Established in 1983

Collective Management Organisation in accordance with The Collective Management of Copyright (EU Directive) Regulations 2016

Four members: Publishers' Licensing Services (PLS), Authors Licensing and Collecting Society (ALCS), Design and Artists Copyright Society (DACS) and PICSEL

Offer licenses to education, business and public sectors

Collected £89m in 2021 and distributed £78m to rightsholders



Licensing and Legislation



An end to end access model for education institutes

UK Copyright Designs and Patents Act (CDPA), 1988 – amended in 2014

Copying and Use of Extracts of Works by Educational Establishments (s 36)

Permits copying by or on behalf of an education establishment if the copy:

is made only for the purpose of instruction

is for a non-commercial purpose

identifies title and acknowledges the author

is no more than 5% of a work in a 12 month period

But not permitted if a licence is available authorising the acts in question (licence override)

CLA Licence

If a work is not covered by a licence then it may be copied under the exception





Additional Relevant Exceptions:

Research and Private Study (s 29)

Act permits "fair dealing" for non-commercial purpose, and for the purpose of **private study**

Criticism, review, quotation and news reporting (s30)

Fair dealing, sufficient acknowledgement (unless impossible), extent is no more than is required

Illustration For Instruction (s 32)

A fair dealing exception for acts of copying done for the **sole purpose of illustration for instruction**.

Non-commercial purpose, by the person giving or receiving instruction

Education Licensing





We offer blanket licences covering print and digital content



Photocopy, scan, store and make available digital copies for students on a Virtual Learning Environment / Learning Management System (secure network)

Typically allow 5% or 10% of a work to be copied, or 1 chapter / article



Schools: multi-year deal with Department for Education in England until 2026, worth £17m per year to rightsholders



Universities: multi-year national deal negotiated with central body (UUK), until 2024, worth £15m per year to rightsholders




