AtthefourthsessionoftheWorkingGrouponConstitutionalReform("theWorking Group"),theWorkingGroupdisc ussedthedraftprovisionscontainedindocument WO/GA/WG-CR/4/2("ConventionEstablishingtheWorldIntellectualPropertyOrganization –DraftTextsofAmendmentsAgreedinPrinciple").Thesaiddocumentsetsoutdraft provisionsfortheimplementation, intheConventionEstablishingtheWorldIntellectual PropertyOrganization("theWIPOConvention"),ofthevariousproposedreformsthathave beenagreedinprinciplebytheWorkingGroup,aswellasoptionsforprovisionsinrespectof outstandingpropos alsonwhichagreementinprinciplehasnotyetbeenreachedbythe WorkingGroup.TheissuesonwhichtheWorkingGroupdoesnotyethaveanagreed positionare:

(i) the size and the criteria for determining the composition of the Coordination Committee (see document A/36/10, paragraph 10); and

(ii) the creation of a unitary Assembly, as the competent Assembly for all WIPO-administered treaties (see document A/36/10, paragraph 14).

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2. AstheWorkingGroupdidnotreachagreementontheou tstandingitemsdescribed above, the following pages of this document reproduce (as an annext of his document) the draft provisions in the same format and content as those originally distributed and discussed at the fourtheses is not find the working Group, as contained indocument WO/GA/WG -CR/4/2.

1. ThesessionsoftheWorkingGrouponConstitutionalReform("theWorkingGroup") heldsofarhaveresultedin"agreementinprinciple"torecommendanumberof proposed amendmentstotheconstitutionalstructureofWIPOandoftheUnionsadministeredby WIPO.

2. By"agreementinprinciple,"theWorkingGrouphasintendedtosignifytentativeor provisionalagreementtoproceedwithaparticularproposa l,subject,nevertheless,toareview oftheproposalinthecontextofthecompletesetorpackageofproposalsthatmayemerge fromthediscussionsoftheWorkingGroup.Inotherwords,noparticularproposalistobe regardedasfinallyagreeduntilth ediscussionsofallproposalshavebeencompletedtothe satisfactionoftheWorkingGroup. 3. The present documents ets outdraft provisions for the implementation, in the Convention Establishing the World Intellectual Property Organization ("t he WIPO Convention"), of the various proposed reforms that have been agreed in principle by the Working Group, namely,

(i) unitarycontributionsystemandchangesincontributionclasses(see documentWO/GA/WG -CR/3,paragraphs36to38,andA/35/3,parag raph6);

(ii) annualperiodicityofordinarysessionsoftheAssembliesofmemberStates (seedocumentWO/GA/WG -CR/3,paragraph51,WO/GA/WG -CR/2/8,paragraph22,and A/35/3,paragraph7);and

(iii) theabolitionoftheWIPOConference(seedocumentW O/GA/WG-CR/3/6, paragraph12).

4. Inaddition,thepresentdocumentsetsoutoptionsforprovisionsinrespectof outstandingproposalsonwhichagreementinprinciplehasnotyetbeenreachedbythe WorkingGroupinordertoadvancediscussion ontheseissues.Theissuesinthiscategory are:

(i) theabolitionoftheExecutiveCommitteesoftheParis,BerneandPCT UnionsandthecompositionandmaintenanceorabolitionoftheCoordinationCommittee(see documentsWO/GA/WG -CR/2/4,WO/GA/WG -CR/3/4andWO/GA/WG -CR/3/6,paragraphs 13to51);and

(ii) thecreationofaunitaryAssembly,namelytheWIPOGeneralAssembly,as thecompetentAssemblyforallWIPO -administeredtreaties(seedocumentsWO/GA/WG CR/3/5andWO/GA/WG -CR/3/6,paragraphs52 to61).

5. SincetheconstitutionalstructureofWIPOresultsfromtheinterrelationofallthe treatiesadministeredbyWIPO(see,ingeneral,documentWO/GA/WG -CR/2),thepresent documentneedstobeconsideredinconjunctionwithdocumentWO /GA/WG-CR/4/3("Paris ConventionfortheProtectionofIndustrialProperty –DraftTextsofAmendmentsto AdministrativeandFinancialProvisionsAgreedinPrinciple").Thelatterdocumentsetsout drafttextsfortheimplementationofproposalsagreedin principleanddrafttextsofoptions forissuesstillunderconsiderationinthecontextoftheParisConventionasatreatythat typifiestheWIPO -administeredtreatiesthatestablishcontribution -financedUnions.

6. IntheensuingdocumentthetextofanymodificationsproposedtotheWIPO Conventionispresentedin *bolditalics*, wherewordsintheoriginalhavebeenchangedornew wordsinserted, and by" (----),"wherewordshavebeendeleted without replacement. To facilitatee as eof ref erence and comparison, the Notes relating to each Article reproduce the existing provision of the WIPOC onvention in a clearly distinguishable box.

2.02 Itmaybenotedthatthedefinitionof"intellectualproperty"in *Article2(viii)* isoutof dateinsofarasitdoesnotincludespecificmention ofgeographicalindications,rightsin respectofknow -howorundisclosedinformationandlayoutdesignsofintegratedcircuitsand insofarasitspecificallymentionsscientificdiscoveries(*cf*.thescopeof"intellectual property"inArticle1.2oftheA greementonTradeRelatedAspectsofIntellectualProperty Rights(theTRIPSAgreement)).Noattempthasbeenmadetosuggestamodificationtothis provision,however,assuchaproposalwouldseemtobebeyondthemandateoftheexercise beforetheWork ingGroup.

 - literary,artisticandscientificworks,
 - performancesofperformingartists, phonograms, and broadcasts,
 - inventionsin allfieldsofhumanendeavor,
 - scientificdiscoveries,
 - industrialdesigns,
 - trademarks, servicemarks, and commercial names and designations,
 - protectionagainstunfaircompetition,

and all other rights resulting from intellectual activity in the in dustrial, scientific, literary or artistic fields.

Article2

Definitions

4.02 Itmaybenoted,again,that *Article4(ii)*isoutofdateinsofarasitdoesnotreferto certaintreatiesconcludedundertheaegisofWIPOforwhichtheOrganization"performs[or will,oncethetreatiesenterintoforce,perform]theadministrativetasks,"suchastheWIPO CopyrightTreaty, theWIPOPerformancesandPhonogramsTreatyandthePatentLaw Treaty.Ifdesired,theprovisioncouldbesupplementedbywordstothefollowingeffect: *"andrelatingtoanyothertreatyconcludedundertheaegisoftheOrganization"*."

Article4 of the WIPO Convention Functions

InordertoattaintheobjectivesdescribedinArticle 3,theOrganization,throughits appropriateorgans,andsubjecttothecompetenceofeachoftheUnions:

- (i) shallpromotethedevelopmentofmeasuresdesignedtofa cilitatetheefficient protectionofintellectualpropertythroughouttheworldandtoharmonizenational legislationinthisfield;
- (ii) shallperformtheadministrativetasksoftheParisUnion,theSpecialUnions establishedinrelationwiththatUnion ,andtheBerneUnion;
- (iii) mayagreetoassume,orparticipatein,theadministrationofanyotherinternational agreementdesignedtopromotetheprotectionofintellectualproperty;
- (iv) shallencouragetheconclusionofinternationalagreementsdesi gnedtopromotethe protectionofintellectualproperty;
- (v) shallofferitscooperationtoStatesrequestinglegal -technicalassistanceinthefield ofintellectualproperty;
- (vi) shallassembleanddisseminateinformationconcerningtheprotectionofi ntellectual property, carry out and promotestudies in this field, and publish the results of such studies;
- (vii) shallmaintainservicesfacilitatingtheinternationalprotectionofintellectualproperty and,whereappropriate,provideforregistrationi nthisfieldandthepublicationofthe dataconcerningtheregistrations;
- (viii) shalltakeallotherappropriateaction.

Article4

Functions

InordertoattaintheobjectivesdescribedinArticle 3,theOrganization,throughits appropriateorgans, and subject to the competence of each of the Unions:

- shallpromotethedevelopmentofmeasuresdesignedtofacilitatetheefficient protectionofintellectualpropertythroughouttheworldandtoharmonizenational legislationinthisfield;
- (ii) shallperform the administrative tasks of the Paris Union, the Special Unions established in relation with that Union, and the Berne Union;
- (iii) mayagreetoassume,orparticipatein,theadministrationofanyotherinternational agreementdesignedtopromo tetheprotectionofintellectualproperty;
- (iv) shallencouragetheconclusionofinternationalagreementsdesignedtopromotethe protectionofintellectualproperty;
- (v) shallofferitscooperationtoStatesrequestinglegal -technicalassistanceinth efield ofintellectualproperty;
- (vi) shallassembleanddisseminateinformationconcerningtheprotectionofintellectual property,carryoutandpromotestudiesinthisfield,andpublishtheresultsofsuch studies;
- (vii) shallmaintainservicesfaci litatingtheinternationalprotectionofintellectualproperty and, whereappropriate, provide for registration in this field and the publication of the dataconcerning the registrations;
- (viii) shalltakeallotherappropriateaction.

6.01 TheWorkingGrouphasdiscussedtworeformsinrelationtotheWIPOGeneral AssemblyastheprincipalorganofMemberStatesofWIPO:(i)theabolitionoftheWIPO Conferenceasanadditional,but,inpractice , redundantorganofmemberStates;and (ii)thepossibilityofmakingtheWIPOGeneralAssemblythecompetentunitaryAssembly forallWIPO -administeredtreaties.

6.02 TheWorkingGroupreachedagreementinprinciple torecommendthatthefirstreform -theabolitionoftheWIPOConference -shouldbeimplemented(seedocuments WO/GA/WG-CR/3/3andWO/GA/WG -CR/3/6,paragraph12). *Article6(1)(a)*seeksto implementthisreforminpartbyaccordingtoallStatespartyt otheWIPOConvention membershipintheWIPOGeneralAssembly(therebysuppressing,asaconditionofsuch membership,thatStatesbepartytotheWIPOConvention *and*memberofoneoftheUnions administeredbyWIPO).

6.03 Whiletherewasgeneralinterest inthesecondreform –makingtheWIPOGeneral AssemblythecompetentunitaryAssemblyforallWIPO -administeredtreaties –theWorking Groupexpressedadesiretoconsiderfurtherhowsuchareformwouldworkinpractice(see documentWO/GA/WG -CR/3/6,pa ragraphs52to61).Article6setsout,insquarebrackets, thevariousprovisionswhichitisconsideredwouldneedtobeadoptedinordertoestablish theGeneralAssemblyassuchaunitaryAssembly.InadditiontotheseprovisionsinArticle6 ofthe WIPOConvention,correspondingenablingortransferprovisionswouldneedtobe adoptedineachotherWIPO -administeredtreatywhichhasanAssembly.Anexampleof suchcorrespondingprovisionsistobefoundintheprovisionsinsquarebracketsinthedr aft textofArticle13oftheParisConvention,containedindocumentWO/GA/WG -CR/4/3.

6.04 *Article6(1)(a)* containsthefirstenablingprovisionneededtoconstitutetheGeneral AssemblyastheunitaryAssembly.Thatprovisioniscontainedinsquarebra cketsandwould admittomembershipoftheGeneralAssemblyStatesandintergovernmentalorganizations thatwerepartytoanotherWIPO -administeredtreatyand,thus,memberoftheAssemblyof thatothertreatyforwhichtheGeneralAssemblywouldhencefort hassumecompetence. Suchadmission,however,wouldbeonly"forthepurposesofmattersconcerning"theother WIPO-administeredtreaty.

6.05 *Article* 6(1)(b)and(c) contain, insquare brackets, the addition of the mention of intergovernmental organizations, as a consequence of the admission of such intergovernmental organizations to the General Assembly for the purp oses indicated in the preceding paragraph. There are several WIPO - administered treaties which certain intergovernmental organizations are eligible to join, namely the Protocol Relating to the Madrid Agreement Concerning the International Registration of Madrid Agreement Law Treaty and the Geneva Act of the Hague Agreement Concerning the International Registration of Industrial Designs (the Hague Agreement).

6.06 *Article6(2)* setsoutthepowersandfunctionsoftheGe neralAssembly.Thosepowers andfunctionswillneedtobemodifiedasaconsequenceoftheabolitionoftheWIPO ConferenceandtheassumptionbytheGeneralAssemblyoftheroleofunitaryAssembly.

6.07 *Article6(2)(ia)and(vbis)* would introduce into the powers of the General Assembly the two independent functions at present exercised by the WIPOC onference, which would need to be re-attributed to the General Assembly as a consequence of the abolition of the WIPO Conference. The two provisions corres pond to those which are found at present in Article7(2)(i) and (iv) of the WIPO Convention.

6.08 *Article6(2)(ixbis)* contains a new provision, insquare brackets, which would need to be introduced if the General Assembly were to assume the role of unitary ry Assembly. The provision enables the General Assembly to exercise such powers and functions as are accorded by a WIPO - administered treaty to the Assembly of that treaty for which the General Assembly assumes competence.

6.9 *Article6(3)* regulatesvotingrightsintheGeneralAssembly.Severalmodifications wouldneedtobeintroducedtotheexistingprovisionsofArticle6(3)inconsequen ceofthe abolitionoftheWIPOConferenceandtheattributiontotheGeneralAssemblyoftheroleof unitaryAssembly.

6.10 *Article6(3)(aa)* dealswiththevotingrightsofanintergovernmentalorganization which, byvirtueofArticle6(1)(a), is admitt edtotheGeneralAssemblyforthepurposes or matters concerningaWIPO - administered treaty to which the intergovernmental organization is party. It provides, in essence, for the continuation in the General Assembly, in respect of matters concerning the WIPO-administered treaty to which the intergovernmental organization is party, of the same rights with respect to voting as the intergovernmental organization enjoys in that WIPO - administered treaty. The provision does not, therefore, create any new votin grights on the part of intergovernmental organizations, but merely transfers existing rights to the new context of the General Assembly acting as the Assembly for the WIPO - administered treaty to which the intergovernmental organization is party.

6.11 *Article6(3)(ab)* containsabasicruledesignedtoimplementtheprinciplethataState (orintergovernmentalorganization)shouldhavetherighttovoteonlyinrespectoftreatiesby whichitisbound.Thisprovision,withoutthetextinsquarebrackets, wouldbenecessaryas aconsequenceoftheabolitionoftheWIPOConference,sincetheresultofthatabolition wouldbemembershipintheGeneralAssemblyofStatespartytotheWIPOConventionbut notmembersofoneoftheUnionsadministeredbyWIPO.T hetextwithinsquarebrackets wouldbenecessaryintheeventthattheGeneralAssemblyweretobemadecompetentasthe unitaryAssemblyforallWIPO -administeredtreaties.

6.12 *Article6(3)(bbis*) deals with the rule on quorum in respect of the General Assembly's role as a unitary Assembly. It provides that, where the General Assembly is acting as the competent Assembly for another WIPO - administered treaty, the rule on quorum in that other treaty applies.

6.13 *Article6(3)(fbis)* regulates them anner of taking decisions where the General Assembly is acting as a unitary Assembly. It proposes that, in such cases, them anner of reaching decisions should be determined by the provisions in the W IPO-administered treaty for which the General Assembly is assuming competence. The expression "manner of reaching decisions" is used in preference to are ference to required majorities so as to accommodate the different provisions to be found in the vario us WIPO - administered treaties, such as Article 21(4) of the Geneva Act of the Hague Agreement, which refers to consensus.

8.07 *AlternativeB* forArticle8(1)proposes aradically different method for determining the compositionoftheWIPOCoordinationCommittee.AlternativeBproposesde -linkingthe compositiontotheExecutiveCommitteesoftheParisandBerneUnionsandestablishing, instead, a simple numerical basis for the composition of the Coordination Committee (namely,one -fifthoftheStatespartytotheWIPOConvention).AlternativeBthus emphasizes the role of the Coordination Committee as an executive committee, as opposed to itsr oleasabodycoordinatingtheactivitiesofthevariousUnions.Thelatterroleseemstobe nolongernecessaryiftheWIPOGeneralAssemblyweretoactasaunitaryAssemblyforall WIPO-administeredtreaties.Ifthisconceptionwouldfindfavorwitht heWorkingGroup, and given that it is proposed that the General Assembly should meet in ordinary session onceayear(seeArticle6(4)(a)),thusensuringcoordinationamongthevariousUnions, considerationshould also be given to the possibility of chang ingthenameoftheCoordination Committeeto"ExecutiveCommittee."Itisproposedthatthequestionofremainders resultingfromdividingthetotalnumberofmembersofWIPObyone -fifthshouldbedealt withintheRulesofProcedureoftheCoordination Committee.

11.01 *Article11* hasbeenmodifiedinanendeavortoreflectthec urrentpracticeofthe Organizationofaunitarycontributionsystemandofhavingclassesofcontributiondifferent fromthosesetoutintheconstituenttreatiesoftheOrganizationandtheUnionsadministered bytheOrganization.Thosereformswereado ptedbythecompetentAssembliesin1989and 1991(forcertainchangesinclassesofcontribution)andin1993(fortheunitarycontribution systemandforfurtherchangestoclassesofcontribution).Afulldescriptionofthechangesin practiceisseto utindocumentWO/GA/WG -CR/2,paragraphs16to50.

11.02 *Article11(1)(a)* proposes a new enabling provision for the budget consequent upon the adoption of the unitary contribution system. The proposed provision seeks to implement the desire expressed by many delegations in the Working Group that, while the Organization has a unitary contribution system, it should not have a unitary budget in the sense that all income and expenses, regardless of the irsource or purpose, are mixed without identification. Accordingly, Article 11(1)(a) would require that the budget of the Organization be presented so that the income and expenses of the Organization and of the various Unions be indicated "inafair and transparent manner."

11.03 Theproposed newenabling prov ision would not affect the independent power of decision over relevant components of the budget that is exercised by the organs of the Organization and the various Unions. Thus, for example, the power to approve levels offees for the PCT would remain wit hthe membership of the PCT Union. This would be the case even if the WIPOG eneral Assembly were to act as a unitary Assembly, since the provisions concerning the alternative of a unitary Assembly provide for voting rights to be exercised in respect of matters concerning one Union only by the members of the General Assembly which are members of that Union (see the provisions in Article 6).

11.04 Thereferences in Article 11(1)(a) and(b) to "expenses common to the Unions" have been placed in square bracke ts for the Working Group to consider whether the yneed to be maintained, inview of the requirement proposed in Article 11(1)(a) that the budget of the Organization present in come and expenses of the Organization and the Unions administered by the Organization in a fair and transparent manner.
