
MONTHLY ANALYSIS OF PATENT APPLICATIONS RECEIVED FROM 2008 TO 2010

How IP Information has Increased the Innovative & Creative Capacity in Kenya

- Before 1995, there were no local patent applications and limited local Creativity & Innovation;
- In March 1995, an Education & Outreach Program was launched;
- Since 1996, there has been a dramatic increase in
 - The Number of National Patent Applications;
 - Reverse Engineered Products by SMEs;
 - All Universities in Kenya now have IP Centers Business Incubators & IP Policies;
 - IP has been included in the National Constitution;
 - The Kenya Government has already adopted an IP Policy;
 - Improved linkage between Universities, Research Institutions,
 Industry, Businesses & the National Patent Office;
 - Increased number of Local Patent Infringement cases;
 - The Public is now aware of the IP system and its benefits;
