

# What is Research4Life?

Research4Life (R4L) is a public-private partnership of the World Health Organization (HINARI), Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (AGORA), World Intellectual Property Organization (ARDI), UNEP (United Nations Environment Program), International Labor Organization (GOALI), Cornell and Yale Universities and the International Association of Scientific, Technical and Medical Publishers – STM. Working along with technology partners as Microsoft Corporation, Serial Solutions and others that provides developing countries with free or low cost access to academic and professional peer-reviewed content online.



# Research4Life Goal

R4L goal was formerly to help attain six of the United Nation's eight Millennium Development Goals by 2015, reducing the scientific knowledge gap between industrialized countries and the developing world

Now, the goal is to help attain the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals by 2020 and continue reducing the scientific knowledge gap between industrialized countries and the developing world.



# Eligibility for R4L programs

- Country eligibility is based on four factors:
  - 1) Total GNI (World Bank figures);
  - 2) GNI per capita (World Bank figures);
  - 3) United Nations Least Developed Country (LDCs) List;
  - 4) Human Development Index (HDI).
- If your country is in the Group A country, area, or territory, the access is free.
- If your country is in the Group B country, area, or territory, the access to the Research4Life programs costs US\$ 1500 per institution per calendar year.

- national universities
- research institutes
- professional schools (medicine, nursing, pharmacy, public health, dentistry)
- teaching hospitals
- government: ministries and agencies
- national medical libraries
- locally based non-governmental agencies

All permanent staff members, students and visiting faculty are entitled to access and can obtain the institutional User Name and Password.

By improving access to scholarly literature from diverse fields of science and technology, ARDI seeks to:

- · reinforce the capacity of developing countries to participate in the global knowledge economy; and
- · support researchers in developing countries in creating and developing new solutions to technical challenges faced on a local and global level.

Currently, over 100 publishers provide access to around 30,000 journals, books, and reference works for 120 developing countries and territories through ARDI.








This document is a step-by-step guide to register online for the Research4Life programmes: Hinari, AGORA, OARE, ARDI and GOALI











Following these simple guidelines will avoid problems in the registration process and ensure faster response to all registrations for the Research4Life programmes. Please review the following instructions in order to complete your registration:

#### Before registration:

- · Before filling the online form, please make sure that you have all the needed information. The more information you provide on the form, the faster we can process your registration.
- · If your institution is a UNIVERSITY or PROFESSIONAL SCHOOL, before filling the form, check the list of Registered Universities and Professional Schools. If your institution is already listed DO NOT REGISTER

#### Access to Research in the Developing World


Registration form is available in three languages: English, Spanish and French

If your institution is an academic, government or research institution in a lower income country, it may be eligible for access to the Research4Life Programmes ( check eligibility ).

Your institution might already be registered with one of the programmes. Before proceeding, please check the list of registered institutions ( registered universities and professional schools ) before proceeding.

Please note that (1) Only one registration per programme is required per institution, and (2) More than one contact is required to register an institution. (3) Individuals are not eligible to register, only institutions.

Once we review your registration, we will issue a common username and password for all staff at your institution. As Hinari, AGORA, OARE, ARDI and GOALI are in fact virtual libraries, we suggest that your institution's librarian be our main contact point. Should your institution not have a library, your director will be the main contact.

#### Authorized users

The Material owned by the Publisher and made available through the R4L Website or other authorized access points

#### Access

Authorized Users and Walk-in Users will have full and unlimited access to the online version of the Publisher's Material, subject to any limitations listed below concerning downloading, printing, course packs, document supply, document fees and remote access.

## Downloading

Authorized Users may download and save to a local digital memory limited numbers of articles or chapters from any one journal issue or book, not to exceed **15% of the issue or book**. It is not permitted to download complete journal issues or books

### Printing

Authorized Users and Walk-in Users may print single copies of articles and book chapters from the Material for their private use or study not to exceed **15% of the issue or book**. It is not permitted to print complete issues of books or journals.

#### Course Packs

Academic and teaching staff may make copies in print or digital form of the Publisher's Material for course packs, and recover where appropriate the cost of producing such course packs from the students. The Publisher's Material may also be placed in electronic reserves set up by the Institution for students to access in specified educational courses. Such electronic reserves must be deleted at the end of the semester in which the course concludes.



## Document supply

The Institution may supply printed or digital copies of individual journal articles, book chapters and other Material belonging to the Publisher to the Institution's employees, faculty members or another Authorized User as identified above. Such documents may not be supplied to any other individuals or organizations outside the Institution.

#### Document fees

The Institution may not supply R4L for fee except solely in the case of cost recovery fees for course pack or other teaching material compilations.



#### Remote access

- Access to the Publisher's Material may only be provided from computers or other digital installations owned by or under the direct control of the registered Institution or from personal computers owned personally by the employees, faculty or students of the Institution.
- Remote access from other installations is expressly prohibited and any violation of this condition will result in the termination of the agreement and the blocking of the password.
- In particular, Authorized Users may not access R4L Programs while travelling outside their own countries. No remote access will be given to Walk-in Users.

### Uploading

The Institution or its members, Authorized Users and Walk-in Users may not upload to or post (to a publicly available website or elsewhere) the username and the password and add in any way to the Publisher's Material without the express permission of the Publisher. This includes any notices, advertisements, comments or other information.



# Conclusion

- R4L is a public-private partnership that provides access to academic and scientific content online.
- Tens of thousands of journals and books are available to download and the content is available for free or at a very low cost.
- Hundreds of partners are committed to provide their content until 2020 and more than 8,000 institutions in over 100 countries have join R4L
- At the heart of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs): Education-Health-Food-Environment-Justice-Peace
- The prospects are to put in place a strategy to cope with constraints and ensure the sustainability of research in developing countries
