EURASIAN PATENT CONVENTION

Armenia

Armenia deposited its instrument of ratification of the Eurasian Patent Convention on 27 November 1995 and will become bound by that Convention on 27 February 1996. It will therefore be possible to designate Armenia for a Eurasian patent in a PCT application filed on or after 27 February 1996 (for further details on making designations for a Eurasian patent, see *PCT Newsletter* No. 11/1995, cover page).

EXTENSION OF EUROPEAN PATENTS TO ALBANIA – CORRIGENDUM

On the cover page of PCT Newsletter No. 12/1995, an announcement was made, based on information received from the Albanian authorities, that an agreement between the European Patent Organisation and Albania on the extension of the effects of European patent applications and patents to Albania entered into force on 3 November 1995. A Special Issue of the PCT Gazette (No. 01 /1996), containing general information on Contracting States, national and regional Offices and International Authorities, which was sent to subscribers to that publication, also makes reference to the possibility of extending European patents to Albania in Annexes B1 (AL), and B2 (EP), and National Phase, Summary (AL) and (EP).

We have now been informed that, although that agreement was signed on 3 November 1995, its date of entry into force has not yet been established. It is therefore not yet possible to

request the extension of a European patent to Albania. The date of entry into force will be announced in the PCT Newsletter when it is known.

STARTING OF OPERATIONS AT THE EURASIAN PATENT OFFICE

On 1 January 1996, the Eurasian Patent Office (EAPO) commenced operations. It is therefore now possible to file Eurasian patent applications direct with the EAPO, and nationals and residents of States which are members of both the Eurasian Patent Convention and of the PCT may now file PCT applications with the EAPO as receiving Office. making designations for a Eurasian patent in a PCT application, see *PCT Newsletter* No. 11/1995, cover page.

Those PCT Contracting States which are bound by the Eurasian Patent Convention as of 1 January 1996 are: Azerbaijan, Belarus, Kazakstan, Russian Federation, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan. The following PCT Contracting States will become bound by that Convention shortly: Kyrgyzstan (on 13 January 1996), the Republic of Moldova (on 16 February 1996) and Armenia (on 27 February 1996).

International applications may be filed with the EAPO in Russian or English. The EAPO as PCT receiving Office has specified as competent International Searching Authorities: the Russian Patent Office (for international applications filed in Russian or English) and the European Patent Office (EPO) (for international applications filed in English). The same Offices have also been specified as competent international Preliminary Examining Authorities (the EPO may only be chosen as International Preliminary Examining Authority for international applications for which it has carried out the search).

The following fees, payable to the EAPO as receiving Office, have been specified:

Transmittal fee, basic fee, supplement per sheet over 30, and

designation fee: See Table I(a)

Fee for priority

document: Equivalent in RUR of USD 10

The time limit for entering the national phase before the EAPO is 21 months (under PCT Article 22) or 31 months (under PCT Article 39(1)) from the priority date.

EXTENSION OF PCT APPLICATIONS TO SUCCESSOR STATES OF THE FORMER SOVIET UNION

It was announced in PCT Newsletter No.10/1995 that the first batch of notifications (Form PCT/IB/362) regarding extensions of the effects of international applications, under PCT Rule 32, to Armenia, Kyrgyzstan, Republic of Moldova, Tajikistan and Turkmenistan would be sent before the end of 1995. The text of the draft notifications has now been modified to take into account the 75% reduction of the fee payable for such extensions which will be available to certain applicants under the amended Schedule of Fees annexed to the PCT Regulations as from 1 January 1996. The mailing of those notifications is now expected to take place in February 1996.

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Confirmation of a precautionary designation for a regional patent

Q: On 3 January 1996, I filed an international application designating each of Belarus and the Russian Federation for a national patent. I used the July 1995 version of the request form and did not realize that, since 1 January 1996, it has also been possible to designate those States for a Eurasian patent. Is it possible for me now to designate those States also for a Eurasian patent? (I am not very familiar with the new system under the Eurasian Patent Convention)

A: Provided that the request form (PCT/RO/101) or computer-generated request which you used contains the necessary statement regarding precautionary designations under PCT Rule 4.9(b) (the statement is preprinted at the bottom of Box No. V of Form PCT/RO/101), you may file a notice of confir-

mation of the precautionary designation for a Eurasian patent of all States available for that kind of protection on the filing date of your international application. You must file the notice of confirmation with, and pay the designation fee and confirmation fee to, your receiving Office within 15 months from the priority date, or if there is no priority claim, within 15 months from the international filing date. Note that, when confirming the precautionary designation of a regional patent, you only need to pay one designation fee and one confirmation fee, even if two or more States are involved.

Since a Eurasian patent is always granted for all Contracting States of the Eurasian Patent Convention (EAPC), if you confirm the designation for a Eurasian patent you will automatically cover all those PCT Contracting States which were bound by the Eurasian Patent Convention on the filing date of your application, that is: Azerbaijan, Belarus, Kazakstan, Russian Federation, Tajikistan and Turkmenistan. Even though Armenia, Kyrgyzstan and the Republic of Moldova will become bound by the EAPC before the expiration of the 15-month time limit, the confirmed Eurasian patent designation will not include those States since they were not bound by the Eurasian Patent Convention at the time of filling your application.

EPO BOARD OF APPEAL DECISION CONCERNING PCT

Obligation to specify reasons why unity of invention requirement has not been fulfilled in view of PCT Search Guidelines

As indicated in the following headnotes, an EPO Technical Board of Appeal has decided that:

"I. An invitation to pay additional search fees fulfils the requirements of Rule 40.1 PCT only if substantiated in such a way as to indicate why unity is lacking, on the basis of the criteria laid down in the PCT Search Guidelines.

II. This is particularly the case where the unity of alternatives "of a similar nature" in a Markush claim is contested on the basis that they do not share a significant structural element [...]."


