## DIPLOMATIC CONFERENCE FOR THE ADOPTION OF A REVISED TRADEMARK LAW TREATY

**Singapore, March 13 to 31, 2006**

RESOLUTIONS PROPOSED FOR ADOPTION  
BY THE DIPLOMATIC CONFERENCE

*Proposal by the Delegation of Honduras on Behalf of the Countries of the Group of Latin America and the Caribbean (GRULAC)*

Recognizing that one of the aims of the Revised Trademark Law Treaty (RTLTL) and the Regulations thereunder is to provide balanced and fair rules representing the interests of all the Contracting Parties and, in turn, to serve as an incentive for future accession by new members,

Recognizing the existence of different levels of social, economic and technological development in countries, mainly in developing countries and the least developed countries (LDCs),

Recognizing that the above affects the limited availability of technological, institutional and administrative resources,

Recognizing that the use of electronic communication means represents a positive aspect within the context of the RTLTL and the Regulations thereunder,

The Conference decides that:

1. The ever more frequent tendency to use electronic means for the transmission of communications by the Contracting Parties to the RTLT and the Regulations thereunder must be supported by prompt and appropriate technical assistance and the strengthening of institutions in all their different aspects, mainly through the contribution that may come from WIPO and from developed countries. This assistance will depend on the level of technological and economic development of beneficiary countries, primarily developing countries and LDCs.

2. The Contracting Parties undertake to exchange, transfer and share, on a multilateral basis, the experience and knowledge acquired in the technological and institutional fields, with reference to the various technical aspects relating to development, as applied to the provisions of the RTLT and the Regulations thereunder, in accordance with the priorities of each country.

Comment

In conclusion, the aim of both decisions is to facilitate the implementation by the Contracting Parties to the RTLT and the Regulations thereunder, and also to enhance their operational capacities in terms of institutional, technological, technical and administrative aspects.

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
