





> Trends in the Technology Trade of Countries



> Trends in World GDP and Patent Applications





 - ✓ Patent Application and Trademark Application growth rates are synchronized with changes in Gross Domestic Product (GDP)


Gross Domestic Product, Patent Application and Trademark Application Growth Rates






Relationship between R&D and Patents








Relationship between R&D and Patents (2)

Resident Patent Applications per R&D Expenditure (US\$ mil.) (FY'08)



Resident Patent Applications per R&D Expenditures, 2003-2007








Globalization of Patent Applications (1)

✓ Percentage of applications filed with both the national/regional IP Office and foreign IP Offices







Gross Domestic Product, Patent Applications and Trademark Applications






Business Globalization focused on Trademarks




The Madrid Protocol

- "The Protocol Relating to the Madrid Agreement Concerning the International Registration of Marks"
 - ✓ Entered into force in 1995
 - ✓83 contracting parties (as of November 2010)
- Entered into force in Japan in 2000
 - ✓ the 42nd contracting party

Advantages of the Madrid Protocol for Users

- ➤ At the application stage:
 - ✓ A single application in one language and one currency
 - ✓ File with the Office of Origin (e.g., IP Office of home country)
- >At the post-registration stage:
 - ✓ Decision to grant (or not to grant) in each country is made within 12 months or 18 months
 - ✓ Easy to manage trademark
 - A single request to record changes (transfers, changes of names or addresses, etc.) which may affect the registration as a whole or in part
 - A single request for renewal



International Applications originating from Japan




Top 3 Designated Countries (2009)
