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



Legal and Procedural Resources

- The Guide to the Hague System walks you through the various steps involved in the international registration of designs and includes background information and descriptions of Hague System procedures and requirements with relevant legal citations;
- Guidance on preparing and providing reproductions in order to forestall possible refusals on the ground of insufficient disclosure of an industrial design by examining Offices;
- Guidance on including multiple designs in an international application to avoid issues.



Main Features (1/2)

- One single international application to register up to 100 designs in 94 countries (at present);
- A unique mechanism for obtaining and managing design rights in multiple countries or regions through a single application, in a single language (English, French or Spanish) and paying a single set of fees, in only Swiss Francs;
- An international registration is equivalent to a series of national or regional registrations;
- Subsequent management of the international registration of designs (modifications, updates and renewals) is done in a single step through WIPO, saving more time and money.

Main Features (2/2)

- Schedule the publication date of your international registration among three options immediate publication, standard publication deadline of 12 months or publication at a chosen date to fit your business strategy, asking that the publication be done only when you are ready to market your design;
- Renew your international registration in selected or all the Contracting Parties initially designated, and for less or all the designs that the registration included, directly with WIPO;
- Wherever you may be and at any time, benefit from electronic communications sent either to you as holder or to your representative, keeping you informed of the status of your international registration.

Who can use the Hague System?

- Nationals of Contracting Parties (CPs) or of member states of IGOs that are CPs
- Anyone with a domicile or habitual residence in a CP
- Anyone with a real and effective industrial/commercial establishment in a CP

Particularities:

- ✓ The applicant does not need to have a basic design in that CP
- ✓ The applicant may designate its own CP for protection.
- ✓ Applicants located in CPs not yet members have their options to use the Hague System





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






Top 10 Designated Contracting Parties in 2021






Top Five Classes in 2021






Design count by Offices (Ghana, Namibia and Rwanda), from 2016/2020
