

Budapest System

Why the Budapest Treaty on the International Recognition of the Deposit of Microorganisms for the Purposes of Patent Procedure ?

An invention must comply with patentability requirements.

Sufficiency of disclosure = An invention must be described in sufficient detail to enable a person skilled in the art to carry it out.

An invention that uses/concerns a new microorganism which is not yet publicly available may be difficult to be fully disclosed in a written form.


Deposit of the microorganism to a culture collection to compliment the written disclosure.

Budapest System – Main Features

One deposit with any of the International Depositary Authorities (IDAs) is recognized by all MSs of the Budapest Treaty

- Cost reduction for applicants
- ➢ IP offices can rely on IDAs
- Reduction of biosafety risks



Overall Total Deposits of Microorganisms per year (2017-2022)


