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Diplomatic Conference to Conclude an International Legal Instrument Relating to Intellectual Property, Genetic Resources and Traditional Knowledge Associated with Genetic Resources

On July 21, 2022, the WIPO General Assembly decided to convene a Diplomatic Conference to conclude an International Legal Instrument Relating to Intellectual Property, Genetic Resources and Traditional Knowledge Associated with Genetic Resources no later than 2024.

The Diplomatic Conference will be preceded by the Special Session of the Intergovernmental Committee on Intellectual Property and Genetic Resources, Traditional Knowledge and Folklore from September 4 to 8, 2023 and by the Preparatory Committee of the Diplomatic Conference from September 11 to 13, 2023.







Scope of protection

- Seeks to determine
 - Which specific acts in respect of TK and TCEs should be prohibited/prevented
 - What specific rights should be granted to the beneficiaries of protection
- Different approaches and options present in both texts
 - "Rights-based" and/or "measures-based"
 - "Right to say no" and/or "right to be compensated"
 - "Economic" and "moral" types of rights
 - Tiered or differentiated approach
 - Approaches not necessarily mutually exclusive



The tiered or differentiated approach

Different kinds or levels of rights or measures would be available to rights holders depending on the nature and characteristics of the subject matter, the level of control retained by the beneficiaries and its degree of diffusion

- TK context: opportunity to respond to the reality of the differences amongst:
 - Secret TK
 - Narrowly diffused TK
 - Widely diffused TK
- TCEs context:
 - TCEs of particular spiritual or cultural value or significance
 - Secret TCEs
 - Other TCEs





- Member States may wish to consider
 - Which is the appropriate approach (for example: rights-based, measures-based or a combination)
 - The level of detail of provisions at the international level





Exceptions and limitations

- Both texts contain a number of alternatives that follow two approaches
 - Leave flexibility at the national level to fully regulate exceptions and limitations
 - Provide a framework with lists of general and specific exceptions for Member States to regulate at the national level
 - General exceptions
 - Test to be applied at the national level when developing limitations and exceptions / could include elements of the "classic" three-step test and moral-right components
 - Specific exceptions
 - Kinds of exceptions that should be allowed
- Member states may consider
 - Whether the provision on exceptions should follow a tiered approach





Term

- Different approaches in TK and TCEs texts
- TK text only one option that is linked to the scope and to the continuous fulfillment of criteria of eligibility
- TCEs text contains three options
 - Option 1: term of protection related to the eligibility criteria and provides an indefinite term for moral rights
 - Option 2: term of protection linked to the continuous enjoyment of the scope of protection
 - Option 3: only concerned with the duration of the economic aspects of TCEs, which are limited in time
- Member States may wish to consider
 - Whether the options in the TCEs text can be merged and whether a similar approach can be agreed on in both texts



Formalities

- TK and TCEs texts share some paragraphs and include some additional elements each
 - Both have options either requiring formalities or not
 - TK text: raises the possibility to maintain registers or records in the interest of transparency and conservation
 - TCEs text: in case of required formalities, this would not apply to secret TCEs
- Member States may wish to consider
 - The merit of applying the tiered approach when discussing formalities





Sanctions, remedies and exercise or rights

- Member States to put in place/adopt/provide measures to address violations of the rights / infringements / to ensure the application of the instrument
 - What kind of measures?
 - When should sanctions or remedies be applied?
 - What would be the role of the beneficiaries in this context, if any?
- TK and TCEs texts contain several different concepts
- Member States may wish to consider
 - Simplifying the provisions / providing a general framework, leaving the details to national legislation



Administration of rights

- Provision deals with how/by whom rights and interests should be administered
- Possibility to establish/designate a competent authority to administer the rights/interests provided for by this instrument
 - No agreement on the extent of participation of the beneficiaries: in consultation with / with the explicit consent of / in conjunction with / with the direct involvement and approval of / with the free, prior and informed consent of?
- Member States may wish to consider
 - The level of flexibility to be left at the national level to implement arrangements related to competent authorities

Transitional measures

- Consensus in both texts that the instrument should apply to all TK/TCEs which, at the moment of entry into force, fulfill the criteria of protection
- Drafting not identical
- Different options presented on the question of acquired rights of third parties
- Member States may wish to consider
 - Reconcile the different views and opt for the clearer expression of where agreement lies
 - Align the drafting of the paragraphs in the TK and TCEs texts



Relationship with international agreements

- Both texts share similar concepts
- The TK text includes a non-derogation clause as a separate article while a similar clause is included in the relationship with international agreements article in the TCEs text
- Member States may wish to consider
 - The placement of the non-derogation clause
 - The adoption of the same wording in both texts, to avoid confusion



National treatment

- The TK text, which includes three alternatives and the TCEs text differ slightly
- Member States may wish to consider
 - Making appropriate changes to ensure consistency





Transboundary cooperation

- Provision deals with issues of TK/TCEs shared across national borders
- Language similar but variations in terminology
- Member States may wish to consider
 - Agreeing on the most suitable formulation and harmonizing the provision in both texts





Capacity building and awareness raising

- This provision is only included in the TCEs text
- Member states may wish to consider
 - Including a provision on capacity building in the TK text as well or adopting a uniform approach to the issue
