- Effectively creating new laws
- Precision required to define scope of the protection (third-party certainty)

Main claim types

- Product
 - Physical entity: e.g. tools, chemical compounds...
- Method
 - Activity: e.g. methods of manufacture...
- (Uses)
 - Activity with a physical entity: e.g. use of a tool to perform a task...

Claim Format

Preamble

• "A method of ...", "A vehicle...", "A compound..."

Transitional phrase

- Open: "...comprising...", "...having...", "...including..."
- Closed: "...consisting of..."
- Body
 - ...[essential features of the invention]".

Features – brewing tea

- Steep tea leaves
- Water
- Temperature of the water (about 90°C)
- Tea bag for the leaves
- Shaped tea bag






Prior art vs. the invention



A method of brewing tea, comprising steeping tea leaves in water.


