I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. AtthefirstsessionoftheIn tergovernmentalCommitteeonIntellectualPropertyand GeneticResources,TraditionalKnowledgeandFolklore(the"Committee"),heldinGeneva fromApril30toMay3,2001,theCommitteeexpressedsupportforTaskA.1,thatis,the developmentof"guideco ntractualpractices,guidelines,andmodelintellectualproperty clausesforcontractualagreementsonaccesstogeneticresourcesandbenefit -sharing,taking intoaccountthespecificnatureandneedsofdifferentstakeholders,differentgenetic resources,anddifferenttransferswithindifferentsectorsofgeneticresourcepolicy."
- 2. AtthesecondsessionoftheCommittee,heldinGenevafromDecember10to14,2001, theCommitteeconsideredadocumententitled"OperationalPrinciplesforIntellectual PropertyClausesofContractualAgreementsConcerningAccesstoGeneticResourcesand Benefit-Sharing"(WIPO/GRTKF/IC/2/3).
- 3. Thisdocumentprovided information on existing intellectual property clauses and contractual practices for access and benefit -sharing, and offered options relating to the development of non-binding guide contractual practices, guide lines and model in tellectual property clauses for consideration by the Committee. The information contained in this document was largely based upon existing on tractual agreements which had been analyzed or referred to in previous World Intellectual Property Organization ("WIPO") documents. It did not a imto present a representative sample of relevant agreements and practices.
- 4. Inordertoobtainarepresent ativesampleofrelevantagreementsandpractices,itwas thereforeproposedthattheInternationalBureauofWIPOundertakeasystematicsurveyof actualcontractualagreements,includingaquestionnairetobesenttoCommitteemembers andotherstakehold ers,asappropriate.Furthermore,contributorswouldbeinvitedtoprovide experiences,examplesandcasestudiesofcontractualpracticesandagreementsfora compilationofexistingintellectualpropertyclausesandagreements.Thiscompilationcould serveasabasisforthesystematicandbalanceddevelopmentofguidecontractualpractices, guidelinesandmodelintellectualpropertyclauseswhichwouldreflecttheoperational principlesagreedandidentifiedbyCommitteemembers.
- 5. Inaddition,theDel egationofAustraliapresentedtheCommitteewithadocument entitled"ProposalfortheCompilationofContractualTermsforAccesstoGeneticResources andBenefit -Sharing,"(WIPO/GRTKF/IC/2/12).Thisdocumentproposeda"Summary ChecklistofKeyContrac tualIntellectualPropertyTermsonAccesstoGeneticResourcesand BenefitSharing"thatwouldprovideasearchableformatforanelectronicdatabase,which wouldbepublishedontheWIPOwebsiteandhyper -linkedtothewebsiteoftheClearing HouseMec hanism("CHM")ofthe1992ConventiononBiologicalDiversity("CBD").
- 6. The Committee expressed support for these proposals. It decided that the Secretariat of WIPO should under take a systematic survey of a ctual contractual agreements, including a question naire to be sent to Committee members and others takeholders, as appropriate. Results of the question naire would be compiled into an electronic database and could serve as

are source on guide contractual practices, guidelines and model intellectual proper tyclauses for contracts concerning access to genetic resources and benefit -sharing.

- 7. The Committee agreed that the Secretaria tof WIPO should first prepare the structure under which the proposed database could be developed and that this should be submitted to the Committee for comment.
- 8. Accordingly,theSecretariatofWIPOdevelopedthestructureofasearchable,electronic database.TheproposedstructurewassenttotheCommitteeforcommentinadocument entitled,"CallforCommentsonStructureofP roposedDatabaseofContractualPracticesand ClausesRelatingtoIntellectualProperty,AccesstoGeneticResourcesandBenefit -Sharing" (WIPO/GRTKF/IC/3/3).
- 9. Commentsreceived by the Secretaria tof WIPO have been reflected in the revised structure for a database of contractual practices and clauses relating to intellectual property, access to genetic resources and benefit sharing, contained in Annex Itothis document.
- 10. Furthermore, aspartof the systematic survey of actual contractual agreements reque by the Committee, the Secretaria tof WIPO has prepared a question naire on contractual practices and clauses relating to intellectual property, access to genetic resources and benefit-sharing. The question naire is contained in Annex II to this documen t.
- 11. SubjecttoapprovalbytheCommittee,thisquestionnairewillbedisseminatedto CommitteeMembersandawiderangeofstakeholderswithpracticalexperienceof contractualpracticesandagreementsrelatingtointellectualproperty,accesstogenetic resourcesandbenefit -sharing.Resultsofthequestionnairewillbecompiledandpublishedin theproposeddatabaseandcouldserveasaresourceonguidecontractualpractices,guidelines andmodelintellectualpropertyclausesforcontractsconcerninga ccesstogeneticresources andbenefitsharing.

I INTRODUCTION

- 1. The purpose of this database is to provide a concise and user friendly so urce of information to all those parties involved indrafting and negotiating contractual agreements on access to genetic resources and benefit sharing, with particular emphasis on the intellectual property as pects of such contracts.
- 2. Committeemembersof theIntergovernmentalCommitteeonIntellectualPropertyand GeneticResources,TraditionalKnowledgeandFolklore,togetherwithawiderangeof stakeholderswithpracticalexperienceincontractsforaccesstogeneticresourcesandbenefit sharing,wilbeaskedtocompleteaquestionnaireofcontractualpracticesandclausesrelating tointellectualproperty,accesstogeneticresourcesandbenefit -sharing.
- 3. Thereplies received to the question naire will be compiled and published in this electronic database and could serve as a resource on guide contractual practices, guidelines and model intellectual property clauses for contracts concerning access to genetic resources and benefit sharing.

II EXPLANATIONOFTHESTRUCTUREANDCONTENTOFTHEDATABASE

4. Thedatabasewillconsistofthefollowing 'pages':

4.1 <u>PageOne:TitlePage</u>

This will give a brief explanation of the purpose of the database, of how the information compiled in the database was obtained and will indicate the Terms of Use which will he database. It will provide a link to the 'Search' page.

4.2 PageTwo:SearchPage ⁴

The Search Page will consist of two distinct types of search mechanisms:

(a) TextSearch.Thiswillenableend -userstosearchthedatabasebytypingin a specificwordorseriesofwords:forinstance, 'Patent,' 'Confidentiality,' 'Plant Breeders' Rights, 'etc.

AnyuseofthedatabaseandtheinformationcontainedinitwillbesubjecttoTermsofUse whichwillcover, *interalia*:(a)Copyright:Thedatabasemayincludeliteraryworks(suchas contracts,contractclausesorrelated information)whichareprotectedbycopyrightandarethe propertyofthirdparties;(b)IndustrialPropertyRights:Products,processesortechnologies describedbytheinformationcontainedinthedatabasemaybethesubjectofindustrialproperty rights,whichwillbereserved;(c)Theinformationcontainedinthedatabasewillbeprovided "asis"withoutanywarranties.NeitherWIPO,itsMemberStates,ortheprovidersof informationincludedinthedatabaseshallhaveanyliabilityinconnectionwi thanyusethatmay subsequentlybemadeofthedatacontainedinthedatabase.Byaccessingandusingthe database,anend -userwillindicateacceptanceoftheTermsofUse.

Alternatively, end -users may use a more precise keywords ear choption:

- (b) KeywordSearch.Thiswillconsistoffourspecificsearcheswithd ropdownlists thatcanbehighlightedbyend -users.End -usersmaydirecttheirsearchbyselectingany combinationofthesefouroptions.Thefouroptionswillbeasfollows:
 - (i) *Country(ies)*. This will enable end -users to highlight a particular country or countries and to search for all those contracts between parties in those countries, or contracts that relate to genetic material and associated traditional knowledge originating from those countries.
 - (ii) *ContractParties*. This will enable end -users to search for contracts between particular combinations of parties. The proposed keywords earches are as follows:
 - All: This will enable contracts between all types of parties to be searched.
 - Government:e.g.,GovernmentMinistries,GovernmentAgencie s (National,RegionalorLocal),etc.
 - CommerceorIndustry:e.g.,Pharmaceutical,FoodandAgriculture, Horticulture,Cosmetics,etc.
 - ResearchInstitutions:e.g.,Universities,GeneBanks,BotanicGardens, MicrobialCollections,etc.
 - Traditional Knowl edge Holders: e.g., Associations of Healers, Indigenous Peoples or Local Communities, Peoples' Organizations, Traditional Farming Communities, etc.
 - Other:e.g., Privatelandowner(s), Conservation Group(s) etc.
 - (iii) *ContractPurpose.* Thiswillenable end -userstospecifywhetherthey wishtosearchforcontractsthatrelatetocommercialorindustrialapplicationof thegeneticresourcesandanyassociatedtraditionalknowledge;contractsthat permitresearchoreducationalusesonly;orcontractst hatrelatetoother applications. This division has been made since the intellectual property aspects of these types of contracts tend to be distinct. The proposed keywords earches are as follows:
 - All:Thiswillenablebothtypesofcontracttobesear ched.
 - CommercialorIndustrialApplication:Thissearchoptionwillleadto so-called'bio -prospecting'orothercommerciallyorientedagreements.The intellectualpropertyaspectoftheseagreementsmaybequitecomplex.
 - ResearchorEducationalAppli cationOnly:Thissearchoptionmaybe especiallyrelevanttotransfersbetweenresearchinstitutions, such as exsitu collections.

- OtherApplications:Thissearchoptionmayleadtocertainapplications whichdonotfallwithineitherofthetwoprevi ouscategories, such a applications for healthemergency reasons or national security reasons.
- (iv) *ContractScope*. This will enable end -users to specify a type of genetic resource. It will also enable end -users to search specifically for all those con tracts that address associated traditional knowledge. The proposed keywords earch are as follows:
- All:End -userscansearchcontractsthataddressalltypesofgenetic resource,togetherwithanyassociatedtraditionalknowledge.
- Plantgeneticresour ces:End -userscanfocusspecificallyoncontractsthat addressplantgeneticresourcesonly,suchasseedsorpollen.
- Animalgeneticresources:End -userscanfocusspecificallyoncontracts thataddressanimalgeneticresourcesonly, such assemenore mbryos.
- Microbialgeneticresources:End -userscanfocusspecificallyoncontracts thataddressmicrobialgeneticresourcesonly, such as fungior bacteria.
- Humangeneticresources:End -userscanfocusspecificiallyoncontracts thataddresshumang eneticresourcesonly,suchashumantissueorblood samples.
- Traditionalknowledge:End -userscanfocusspecificallyoncontractsthat addressassociatedtraditionalknowledge.
- Resourcesfromnon -biologicalnaturalsubstances:End -userscanfocus specificallyoncontractsthatalsoaddressnon -biologicalnaturalsubstances, inadditiontobiologicalresources.

4.3 PageThree:SearchResultsPage

End-userswillbepresentedwithalistofcontracttitlesthatcontainallorsomeof thetextorkeyw ordsthathavebeenenteredonthesearchpage. Forinstance:

- $"Research and Development Agreement between [X] Government Agency and [Y] \\ exsitute ollection".$
- "LicensingAgreementbetween[X]PharmaceuticalCompany,[Y]Universityand [Z]AssociationofHe alers".

End-users may click on a particular contract title within this list. They will then be taken directly to the Contract Check list page for that contract.

4.4 <u>PageFour:ContractChecklistPage</u> ⁵

The Contract Check list Page will contain a check list of the various contract of the information will be compiled from the question naire sent out to Committee members and a wider ange of applicable stakeholders: See Annex II.

Thischecklisthasbeenstructured with the intention of providing a concise, user-friendly webpage that establishes the basic context of the contract and set sout all intellectual property ("IP") related clauses. It is not intended to provide a comprehensive analysis of the contract inquestion.

Theproposedchecklistisasfollows:

- (b) Contractpurpose:i.e.,whetheritisacontractforCommercialorIndustrial use,forResearchorEducationonly,orforcertainOtherApplications(suchas healthemergencyreasonsornationalsecurityreasons).
- (c) Contractobjective.
- (d) Contractscope:i.e.,descriptionofgeneticresourcesandanyassociated traditionalknowledge.
- (e) Datecontractenteredintoforce.
- (f) Contractduration.
- (g) IPrelated clauses: i.e., patents; distinctive signs (geographical indiators and appellations of origin, trademark setc.); plant breeders' rights; tradesecrets; copyright and related rights; suigeneris protection of traditional knowledge; ongoing traditional and customary use: e.g., farmers' rights; IP related benefit-sharing, whether monetary (royalties, milestone payments, ethno botanical premiums, trust funds etc) or non monetary (IP related training, technology transfer, exchange of results etc); assignment; licensing; other (e.g., termination, exclusivity of supply etc.).
- (h) Confidentiality:MemberStatesexpressedparticular concernregarding the issue of confidentiality. Accordingly, any clause (s) addressing confidentiality will be set out here.
- (i) ApplicableLegislation:i.e.,anyrelevantnational,r egional,and/or internationallawstowhichthecontractissubject(e.g.,contractlaw,legislation implementingthe1992ConventiononBiologicalDiversityetc.).
- (j) DisputeResolution:i.e.,howthepartieshaveagreedtoresolveany disputesthatmi ghtariseunderthecontract(mediation,conciliation,arbitration,

- (k) GoverningLawoftheContract
- (l) Practical vice: i.e., advice arising out of contract drafting and negotiation together with any less on slear ned during the process.
- (m) Providerofinformation:i.e.,thecontactdetailsoftheindividualor institutionthatprovidedtheinformationtoWIPOand, wherepossible,will includean external link to their -mail address.
- (n) HYPER-LINKtoContract:Wherethecontracthasbeenprovided,there willbealinktothetextofthecontractitself.Thiswillenableend -userstocarry outamorecomprehensi veanalysisofthecontractinquestion,includingthe overallcontractualcontextoftheintellectualpropertyrelated clauses.

I INTRODUCTION

- 1. This questionnaire has been prepared by the Secretariat of the World Intellectual PropertyOrga nization("WIPO")togatherinformationrelatingtointellectualpropertyrelated clauses and contractual practices in individual contracts concerning access to genetic resourcesandbenefit -sharing.
- 2. It is intended to provide a practical intellectual pr operty contribution to all those processes and fora working on access to genetic resources and benefit -sharing that fully reflects the diversity of genetic resource policy and legislation, stakeholder needs and expectations, and transfers and uses of genet ic resources. WIPO therefore wishes to encourage as wide a range of stakeholders as is possible to answer this questionnaire: for instance, government agencies, indigenous peoples and local communities, commercial and industrial organizations, and source country and receiving country research institutions such as universities and exsitu collections.
- 3. Informationprovidedmaybe:
 - Incorporated into auser friendly database to be published on the WIPO website and hyper linked to the website of the Clear ing House Mechanism ("CHM") of the Convention on Biological Diversity ("CBD"); and/or
 - Usedasabasisforthedevelopmentofguidecontractualpractices, guidelines and modelintellectual property clauses for contracts concerning access to genetic resources and benefit -sharing.

II STRUCTUREOFTHEQUESTIONNAIRE

- 6. Contributors who do <u>not</u> provide a copy of the contract under consideration are encouraged to complete both Part II and Part III of the question naire.
- 7. Contributors may submit several different completed question naires, depending upon the number of different contracts between different parties with differing intellectual property related clauses that are under consideration.
