Background: 35 U.S.C. § 171


Whoever invents any new, original and ornamental design for an article of manufacture may obtain a patent therefor, subject to the conditions and requirements of this title.




"The determination of whether the patented design is dictated by the function of the article of manufacture must ultimately rest on an analysis of its overall appearance."






Technology Center Structure





TC 2900 Organization Chart






Progress to Reduce Pendency

 - over half of design examiners have over three years of examining experience




Electronic Processing

- Electronic receipt of drawings and processing of applications will lead to improved quality of drawings










Electronic Processing: PAIR






Electronic Processing: PAIR

Geneva Act of the Hague Agreement

- On November 13, 2006, the Bush Administration submitted the Geneva Act of the Hague Agreement Concerning the International Registration of Industrial Designs to the United States Senate for ratification.
