He has held a range of roles in the Foreign and Commonwealth Office, Parliament, and Home Office, including Bill Manager for the Investigatory Powers Act 2016 and Head of Data Policy at the Office for Security and Counter-Terrorism.

Chris was the UK's lead negotiator of the 2019 Data Access Agreement between the UK and US. Before joining the UK Civil Service in 2012, Chris had a career in IT as a systems engineer, project manager, and technical director.
