Mandate and Objectives of the Organization

The University of São Paulo's Research Group on Access to Information Policies (GPOPAI) is a research center within the University of São Paulo committed to investigating intellectual property issues related to public policies for the access to information. It acts both as a scientific and public policy advisory institution and is funded by the University of São Paulo and other outside partners.

GPOPAI was established in 2005 as the main research center for investigating intellectual property policies in South America's largest university. Since then GPOPAI has acted both as a scientific and academic hub for intellectual property researchers and as a think tank and public policy advisor for different spheres of government.

GPOPAI-USP is co-coordinated by the University of São Paulo professors and is composed of associate researchers from different departments and colleges. The main task of coordinators is to give scientific direction to the research activity.

Both coordinators and members should meet regularly in plenaries to discuss the organization of work and define its academic and scientific priorities.

Admission of new members relies on the acceptance of the majority of its current members in one of its regular plenaries.

All GPOPAI-USP's scientific production and public policy recommendations are the collective responsibility of its members.

Fiscal and Law structure is provided by the University of São Paulo whose internal rules must be followed by all members.

Mandate and Objectives of the Organization

The British-Swiss Chamber of Commerce (BSCC) was founded in 1920 and is an independent not-for-profit organization dedicated to supporting its 700-plus Members and promoting business relations between Switzerland, Liechtenstein and the UK.
