Indian Broadcasting Foundation (IBF)

IBF recognizes the importance of the negotiations process towards an international treaty for the protection of broadcasting organizations.

The main objectives of the activities undertaken by IBF include the following: to promote, develop and protect the interests of the Indian television industry and other related entities; to disseminate knowledge, regarding the latest developments in the television industry, amongst its members; to protect and define the rights of the members and make all efforts to get the best advantages from the relevant authorities; to protect its members in respect of infringement of titles, trademarks, trade names and copyrights and to this connection to take all necessary legal action including liaising with Government/regulatory authorities for statutory/legislative reform; to obtain sanctions, privileges, advantages, relief, co-operation from any authority in the interest of the Indian television industry; to advocate legislative and other measures affecting the Indian television industry; to formulate rules of conduct of members and other persons in the Indian television industry and also to modify the same from time to time to keep pace with changing environments.

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
