#### **I.OVERVIEW**

- 1. Thispaperconsiders the issue of the participation of local and indigenous communit in the work of the Intergovernmental Committee on Intellectual Property and Genetic Resources, Traditional Knowledge and Folklore ("the Committee"), and reports on the decision of the WIPO General Assembly at its Twenty Eighth Session, held from Septeber 23 to October 1,2002, concerning the facilitation of the involvement of representatives of such communities.
- 2. Thepaperalsoprovidesbackgroundtofacilitatetheconsultationsonthisissueas discussedbytheGeneralAssembly,includi ngpossiblemechanismstoenhanceparticipation ofrepresentativesofthesecommunitiesintheworkoftheCommittee.

#### **II.BACKGROUND**

- 3. TheCommitteehas, sinceits inception in 2000, addressed is sue sofparticular interest and concerntolo calandindigenous communities, to a degree unparalleled in other areas of WIPO'sactivities, and the Committee has accordingly stressed the need for enhanced input from these communities in its work. In fact, the need for input from these communities had beenstressedinWIPO's activities in the area of traditional knowledge and expressions of folkloreevenbeforetheCommitteewasestablished.Forinstance,theworkprogramon 'IntellectualPropertyRightsforNewBeneficiaries,'initiatedin1998,was intended"t o identifyandexploretheintellectualpropertyneedsandexpectationsofnewbeneficiaries, <sup>1</sup>Amajorcomponentof including the holders of indigenous knowledge and innovations." WIPO'sworkin1998 -99wastheconductofninefact -findingmiss ionsontheintellectual (IP) needs and expectations of holders of traditional knowledge (TK). Consultations were heldin 28 countries, with approximately 3000 people in some 60 cities, towns, villages or 100 cities, towns, with approximately 3000 people in some 60 cities, towns, villages or 100 cities, villagescommunities.
- 4. Theneedsandexpectati onsexpressedinthecourseoftheseconsultationswere documentedinareport <sup>2</sup>whichhasformedthebasisofmuchofWIPO'ssubsequentworkin thisarea.WIPOalsopromotedpolicydialogueinthisarea,forinstanceintheconveningofa RoundtableonIn tellectualPropertyandIndigenousPeoplesin1998.

#### Regionalworkshops

- 5. Basedontheextensiveconsultationswithindigenousandlocalcommunitiesinthefact findingmissions, akeyneedidentifiedwasfornationalandregionalworkshops to beheld for indigenous and local communities together with government of ficial sin order to facilitate wides pread understanding and discussion of the issues. This took on a specific character following the establishment of the Committee, when a series of workshops was undertaken to ensure that a diverse range of perspectives and concerns would be taken into account in the work of the Committee.
- 6. DuringconsiderationsofproposalsfortheCommitteeattheTwenty -SixthSession (September26 toOctober3,2000)oftheWIPOGeneralAssembly,theGroupofCountries ofLatinAmericaandtheCaribbean(GRULAC)hadnotedthat:

itisnecessarytoexamineandagreeonthebeginningsofasolutionthatwillsatisfynot onlyMemberStatesandthepubl icatlargebutalsotheindigenousandlocal communitiesthemselves. <sup>4</sup>

  - Sub-RegionalWorkshoponIntellectualProperty,GeneticResourcesand TraditionalKnowledge,Brisbane,Australia,June25to27,2001;
  - RegionalMeetingonIntellectualPropertyandtheProtectionofExpressionsof FolkloreandTraditional KnowledgefortheEnglish -speakingcountriesinAfrica,in Lusaka,Zambia,fromMay8to10,2002;

- 8. Afeatureofeachofthesemeetingsandassociatedconsultationshasbeentheactive participationofmanyrepresentativesofindigenousandlocalcommunities,includingas speakersandpresenters. Anillustrativelistoffurthermeetingsrel evantinthis regardis provided indocument WIPO/GRTKF/IC/4/4.

#### III.PARTICIPATIONINTHEINTERGOVERNMENTALCOMMITTEE

9. Followingitsestablishment(document WO/GA/26/6),theCommitteehasmetforthree sessions,inAprilandDecember2001,andJune2002.TheworkoftheCommitteehasbeen supplementedby anextensiveseriesofregionalandnationalworkshopsandconsultationson traditionalknowledgeandrelated issues,whichhaveentailedextensiveinvolvementof representativesoflocalandindigenouscommunities.

- 10. OnethemethathasrecurredinIGCdiscussionsateachsessionhasbeentheneedto encourageadiverserangeofstakeholderstotake partintheIGC'swork -especiallysince theworkactivities mandated to the IGC touch on a range of interest groups that have hither to notbeenactiveintheworkofWIPO.TheIGChasgranted adhoc observerstatustoawide rangeofnon -governmentalor ganizations(NGOs), at their request, including many with a focusonindigenousandlocalcommunities. Adhoc observerscanparticipateintheworkof the IGC and make interventions on the issue sunder discussion. To date 85 NGOs have either beengranted observerstatusorparticipated in the IGC; of these, 27 adhoc NGOobservers havenotactually attended the IGC. In addition, several national delegations have included individuals who are representatives of indigenous communities.
- 11. Inthe contextofongoingdiscussionsaboutpromotingparticipationofindigenousand localcommunities,theDelegationofBelgium(speakingonbehalfoftheEuropean CommunityanditsMemberStates)raisedaproposalatthesecondsessionoftheIGC concerningt hepossibilityof'financialassistanceinordertoensuretheparticipationof indigenousandlocalcommunitiesatthesessionsofthe[IGC].' <sup>5</sup>Ithadremarkedthata prerequisiteforactiveparticipationofindigenousandlocalcommunitieswastheavail ability offinancialassistance,whetherfromMemberStatesorageneralmechanismforfinancial assistance,possiblyusingWIPOfunds.ThisproposalwassupportedbyanumberofMember States,andtheIGCadoptedtherecommendationthat'theProgramand BudgetCommittee shouldfurtherconsiderthepossiblefinancingbyWIPOoftheparticipationofindigenousand localcommunities.' <sup>6</sup>
- 12. ThethirdsessionoftheIGC,inJune2002,sawfurtherdiscussionofthisproposaland therewasarelatedd iscussionoftheneedforenhancedcooperationwiththerecently establishedPermanentForumonIndigenousIssues(asubsidiarybodyofECOSOC, comprising16membersservingintheirpersonalcapacitiesasindependentexperts,the mandateofwhichincludes to"promotetheintegrationandcoordinationofactivitiesrelating toindigenousissueswithintheUNsystem."TheIGCChairconcludedthattheIGC encouragedclosecooperationwiththePermanentForum,andnotedthattheProgramand BudgetCommitteewo uldbetakinguptheissueoffinancingtheparticipationofindigenous andlocalcommunities.AtitsmeetinginSeptember2002,theProgramandBudget Committeereferredthemattertoregionalgroupcoordinatorsforfurtherconsideration.The matterwas subsequentlyconsideredbytheWIPOGeneralAssemblyatitsTwenty -Eighth Session,heldfromSeptember 23toOctober 1,2002,leadingtothedecisionthat:
- (i) the Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues should be invited to participate in the December 200 2 session of the Intergovernmental Committee on Intellectual Property and Genetic Resources, Traditional Knowledge and Folklore;
- (ii) MemberStatesshouldbeencouragedtoincluderepresentativesofindigenousand localcommunitiesontheirdelegationst otheIntergovernmentalCommittee;
- (iii) followingconsultationsincludingtheSecretariatandregionalgroups,the IntergovernmentalCommitteeshouldconsidersuitablefurthermechanisms,asappropriate,

for facilitating the involvement of representative so finding enous and local communities in its workforthe 2003 meetings and to be reflected in its report to the General Assembly in 2003.

#### IV.MECHANISMSFORFACILITATINGINVOLVEMENT

- 13. The possible mechanisms for facilitating the involvemen to frepresentatives of indigenous and local communities in the work of the Committee include:
- increased and more regular cooperation with the Permanent Forum, inview of its function of promoting 'the integration and coordination of activities relating to indigenous issues within the UN system';
- greaterparticipationofrepresentativesofindigenousandlocalcommunitiesonnational delegations;
- directfinancialsupportfortheparticipationofrepresentativesofindigenousandlocal communitiesintheCom mittee,eitheronnationaldelegationsorrepresentativesof accredited *adhoc* observers;
- specificbriefingsandconsultationsforNGOrepresentatives,particularlyrepresentatives ofindigenousandlocalcommunities,intheframeworkofCommitteemeetings;
- consultingwithinterestedrepresentativesofindigenousandlocalcommunitiesondraft documentsandothermaterialsbeingdevelopedfortheCommittee;and
- involvementofindigenousandlocalcommunitiesinregionalandnationalconsultations andwor kshopsaimedatdevelopingfocussedinputfortheCommittee,includingfunding orotherwisesupportingtheirinvolvementinthesemeetings.
- 14. Thislistdoesnot, of course, exhaust the possibilities, and the proposed consultations on this issue may develop further or amended ways of facilitating involvement. To the extent that these proposals are considered useful, it is worth noting that all but one of them (namely direct funding of participation in the IGC itself) have already been implemente dorare in the process of being implemented. For instance, the Permanent Forum has been invited to participate, Member Stateshave been encouraged to enhance their delegations in this way, a briefing session and consultation for indigenous and local communities in regional workshops continues (for instance, in the Nordic workshop planned for November 2002).
- $15. \quad If the consultations and the Committee's \quad considerations address the question of direct funding of relevant NGOs, then it may be necessary to consider$
- theneedtoamendthegeneralpolicyofusingWIPOfundstosupporttheparticipationof MemberStatesinitsformalmeetings
- thescaleofsupport thatmaybegiventosupportsuchparticipation,inparticularthe numberofparticipants,notingthatthismaybepartlydeterminedbythegeographicrange ofsupportedparticipants,andtheareasofinterestandexpertisethatarecovered;and
- themecha nismorcriteriausedtonominateorselectfundedparticipantsrelatedtothis questionisthecapacityinwhichtheyparticipate(onnationaldelegations,as representativesofadhocobservers,orasrepresentativesofintergovernmental organizationswhareobservers).
