The way forward

- Developing a draft framework further
 - Agree on 'Areas of Learning'
 - Add topics
 - Define skill and knowledge elements
 - Agree on divisions within fields of learning (architecture)
- 2nd workshop (+donors) (May 2018)
- Testing draft framework
 - Describing courses/curricula to enable tracking
 - ZA examiner training
 - IR examiner training
 - WIPO Academy DL courses
 - RPEM courses?
 - **EPO** courses?
 -?
- Testing self-assessments of examiners of selected Offices (using LMS)
- PCT WG



Adding further elements

- Adding elements (in view of work required possibly only in some fields to be prioritized)
 - Researching resources to be screened to extract elements (cooperatively)
 - Screening resources for
 - Topical elements to be extracted
 - Suitable phrasings to improve/complement framework phrasing
- Reviewing of proposals (cooperatively)
 - Suggest further elements to be included/elements to be removed
 - Suggest alternative wordings/phrasings
 - Suggest if element is of basic character (mandatory)



Sources for identifying elements to be included

- Existing competency models/dictionaries/frameworks
 - IPET/RPET, IPA, IPONZ, IPOPHL,....
- Examination Guidelines
- Curricula
- Syllabi of specific courses of various providers
 - Descriptions of learning outcomes of specific learning units (e.g. WIPO DL308)
- Patent information: WIPO standards,...
- IPC Guide
- Help files of databases
 - Espacenet Resource Book
- E-learning resources
- Other guides/manuals of relevant topics (<u>WHO Guide Searching for Medicines</u>)
