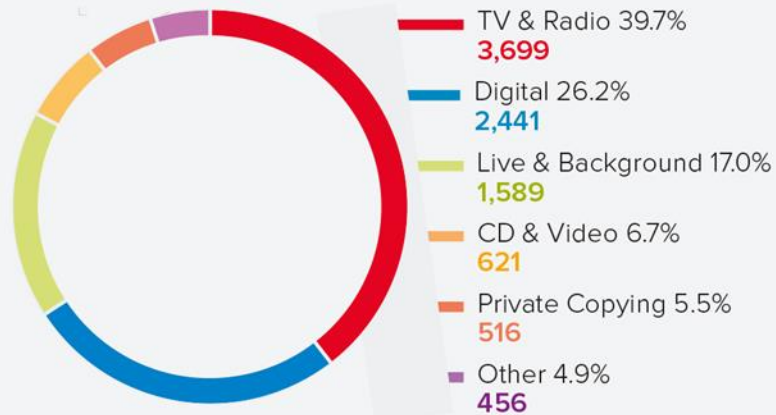
CISAC music copyright societies in the Asia-Pacific

YTDX 1st-24th Results in JASRAC's Distributions

YTDX Project: AP societies share their matched work codes/ISWC with YT Asset IDs for 25 songs per month in Excel format.

FILSCAP, KOMCA, MÜST, WAMI, CASH, MACP, MCT, MACA, APRA, VCPMC, IPRS and ASCAP have shared their matched data so far.

GDSDX System

Background

- The Asia-Pacific region is a rapidly growing market in terms of societies' royalty collections. The share of digital royalties has been rising in recent years and the region expects to see further acceleration of the use of digital music services triggered by the COVID-19 pandemic
- An initiative for the development of a matched data sharing platform, based on the cooperation of societies in the Asia-Pacific region, is the key to ensuring efficient and effective administration of future royalty collections
- A solution and workflow enabling easy and efficient data exchange processes with increased speed and frequency was called for, so that each society receives full and accurate payment for all their repertoire used on digital services outside of their home territory

Schedule for System Development, Testing, Training and Integration Assistance

Project member societies FILSCAP, JASRAC, KOMCA, MÜST and WAMI discussed and defined the system requirements for GDSDX in 2021 and selected the system vendor in 2022.

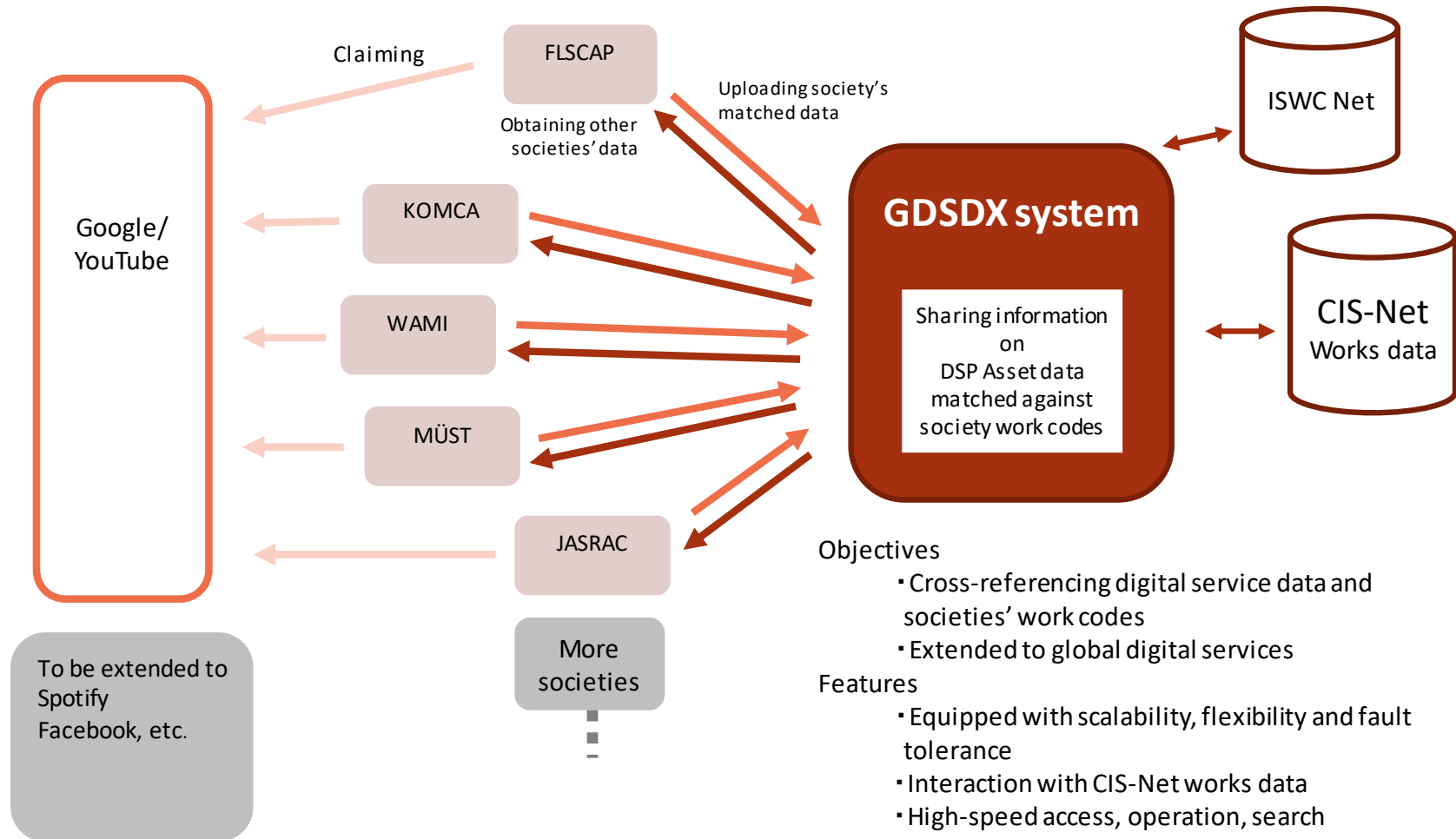

Data Flow



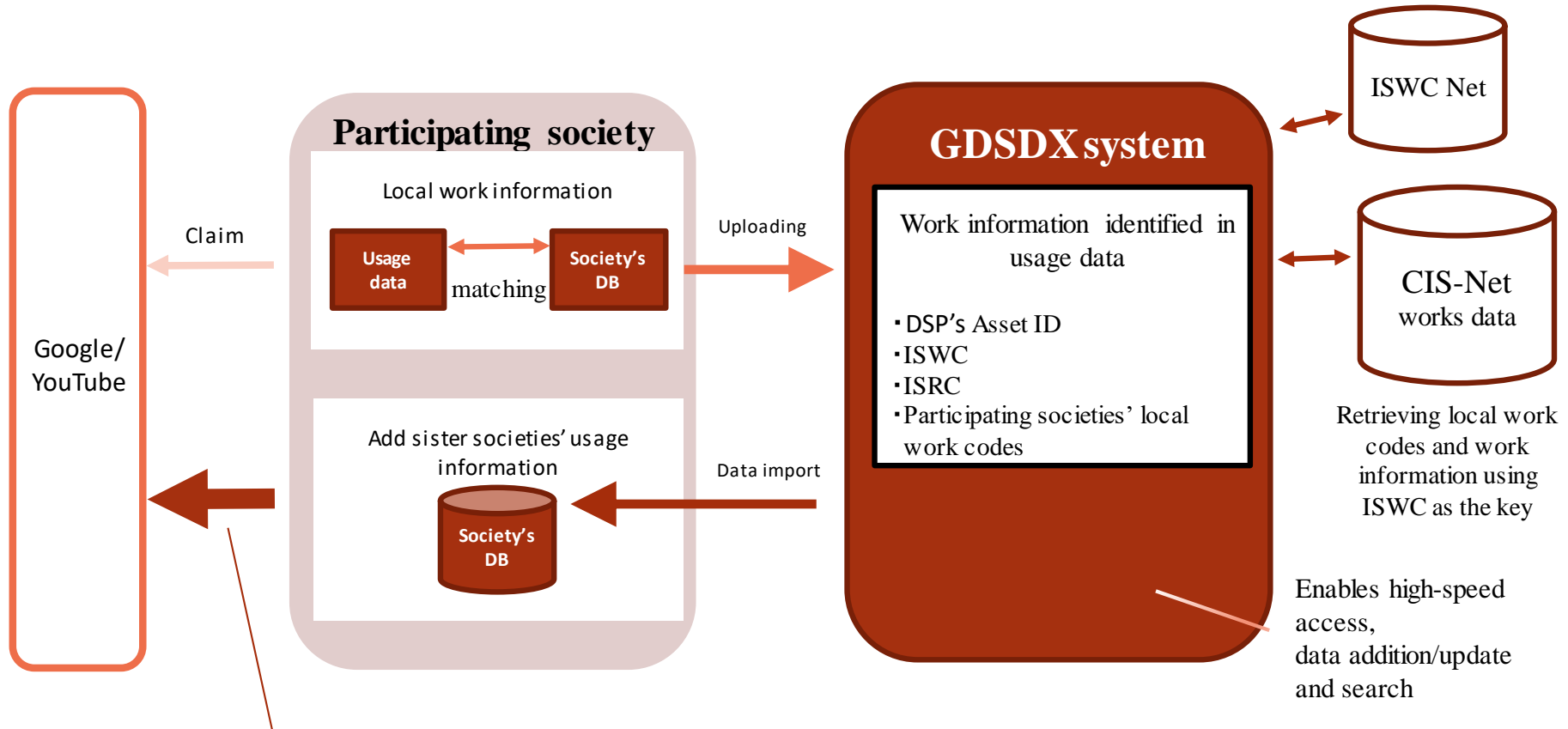
Objectives

- Cross-referencing digital service data and societies' work codes
- Extended to global digital services

Features

- Equipped with scalability, flexibility and fault tolerance
- Interaction with CIS-Net works data
- High-speed access, operation, search
- Compatible with multi-byte characters

Architecture



- System will facilitate and increase society's royalty claims on behalf of sister societies.
- In case of no claim process required, a society can distribute more accurately and increase its repertoire share.

Objectives

By sharing information on DSPs' identifiers matched with society work codes:

- Society can effectively claim royalties in its territory for sister societies' repertoire
- Society can effectively receive royalties for its own repertoire collected by sister societies in their respective territories
- GDSDX, developed in the Asia-Pacific, aims to share matched data with societies beyond the region and to be a cross-reference tool among societies worldwide

The GDSDX system envisages:

- Legitimate remuneration to right holders around the world
- Demonstration of effective collective management network
- Support for diversity of music culture
