- 1. The International Bureau has received from the State Committee of Inventions and Discoveries of the USSR Council of Ministers the annexed additional response to its circular letter No. 2375.
- 2. This response indicates the willingness of a number of Departments in the Soviet Union to place at the disposal of developing countries one or two copies of technical periodicals covering various technological subjects.
- 3. The International Bureau has requested the State Committee of Inventions and Discoveries of the USSR Council of Ministers to provide a list of all the periodicals for the assistance of developing countries in selecting periodicals of particular interest to them.
