International Instruments

- UNDRIP Art 31
- 1. Indigenous peoples have the right to maintain, control, protect and develop their cultural heritage, traditional knowledge and traditional cultural expressions, as well as the manifestations of their sciences, technologies and cultures, including human and genetic resources, seeds, medicines, knowledge of the properties of fauna and flora, oral traditions, literatures, designs, sports and traditional games and visual and performing arts. They also have the right to maintain, control, protect and develop their intellectual property over such cultural raditional knowledge, and traditional cultural
 - 2. In conjunction with indigenous peoples, States shall take effective measures to recognize and protect the exercise of these rights.

International Instruments

- Art 18 participation
- Art 3 self determination
- Collectively provides compelling grounds for an Indigenous right to TCEs and that States are to provide measures to protect these rights.
