International Applications Published Without Classification

Encouraging creativity and innovation



Issue

- » Around 5-6% of international applications still being published without classification
 - · significant fluctuations over weeks
 - apparently down from high of 8-9% some weeks end 2007-start 2008, but still high
 - later classifications taking a long time to feed through system (typically >50% still have no classification in IB systems 6 weeks after publication)



Range of Problems

- » Preliminary analysis of 4 week publication sample shows unclassified publications:
 - from 28 receiving Offices, 10 ISAs
 - some where RO=ISA as well as RO≠ISA
 - some search copies received by ISA within 1 month of international filing date
 - a few search copies sent >1 year after filing



Record Copy vs. Search Copy

- » Most record copies (>80%) now sent electronically, but most search copies going to other Offices sent on paper
 - >20% of search copies received by ISA a month or more later than record copy received by IB
 - ▶ means of transmission is significant, but not only factor
 - small %age (but significant total number) received by ISA after international publication



Causes

- » Not fully clear no individual party has sufficient records to determine all causes
- » Main likely issues:
 - · general delays at RO
 - · general delays at ISA
 - · slow postal delivery of paper search copies
 - search copy delayed compared to record copy because of fee problems
 - late transfer to RO/IB under Rule 19.4
 - difficult formalities issues (e.g. "missing parts")



Possible Actions (1)

- » Improved processing at ROs/ISAs
 - for individual review not a collective issue
- » Increased use of electronic transfer of search copies
 - if difficulties in sending directly between pairs of Offices, could IB forward record copy to act as search copy? (probably requires change for all cases to be effective - if only for certain pairs, mistakes are too likely)



Possible Actions (2)

- » Sending documents earlier
 - Is it essential for search copy to wait until all formalities defects resolved?
 - probably risk of added subject matter not being spotted, especially in replacement sheets for drawings, if not sent to ISA; also particular issues of missing parts
 - Could search copy be sent before it was confirmed that search fee had been paid?
 - change in procedure for ROs and ISAs, but not necessarily added work (since fee checking often separate activity from preparation of record and search copies)



Possible Actions (3)

- » IB able to offer copy of application to ISA if requesting classification of case about to be published but not yet available to ISA?
- » Anything else?



Most Effective Actions

- » Uncertain since proportion of cases with different causes not known
 - · electronic transmission highly desirable anyway
 - earlier transmission of search copy may be desirable if many delays due to difficulties in confirming payment of search fee
- » Suggest detailed investigation into cases from a sample week
 - · data to be sought from RO, IB and ISA



Issues for Investigation

- » When did the cases move between different points?
 - ▶ date of receipt by RO/IB from non-competent RO
 - ▶ RO transmittal (i) to IB, (ii) to ISA
 - ► IB receipt
 - ► ISA receipt (is this often much later than by IB?)
- » Major issues involved
 - ▶ when (and from where) application transferred under Rule 19.4?
 - ▶ late fee payment or difficulties in confirming fee payment?
 - missing parts or other major issue? [information on why process took so long would be useful for review of system]
 - other common problems not yet appreciated?
