








Internet broadband expansion

AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH IN AFRICA

- The most up-to-date research knowledge found in expensive scholarly journals
- Subscriptions increase at an annual rate of 11-16% which is beyond the reach of many many African institutions
- Research investments of \$ millions in the past 3 decades
- Limited access to the world's published knowledge results in
 - Duplication of efforts
 - o Limits in innovation and diminished ROI
- Offline access to literature is still necessary for some institutions











FROM CLASSICAL REFERENCE LIBRARY TO DIGITAL







- Public-private partnership of the World Health Organization (WHO), the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), Cornell and Yale Universities and the International Association of Scientific, Technical and Medical Publishers (STM) in addition to over 200 publisher and technology partners.
- Collective name for four programmes: HINARI, AGORA, OARE and ARDI. These provide lower income countries with free or low cost access to academic and professional peer-reviewed content online.
- Goal: to reduce the scientific knowledge gap between higher income and lower income countries



Goals of Research4Life Programs

- To connect developing world researchers with the international scientific community
- To reduce the 'publishing gap' and improve the quality of locally produced articles and journals
- Ultimately improve health, food security and environment in relation to millennium development goals that were developed in 2000











Primary Target Audiences

- Eligible categories of institutions are Not-for-profit Entities and Development Agencies, E.G.:
 - National universities
 - Professional schools (medicine, nursing, pharmacy, public health, dentistry)
 - Research institutes
 - Teaching hospitals
 - Government: ministries and agencies
 - National medical libraries
 - Locally based non-governmental organizations (NGOs)









Who is eligible for Research4life Programs (01 2016)

- Countries, areas, or territories with a total GNI above us\$ 1 trillion are not eligible for research4life regardless of other factors
- 2. Core offer group A Free access all countries, areas, or territories fulfilling any of the below criteria:
 - A. Un least developed country list and/or
 - B. Human Development Index (HDI) is at or less than 0.50 and/or
 - C. Total Gross National Income (GNI) is at or less than US\$ 150 billion where:
 - HDI is at or less than 0.63 and/or
 - Gross national income per capita (GNIPC) is at or less than US\$ 1600









- 3. Core offer group B fee access:
 - A. Total GNI is at or less than US\$ 1 billion and/or
 - B. Total GNI is at or less than US\$ 20 billion where GNIPC is at or less than US\$10,000 and/or
 - C. Total GNI is at or less than US\$ 180 billion where:
 - HDI is at or less than 0.67 and/or
 - GNIPC is at or less than US\$ 5000









HINARI

(HINARI Access to Research Initiative)

- Online portal to access information on health and related social sciences
- Launched in Jan 2002
- Led by WHO and Yale University
- Currently, more than 5700 registered institutions
- 500 publishers offering up to 15,000 journals / 47,000 books / 100 other information resources / 500 publishers' content included in more than 30 different languages [January 2016]

Access to Global Online Research in Agriculture (AGORA) is a programme to provide free or low cost access to major scientific journals in agriculture and related biological, environmental and social sciences to public institutions in developing countries. Launched in October 2003, AGORA provides access to more than 3000 journals from the world's leading academic publishers.

Led by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, the goal of AGORA is to improve the quality and effectiveness of agricultural research, education and training in low-income countries, and in turn, to improve food security. Through AGORA, researchers, policy-makers, educators, students, technical workers and extension specialists have access to high-quality, relevant and timely agricultural information via the Internet. AGORA is one of the four programmes that make up Research4Life.

- Online portal to access environmental information
- Led by UNEP/Yale University
- More than 2800 registered institutions
- Up to Over 6,500 journals / 18,000 books / 60 other information resources / 130 publishers' content included [January 2016]



ARDI

(Access to Research for Development and Innovation)

- Online portal to access development and innovation research; ARDI was launched by the World Intellectual Property Organization in 2009 and joined R4L in 2011
- Launched in July 2009
- Supports researchers in developing countries in creating and developing new solutions to technical challenges faced on a local and global level
- More than 500 registered institutions. Up to 5,100 journals; 19,000 books; and 20 other information resources 30 publishers
- over 500 institutions registered

ARDI – Research for Innovation

The Access to Research for Development and Innovation (ARDI) program is coordinated by WIPO together with its partners in the publishing industry with the aim to increase the availability of scientific and technical information in developing countries.

By improving access to scholarly literature from diverse fields of science and technology, ARDI seeks to:

- · reinforce the capacity of developing countries to participate in the global knowledge economy; and
- support researchers in developing countries in creating and developing new solutions to technical challenges faced on a local and global level.

Currently, 17 publishers provide access to around 20,000 journals, books, and reference works for 117 developing countries and territories through ARDI.

Research4life Resources Usage: Do Share

INSTITUTION'S R4L USERNAMES AND PASSWORDS WITH:

- Authorized Users: An Institution's Employee, Permanent
 Or Visiting Faculty Or Student
- Walk-in Users: Anyone Who Comes To The Institution's Premises And Is Permitted By The Institution To Access Services There

NOTE: ACCESS FROM REMOTE ACCESS IS PERMISSIBLE BUT LIMITED TO COMPUTERS OWNED PERSONALLY BY EMPLOYEES OR BY INSTITUTION









Abuse of Privileges: Do Not

- Share usernames and passwords with those from outside the institution
- Supply documents to individuals or organizations outside the registered institution
- Charge a fee for supplying documents except to recover cost of printing
- Use R4L Programs when outside the country









Do Not (continued)

- Upload or post the material to a publicly available website or elsewhere
- Post usernames and passwords to websites or blogs that are publically accessible

NOTE: Violations result in the institution or possibly entire country denied access until the problem is resolved. If your institution's password does not work for several days, it may have been compromised. Do not register again. Report this each of the programs helpdesks









Exclusions

- Exclusions can vary by publisher, country and institution type.
- What content is available to my country and institution type? See http://agora-journals.fao.org/content/en/country_offer.php
- Access problems may be due to technical issues, exclusions, bandwidth. If the content should be available, that is useful to know: please take note of journal/publisher when reporting access challenges.
