





- Beadwork making in Maasai culture is purely a women business(Culture)
- What women are facing is the third party interference.
- High competitive markets (Mostly they are doing the traditional way while others are advancing to meet market targets and needs)
- Lack of women associations(specific target women affairs) hence individually, it exposes them to exploitation,

- Improve the beadwork industry, formation of indigenous women associations
- Explore other traditional untapped resources-(Bee Keeping-our current project)
- Documentation of the TCE and exploring other opportunities from other indigenous communities around the world
- Learnt a lot from WIPO training and hope to use the knowledge in improving our work in Kajiado.
