In the light of the global pandemic, a strong and balanced IPR system has proved more important than ever. Therefore, in these difficult circumstances it seems particularly important that businesses can count on a robust support from the institutions managing IP.

The Nordic Patent Institute (NPI) – a PCT search- and examination authority jointly founded by Iceland, Norway and Denmark – continued to deliver high quality products to its applicants.

In closing, Denmark would like to applaud WIPO's efforts to navigate through these various challenges arising from the global pandemic. Denmark underlines its commitment to contribute in a positive, constructive and pragmatic manner to WIPO and its bodies. The efficient functioning of WIPO's global IP services is important for Danish users and we wish to ensure that WIPO strive to deliver world-class services.
