
# Vision

#### **LEGISLATION**



- The Act has been cited as "THE INDUSTRIAL PROPERTY ACT OF THE KINGDOM OF BHUTAN, 2001".
- ▶ 17 July, 2001 / 79<sup>th</sup> session of the National Assembly.
- Provisions on Patents, Trademarks and Industrial Design
- Ministry of Economic Affairs is authorized to regulate the Act.

- Definition

- Patentable Inventions

- Building in-house expertise:


#### Example:

### **Statistics**

- Number of queries = 10 from foreign applicants since 2002
- Number of applications received = 3
- Granted = 0Fields of invention = Pharmaceutical and electrical.



#### **CHALLENGES**

- 1. Weak local industrial base and lack of innovative culture
- 2. Lack of internal expertise (both legal and technical)
- 3. Constraints in training examiners on search and substantive examination (including interpretation of ISA & IPEA reports)
- 4. Absence of patent attorneys in Bhutan
- 5. Confusion as a late starter in the game

#### **WAY FORWARD**

- 1. Operating patent registry
- Incorporating patent registration system into IPAS software
- Linking with regional offices/WIPO for substantive search and examination.
- 2. Long term hands on training for examiners
- Search and examination
- Understanding and interpretation of search and examination reports
- 3. Accession to PCT (Patent Cooperation Treaty)
