LOVERVIEW

2. The Secretariat continues to provide a widerange of technical cooperation on this topic through workshops and meetings, expert and fact -finding missions, legislative drafting and advice, and education and training. This includes activities specifically focus sed on the legal protection of expressions of folklore (including thos edealing with the related area of traditional knowledge), and more general activities which address this is sue along with other areas of intellectual property.

- 3. Thisdocumentprovidesonlythoseactivitiesundertakenorproposedbetween December 2002 and June 2003. It is only an illustrative list and may not include every relevant activity undertaken by the Secretariat. It does however demonstrate the continuing strong interest in practical and policy is sues in relation to the protection of folklore and expressions of traditional culture, as a distinct set of needs and expectations, in the context of the increase dattention recently paid to broader traditional knowledge and related genetic resources is sues.
- 4. Duringthefourthses sionoftheCommitteeinDecember2002andattheinvitationof theChair,theSecretariatintroducedotherrelateddocuments,namely"Preliminary SystematicAnalysisofNationalExperienceswiththeLegalProtectionofExpressionsof Folklore"(documentW IPO/GRTKF/IC/4/3).Toprovideadditionalbackgroundinformation onthisagendaitemandtosupplementtheinformationprovidedintheabovedocument,an informalseriesofpresentationsofnationalandregionalexperiencewiththelegalprotection offolk lorewasorganizedinconjunctionwiththesessionoftheCommittee.Informationwas presentedbythedelegationsofNewZealand,Nigeria,Panama,Tunisia,theRussian FederationandtherepresentativeoftheSecretariatofthePacificCommunity.Thisma terial isavailableindocumentsWIPO/GRTKF/IC/4/INF/2to5.Additionaldocuments WIPO/GRTKF/STUDY/1andWIPO/GRTKF/STUDY/2,containedcasestudiesonthelegal protectionofexpressionsoffolkloreortraditionalculturalexpressions.
- 5. Many otheractivities on IPmore generally, such as symposiums, seminars, conferences and advisorymission sundertaken by the WIPOS ecretariatinc luded folklore and TK as a topic. These more general activities are not reported on in this document.
- 6. Technicalcooperationactivities are undertaken at the request of the Member States concerned. The WIPO Secretaria thas received a number of requests for specific forms of legal-technical cooperation, directly relevant to the approved task, including in the normal course of WIPO's program of cooperation for development.

II.REPORTONACTIVITIES

- 7. Theactivities are listed under the following general categories:
- (i) SpecificWorkshopsandMeetings(theseareworkshopsandmeetingsdealing specificallywithfolkloreorhavingfolkloreasoneofitsprincipalthemes);
 - (ii) ExpertandFact -findingMissions;
 - (iii) LegislativeDrafting,CommentsandInformation;
 - (iv) EducationandTraining.

8. WIPOcontinuestoreceiverequestsforworkshopsandmeetingsthattakeanintegral approachinprovidingtechnicalassistance,andundertakingconsultationsonthesubstantive issuesconsideredbytheCommittee.

- 9. Themainobjectivesofthework shopsareto:(i) provideMemberStates,Indigenous andlocalcommunities,relevantorganizationsandotherstakeholderswithaforumwherethey canconsiderandreflectonthetechnical,legalandpolicydimensionsoftheissuesthatarise inthecontext ofthemandateoftheIntergovernmentalCommitteeand,(ii) ensurethatStates, Indigenouspeoplesandlocalcommunities,andotherstakeholdershaveaclearideaofthe workandmandateoftheIGC,sothattheymaycontributetoitsdeliberationsinane ffective way.WIPOhasfinancedtheparticipationofGovernmentofficialsfromdevelopingcountries andnominatedrepresentativesofIndigenousandlocalcommunities.
- 10. SinceDecember2002, and up to the date of this document, the following workshops of this nature have been organized by the WIPOS ecretariat:
 - WIPONationalWorkshoponIntellectualPropertyforSMEswithSpecial ReferencetotheCraftSectorinGuatemala,GuatemalaCity,February20and21, 2003:

 - WIPONationalSeminaronIndigenousRightsandIntellectualPropertySystem, BuenosAires,February15to21,2003;
 - WIPO –OAPISub -RegionalMeetingonTraditionalKnowledge,Dakar, February24to27,2003;
 - WIPO/AEPPIInternationalSymposiumonIntellectualPropertyProtectioninthe 21stCentury:ChallengesandOpportunitiesforDevelopingCountries,Cairo,April 14and15,2003.
- 11. Awiderangeofadditionalregionalandsub -regionalconsultations,workshopsand otherforumsaddressingtheseissuesareinvariousstagesofplanningandimplementation. Thesemayincludediverseproposalsforactivitiestobeheldincountries ineachofthe regionalgroupsofWIPOMemberStates.Updateddetailswillbeprovidedinanaddendum tothisdocument.
- 12. Apartfromtheseworkshops, TCE has also been a primary or principal focus of other workshops, seminars, for ums and meeti ngsorganized or participated in by WIPO, such as:
 - UNESCOSecondSessionoftheIntergovernmentalMeetingofExpertsonthe Preliminary-DraftConventionfortheSafeguardingofIntangibleCulturalHeritage, Paris,February24toMarch1,2003.Thenext sessionwilltakeplaceinParis,from June2to14,2003;
 - PermanentForumonIndigenousIssues,NewYork,May12to23,2003.

13. AFact -findingmissiontoChinaontheLegalProtectionofNationalFolkloretook place betweenNovember28andDecember4,2002.Astrikingfeatureofthismissionwasthe extenttowhichminoritynationalitiesstillpracticetheirculturaltraditionsandcustomsin theireverydaylife.Thepromotionofculturalheritageoccupiesa prominentpositionwithin theProvince'seconomic,cultural,tourismandenvironmentalstrategies,underliningthat culturalheritageandtraditionalculturalexpressionsareeconomicaswellasculturalassets.

LegislativeDrafting,CommentsandInformat ion

14. WithinthecontextoftheSecretariat's normal and ongoing Development Cooperation functions, the WIPOS ecretariath as provided comments and information on the protection of expressions of folklore and traditional knowledge to many countries which have requested this aspart of their drafting of IP laws or review of existing laws. The Copyright Law Section, Cooperation for Development (Intellectual Property Law) Department of WIPO has provided, as requested by three Member States, commential sand information specifically on folklore in respect of their legislation. Requests for such assistance continue to be received by the Secretariat. They are also received from regional intergovernmental organizations.

EducationandTraining

15. ThetopicsoftraditionalknowledgeandTCEcontinuetobeincluded,attherequestof MemberStates,inmanytrainingworkshops,seminarsorbriefingsorganizedbyWIPO,both withinitsprogramofcooperationfordevelopment(includingtheWIPOWorldwi de Academy),andinitsoutreachprogramsdealingwithindustryandcivilsociety.The numerousrelevantactivitiesarenotlistedinthisdocument.
