


Trinidad and Tobago's Economy

- Oil and Gas main export
- Organic chemicals
- Gross Domestic Product USD 23.9 Billion (2008)
- Exports USD 15.85 billion (2008)
- Population 1,337,684 (2008)

- Has one of the largest Gross Domestic Products in the Caribbean




Legislation

 "The rights conferred by a patent shall not extend to acts in respect of articles which have been put on the market in Trinidad and Tobago by the owner of the patent or with his consent"


Patents Act of Trinidad and Tobago 1996

Year




Breakdown of Patent Stats
