MemorandumpreparedbytheSecretariat

1. ThetermofofficeoftheDirectorGeneraloftheWorldIntellectualProperty Organization(WIPO)willexpireonNovember 30, 2003. The present memorand umrecalls the constitutional provisions concerning the nomination and appointment of Directors General of WIPO and the procedures adopted by the WIPO General Assembly in 1998 for the nomination and appointment of Directors General of WIPO. The memorand umals or ecords the steps taken to initiate those procedures and discusses the time table for the implementation of the outstanding steps of the procedures.

ConstitutionalProvisions

2. The Convention Establishing the World Intellectual Property Organization (the WIPO Convention) contains the following provisions on the nomination and appointment of the Director General.

Nomination

Article8(3)

"TheCoordinationCommitteeshall:

"(v) whenthetermofofficeoftheDirectorGeneralisabouttoexpire,orw hen thereisavacancyinthepostoftheDirectorGeneral,nominateacandidatefor appointmenttosuchpositionbytheGeneralAssembly;iftheGeneralAssemblydoes notappointitsnominee,theCoordinationCommitteeshallnominateanothercandidate; thisprocedureshallberepeateduntilthelatestnomineeisappointedbytheGeneral Assembly";

Appointment

Article6(2)

"TheGeneralAssemblyshall:

"(i) appoint the Director General upon nomination by the Coordination Committee";

Article6(3)

"(g) FortheappointmentoftheDirectorGeneral...therequiredmajoritymustbe attainednotonlyintheGeneralAssemblybutalsointheAssemblyoftheParisUnion andtheAssemblyoftheBerneUnion."

ProceduralSteps

- 3. AtitsmeetinginSept ember 1998,theWIPOGeneralAssemblyadoptedproceduresfor thenominationandappointmentofDirectorsGeneralofWIPO(seedocumentsWO/GA/23/6, paragraph 5,andWO/GA/23/7,paragraph 22).ThoseproceduresaresetoutinAnnex Ito thismemorandum.
- 4. ThefirststepintheproceduresconsistsofthesendingofacircularbytheChairofthe WIPOCoordinationCommitteetoallMemberStatesofWIPO,invitingthemtoproposea nationalascandidateforthepostofDirectorGeneralofWIPO.This circularisexpectedto besentonSeptember 9,2002.AcopyofitissetoutinAnnex IItothismemorandum.The circularitselfhastwoannexes,whichconsistofacopyoftheprovisionsoftheWIPO Conventionthatarequotedinparagraph 2ofthisme morandum,andacopyoftheprocedures forthenominationandappointmentofDirectorsGeneralofWIPOthatarereproducedin Annex Itothisdocument.

5. The application in practice of the procedures approved by the General Assembly in 1998 would result in the following time table:

ANNEXI

PROCEDURESFORTHENOMINATIONANDAPPOINTMENTOF DIRECTORSGENERALOFWIPO

<u>ProceduresfortheAnnouncementofanImpendingVacancyandfortheSubmissionof</u>
Candidatures

- 1. AtleastsixmonthsbeforethemeetingoftheCoordinationCommitteewhichis tobe convenedfornominatingacandidateforappointmenttothepostofDirectorGeneral,the ChairoftheCoordinationCommitteeshallsendacirculartoallMemberStatesofWIPO, invitingthemtoproposeanationalascandidateforthepostofDirecto rGeneralofWIPO.
- 2. The candidature submitted by a Member State shall be accompanied by the curriculum vitae of the candidate.
- 3. The exact time (Geneva) and date of the deadline for submission of candidatures shall be specified in the circular sent by the Chair of the Coordination Committee inviting candidatures. That dates hall be three months after the date of the circular.
- 4. The Chair of the Coordination Committee, with the collaboration of the International Bureau, shall communicate the various nomination sto all the Member States immediately on receiving them. Immediately following the deadline for the submission of candidatures, the Chair shall communicate to the Member States, in one consolidated communication, all nominations received.
- $5. \quad The Coordination Committee shall be convened in order to nominate a candidate for the post of Director General, no earlier than six months and no later than five months before the meeting of the WIPO General Assembly which is to appoint the Director General upon nomination by the Coordination Committee.\\$
- $6. \quad The decision of the Coordination Committee shall be notified to all the Member States \\ by the Chairman of the Committee immediately after the decision had been made.$

<u>ProceduresforNominationbytheCoor</u> <u>dinationCommitteeofaCandidatetothePostof</u> <u>DirectorGeneral</u>

- I. <u>Generalprinciples</u>
- 1. Theselection of a candidate for Director General shall be guided by respect for the dignity of the candidates, as well as the countries nominating them, and tran sparency of the nomination process.
- 2. Thenomination of a candidate for Director General should, if possible, be made by consensus. This will facilitate the appointment of the Director General by the General Assembly. However, it is recognized that vot in gwill probably be an ecessary means of building consensus for the nomination of a candidate.

3. Effortstonominateacandidateviaconsultationsleadingtoconsensusarewelcomeat anystageoftheselectionprocess, butsucheffortsshouldnotunduly delaythe decision-makingprocess.

II. Righttovote

Itisestablishedthat, for the purposes of the nomination of a candidate for Director General by the Coordination Committee, all the members of the Coordination Committee, with the exception of associatements, may exercise their vote.

III. <u>Decision-makingprocess</u>

- 1. Wheretherearemorethanthreecandidates, before any formal vote is taken, an indication of the relative supportenjoyed by candidates may be assessed by means of a "straw poll." The "straw -poll" will be conducted in such a way that each member of the Coordination Committee which has a right to vote will mark its first and second choice on the list of candidates on his voting paper. Voting will be by Secret Ballot. Where there a rethree or less candidates, the procedures in this paragraph and then ext paragraphs hall be omitted.
- 2. FormalvotingbySecretBallotwillproceedinseveralsteps, each time with adequate advancenotice, with a view to the gradual reduction of the num berofcandidatestoa short listofthreecandidates. Following each vote, the candidate receiving the least number ofvoteswillbeineligibletoparticipateinthenextvote. If, however, the number of candidatesislarge,inordertolimitthefrequ encyofvotes, the two or three candidates receivingtheleastnumberofvotesmaybedeclaredtobeineligibletoparticipateinthenext vote. The exact dimension of each step will be decided, after consultation, by the Chairinthe lightofthenumber of candidates remaining at any given time. After the second formal vote, participation in additional votes shall be restricted to the five candidates having obtained the greatest numbererofvotes.Afterthethird formalvote, ashort -list will be established of the three candidates having obtained the greatestnumberofvotes.
- 3. If consultations on the basis of the short list of three candidates are not progressing, the voting process will be continued. Following the vote on the candidates of the short list, a final vote will be restricted to the two candidates having obtained the greatest number of votes. The Coordination Committee will then, no later than the final day of its me eting, take its final decision amongst two candidates in a vote.
- 4. The Chairman of the Coordination Committee will communicate the name of the candidate for appointment to the post of Director General to the Chairman of the General Assembly.

The WIPO General Assembly which is to appoint the Director General upon nomination by the Coordination Committees hall be convened to meet not earlier than three months and not later than one month before the expiration of the outgoing Director General.

Inaccordancewiththe provisionsoftheConventionEstablishingtheWorldIntellectual PropertyOrganization(seeAnnexI)andpursuanttotheProceduresfortheNominationand AppointmentofDirectorsGeneralofWIPOadoptedbytheWIPOGeneralAssemblyin September1998(see AnnexII),itwillbethetaskoftheWIPOCoordinationCommitteeatits extraordinarysessiononMarch24and25,2003,tonominateapersonforappointmentbythe WIPOGeneralAssemblyasDirectorGeneral.Thedecisiononthatnominationwillbemade bytheWIPOGeneralAssemblyinitsnextsessionin2003afterthenominationoftheWIPO CoordinationCommitteehasbeenmade.

The Government of every Statemember of WIPO may, if its odesires, propose the name of one of its nationals as candidate for no mination by the WIPO Coordination Committee. Any proposal should be accompanied by the curriculum vitae of the person proposed and should be addressed to the Chair of the WIPO Coordination Committee, at the address of WIPO in Geneva, by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Member Statemaking the proposal. Proposal smust reach WIPO before 5 p.m. on Monday, December 9, 2002.
