

Overview of the Guide to Intellectual Property for Startups (CDIP/28/INF/4)

The Latin American School of Intellectual Property (ELAPI) is convinced that the use of intellectual property (IP) by startups can generate decisive competitive advantages in the face of increasingly demanding consumers of products and services.
