CHAPTERI

GENERALPROVISIONS

Article1 RelationtoOtherConventionsandTreaties

- 1. NothinginthistreatyshallderogatefromexistingobligationsthatContractingParties havetoeachotherunderexistingcopyrig htandrelatedrightstreaties,includingbutnot limitedtotheBerneConventionfortheProtectionofliteraryandArtisticWorks(1971),the AgreementonTrade -RelatedAspects,ofIntellectualPropertyRights(TRIPSAgreement),the WIPOCopyrightTreaty andWIPOPerformancesandPhonogramsTreaty,theBrussels ConventionRelatingtotheDistributionofProgramme -CarryingSignalsTransmittedby Satellite,andtheInternationalConventionfortheProtectionofPerformers,Producersof PhonogramsandBroadc astingOrganizationsdoneinRome,October26,1961.
- 2. Protectiongrantedunderthistreatyshallleaveintactandshallinnowayaffectthe protectionofcopyrightorrelatedrightsinprogrammaterialincorporatedinbroadcasts, cablecastsandconsequen tlynoprovisionsofthistreatymaybeinterpretedasprejudicing suchprotection.
- 3. Thistreatyshallnothaveanyconnectionwith,norshallitprejudiceanyobligations under,anyothertreaties.

Article2 Definitions

Forthepurposesofthistreaty:

- (a) "broadcasting" means the transmission by wireless means for public reception of sounds, images or sounds and images, or of the representations thereof. Such transmission by satellite is also "broadcasting." Wireless transmission of encrypted signals is "broadcasting" where the means for decrypting are provided to the public by the broadcasting organization or with its consent. "Broadcasting" shall not be understood as including transmissions over computer networks or any transmissions where the time and place of reception may be individually chosen by members of the public;
- (b) "cablecasting"meansthetransmissionbywireforpublicreceptionofsounds, images, or sounds and images or of the representations thereof. Transmission by wire of encrypted sign alsis "cablecasting" where the means for decrypting are provided to the public by the cable casting organization or with its consent. "Cable casting" shall not be understood as including transmission over computer networks or any transmission where the time and place of reception may be individually chosen by members of the public;

- (c) a "broadcastingorganization" or a "cable castingorganization" means the person or the legalentity, who or which takes the initiative and has the responsibility for:
- $(i) \qquad the trans\ mission to the public of sounds, images or sounds and images or the presentations thereof and/or$
 - (ii) theassemblyandschedulingofthecontentofthetransmission;
- (d) "rebroadcasting" meansthesimultaneous broadcasting by one broadcasting organization of the broadcast, cable cast of another broadcasting, cable casting organization;
- (e) "fixation" means the embodiment of sounds, images, or sounds and images, or of the representations thereof, from which they can be perceived, reproduced or communicated through a device.

Article3 BeneficiariesofProtectionUnderthisTreaty

- 1. Contracting parties shall accord protection provided under this treaty to broadcasting, cable casting organizations which are nationals of the other contracting parties.
- 2. Nationals of other contracting parties shall be understood to be those broadcasting, cable casting organizations which meet either of the following conditions:
- (a) Theheadquartersofthebroadcasting, cable casting is situated in another contracting party, or
- (b) abroadcast, cablecas tistransmitted from orbyafacility situated in another contracting party. In the case of satellite broadcasting, a facility shall be construed to be situated where the sounds, images, or sounds and images, or the presentations thereof, or accompanying analogor digital data, intended for direct public reception are introduced, under the control and responsibility of the broadcasting, cable casting organization, into an uninterrupted chain of communication leading to the satellite and down towards the ea

Article4 NationalTreatment

rth.

Each contracting party shall accord to nationals of other contracting parties the rights which their respective laws do now or may here after grant to their nationals, in respect of broadcasts or cable casts for which suc hnationals are protected under this treaty, as well as rights specifically granted by this treaty.

CHAPTERII

RIGHTSOFBROADCASTINGCABLECASTINGORGANIZATIONS

Article5 SpecificProtection

Broadcasting, cable casting organizations shall enjoy the exc lusive right of authorizing:

- (a) therebroadcastingoftheirbroadcasts, cablecasts;
- (b) the deferred transmission by wire or wireless means, including by means of a computer network, of their broadcasts, from fix at ions of their broadcasts or cable casts;
 - (c) thef ixationofbroadcasts, cablecasts;
 - (d) thereproduction of their broadcasts, cable casts fix at ion smade:
 - (i) without their consent, or
- (ii) pursuanttoArticle8whensuchreproductionwouldnotbepermittedby thatArticle;
- (e) (i) the public rendition of their broad asts, cable casts of sounds and images embodied in audiovisual works in places accessible to the public against payment of an entrance fee; it shall be a matter for the domestic law of the party where protection is claimed to determine the conditions under which it may be exercised;
- (ii) anycontractingpartymay,inanotificationdepositedwiththeDirector GeneralofWIPO,declarethatitwillapplytheprovisionsofparagraph(i)onlyinrespectof certaincommunications,orthatitwilllimittheiapplicationinsomeotherway,orthatitwill notapplytheseprovisionsatall.Ifacontractingpartymakessuchadeclaration,theother contractingpartiesshallnotbeobligedtogranttherightreferredtoinparagraph(i)to broadcasting,cablecas tingorganizationswhoseheadquartersareinthatstate.

Article6 Rightstoprohibit

Broadcasting, cable casting organizations shall have the right to prohibit the following acts when under taken without their authorization:

- (a) themakingavailabletothe publicoffixationsoftheirbroadcasts, cablecasts, by wireorwirelessmeans, in such a way that members of the public may access them from a place and attained individually chosen by them;
 - (b) thereproductionoffixationsoftheircablecastsandbroadca sts;
- (c) the distribution to the publicand importation of reproductions of fixations of their broadcasts, cable casts.

Article7 ProtectioninRelationtoSignalsPriortoBroadcasting,Cablecasting

Broadcastingandcablecastingorganizationsshallalsoen joyadequateandeffective legalprotectionagainstanyactsreferredtoinArticles5and6inrelationtotheirsignalsprior tobroadcasting,cablecasting.

Article8 LimitationsandExceptions

- 1. Therightsofbroadcastingandcablecastingorganizations setforthinArticles5,6and7 shallleaveintactandshallinnowayaffecttheprotectionofcopyrightorrelatedrightsin programmaterialincorporatedinbroadcasts,cablecasts.
- 2. ContractingPartiesmay,intheirnationallegislation,providefo rthesamekindof limitationsorexceptionswithregardtotheprotectionofbroadcasting,cablecasting organizationsastheyprovidefor,intheirnationallegislation,inconnectionwiththe protectionofcopyrightinliteraryandartisticworksandwit htheprotectionoftherelated rightsofperformersandproducersofphonograms.
- 3. ContractingPartiesshallconfineanylimitationsoforexceptionstorightsprovidedfor inthistreatytocertainspecialcaseswhichdonotconflictwithanormalexploitationofthe broadcast,cablecastanddonotunreasonablyprejudicethelegitimateinterestsofthe broadcasting,cablecastingorganizationsassetforthherein.
- 4. IfonthedateoftheDiplomaticConferenceaContractingPartyhasinforcelimitation and exceptions to the rights conferred in Article 5(a) -(c) in respect of non -commercial broadcasting organization sitmay maintain such limitations and exceptions.

Article9 TermofProtection

The term of protection to be granted to broad casting and cable casting organizations under this treaty shall last at least 50 years until the end of a period computed from the end of the year in which the broad cast, cable cast took place.

Article10 ObligationsConcerningTechnologicalMeasures

ContractingPar tiesshallprovideadequateandeffectivelegalremediesagainstthe circumventionofeffectivetechnologicalmeasuresthatareusedbybroadcasting, cablecasting organizations in connection with the exercise of their rights under this treaty and that rest acts, in respect of their broadcasts, cable casts which are not authorized by the beneficiary concerned or permitted by law.

Article 1 I Obligations Concerning Rights Management Information

- 1. ContractingPartiesshallprovideadequateandeffectiveleg alremediesagainstany personknowinglyperforminganyofthefollowingactsknowing,orwithrespecttocivil remedies,havingreasonablegroundstoknow,thatitwillinduce,enable,facilitateorconceal aninfringementofanyrightorviolationofany prohibitioncoveredbythistreaty:
- $(a) \quad to remove or alter any electronic rights management information without authority;\\$
- (b) todistribute, import for distribution, retransmit, communicate or make available to the public, without authority, broadcasts, cablec astsor fixations thereof, knowing that electronic rights management information has been removed or altered without authority.
- 2. AsusedinthisArticle, "rightsmanagementinformation" means information provided by the broadcasting organization which identifies such an organization, the broadcast, cable cast or the owner of any right in the broadcast, cable cast or information about the terms and conditions of use of the broadcast, cable cast or any numbers or codes that represents uch information, when any of these items of information is attached to or associated with the broadcast, cable cast.

Article12 Formalities

The enjoyment and exercise of rights provided in this treaty shall not be subject to any formality.

Article13 Reservations

Subjecttot heprovisionsofArticle5(g)(ii),noreservationstothetreatyshallbe permitted.

Article14 ApplicationinTime

ContractingPartiesshallapplytheprovisionsofArticle18oftheBerneConvention, *mutatismutandis* ,totherightsofbroadcasting,c ablecastingorganizationsprovidedforinthe treaty.

Article 15 Provisions on Enforcement of Rights

- 1. ContractingPartiesshallundertaketoadopt,inaccordancewiththeirlegalsystems,the measuresnecessarytoensuretheapplicationofthistreat y.
- 2. ContractingPartiesshallensurethatenforcementproceduresareavailableundertheir lawsoastopermiteffectiveactionagainstanyactofinfringementofrightsorviolation againstanyprohibitioncoveredbythistreaty,includingexpeditious remediestoprevent infringementsorviolations,whichconstituteadeterrenttofurtherinfringementsand violations.

CHAPTERIII ADMINISTRATIVEANDFINALCLAUSES

Article16 Assembly

- 1. (a) TheContractingPartiesshallhaveanAssembly.
- (b) EachCon tractingPartyshallberepresentedbyonedelegatewhomaybeassisted by alternated elegates, advisors and experts.
- (c) TheexpensesofthedelegationshallbebornebytheContractingPartythathas appointedthedelegation.TheAssemblymayasktheWorld IntellectualProperty Organization(hereinafterreferredtoasWIPO)tograntfinancialassistancetofacilitatethe participationofdelegationsofContractingPartiesthatareregardedasdevelopingcountriesin conformitywiththeestablishedpractice oftheGeneralAssemblyoftheUnitedNationsor thatarecountriesintransitiontoamarketeconomy.
- 2. (a) The Assembly shall deal with matters concerning the maintenance and development of this treaty and the application and operation of this treaty.
- $(b) \quad The Assembly shall perform the functional located to it under Article 18 (2) in respect of the admission of certain intergovernmental organizations to be come party to this treaty. \\$
- (c) The Assembly shall decide the convocation of any diplomatic conference for the revision of this treaty and givenecess ary instructions to the Director General of WIPO for the preparation of such a diplomatic conference.
- 3. (a) EachContractingPartythatisaStateshallhaveonevoteandshallvoteonlyinits ownna me.
- (b) AnyContractingPartythatisanintergovernmentalorganizationmayparticipate inthevote,inplaceofitsMemberStates,withanumberofvotesequaltothenumberofits MemberStatesthatarepartytothistreaty.Nosuchintergovernmental organizationshall participateinthevoteifanyoneofitsMemberStatesexercisesitsrighttovoteandvice versa.

- 4. The Assembly shall meet in ordinary session once every two years upon convocation by the Director General of WIPO.
- 5. The Assemblys hallest ablish its own rules of procedure, including the convocation of extraordinary sessions, the requirements of a quorum and, subject to the provisions of this treaty, the required majority for various kinds of decisions.

Article17 InternationalBur eau

The International Bureau of WIPO shall perform the administrative tasks concerning the treaty.

Article18 EligibilityforBecomingPartytotheTreaty

- 1. AnyMemberStateofWIPOmaybecomepartytothistreaty.
- 2. The Assembly may decide to admit any intergovernmental organization to be come party to this treaty which declares that it is competent in respect of, and has it sown legislation binding on all its Member States on matters covered by this treaty and that it has been duly authorized, in accordance with its internal procedures, to be come party to this treaty.
- 3. The European Union, having made the declaration referred to in the preceding paragraph in the Diplomatic Conference that has adopted this treaty, may be come party to this treaty subject to paragraph 1 of this Article.

Article19 RightsandObligationsUndertheTreaty

Subject to any specific provisions to the contrary in this treaty, each Contracting Party shall enjoyal lofther ights and assume all of the obligations under this treat y.

Article20 SignatureoftheTreaty

This treaty shall be open for signature until December 31,200_, by any Member State of WIPO and by the European Union.

Article21 EntryintoForceoftheTreaty

Thistreatyshallenterintoforcethreemonthsa fter_instrumentsofratificationor accessionbyStateshavebeendepositedwiththeDirectorGeneralofWIPO.

Article22 EffectiveDateofBecomingPartytotheTreaty

Thistreatyshallbind:

(a)	The_	StatesreferredtoinArticle21,fromth	edateonwhichthistreatyhas
enteredintoforce;			

- $(b) \quad Each other State from the expiration of three months from the date on which the State has deposite dits in strument with the Director General of WIPO;\\$
- (c) TheEuropeanUnion,fromtheexpiration of threemonthsafterthedepositofits instrumentofratificationoraccessionifsuchinstrumenthasbeendepositedaftertheentry intoforceofthistreatyaccordingtoArticle21,or,threemonthsaftertheentryintoforceofthistreatyifsuchinstr umenthasbeendepositedbeforetheentryintoforceofthistreaty;
- (d) Anyotherintergovernmentalorganizationthatisadmittedtobecomepartytothis treaty, from the expiration of three months after the deposit of its instrument of accession.

Article23 DenunciationoftheTreaty

ThistreatymaybedenouncedbyanyContractingPartybynotificationaddressedtothe DirectorGeneralofWIPO.Anydenunciationshalltakeeffectoneyearfromthedateon whichtheDirectorGeneralofWIPOreceived thenotification.

Article24 LanguagesoftheTreaty

- $1. \quad This treaty is signed in a single original in English, Arabic, Chinese, French, Russian and Spanish languages, the versions in all these languages being equally authentic.\\$
- 2. Anofficialtextinanylanguageotherthanthosereferredtoinparagraph(1)shallbe establishedbytheDirectorGeneralofWIPOontherequestofinterestedparties.Forthe purposesofthisparagraph, "interestedparty" meananyMemberStateofWIPOw hose officiallanguage,oroneofwhoseofficiallanguage,isinvolvedintheEuropeanUnion,and anyotherintergovernmentalorganizationthatmaybecomepartytothistreaty,ifoneofits officiallanguagesisinvolved.

Article25 Depositary

The Dir ector General of WIPO is the depositary of this treaty.
