PRACTICAL ADVICE

Payment of fees under Chapter II

Q: In a few weeks I plan to file a demand for international preliminary examination. When should the fees connected with filing the demand be paid? If I am unsure, because of fluctuations in exchange rates, of the amount payable, will I be sent an invitation to pay any missing amount?

A: There are two fees payable in respect of a demand for international preliminary examination, that is, the preliminary examination fee (PCT Rule 58) and the handling fee (PCT Rule 57); they are both payable direct to the International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA).

The amount of and due date for paying the preliminary examination fee are fixed by the IPEA. In the case of most IPEAs, the preliminary examination fee is due at the time of filing the demand. However, the Australian Patent Office and the Russian Patent Office require that the fee be paid only within one month from filing the demand. The PCT Applicant's Guide, Vol. I/B. Annex E. indicates for each IPEA the due date for paying the preliminary examination fee. The handling fee, which is fixed by the International Bureau, is due at the time of filing the demand, irrespective of the IPEA with which the demand is filed.

due date, or if they are not paid in full, the IPEA will invite you to pay the unpaid fee(s) within a time limit of one month from the date of the invitation. It is not possible to obtain any extension of that time limit.

If you pay the unpaid fee(s) within the one-month time limit, the fee(s) will be considered to

have been paid on the due date. If you do not pay the fee(s) within the time limit, the demand will be considered not to have been submitted, with the result that international preliminary examination will not be carried out on the international application and the effect of postponing the commencement of the national phase will be lost. In the latter case, if the demand was filed only a short time before the expiration of 19 months from the priority date, by the time the IPEA declares that the demand is considered not to have been submitted, the time limit for entering the national phase may have already expired. It is therefore very important to ensure that the fees payable under Chapter II are paid in time.



PCT STATISTICS – 1 January to 31 December 1996

The year 1996 saw the greatest increase in the number of international applications filed under the PCT since operations began in 1978. In 1996, the International Bureau of WIPO received 47,291 international applications, filed with PCT receiving Offices worldwide, which is 8,385 (21.6%) more than in 1995. The figure on page 2 shows the number of international applications received each year since 1978.

The 47,291 international applications received in 1996 had the effect of 1,330,058 national applications, and of 104,410 regional applications, which in turn had the effect of 1,326,795 applications for patent protection in the member States of the regional patent systems, that is, a total equivalent effect of 2,656,853 national applications.

The table below shows the top 10 countries of origin of those international applications. (Note that 15.3% of the applications received were filed with either the European Patent Office or the International Bureau as



PRACTICAL ADVICE

Omission of States from regional designations; States which can be designated only for the purposes of a regional patent

- Q: (a) If I do not wish to include certain States in a regional designation, is it possible to omit those States from that designation in the request form?
- (b) How do I find out which States party to a regional patent treaty cannot be designated also for a national patent?
- A: The characteristics of each regional patent system are different and each system should be treated separately. The above questions are answered below, under the headings of the four regional patents for the purposes of which it is presently possible to make designations under the PCT, and are also summarized in the form of a table, on page 6.

ARIPO patents (AP)

Designations for an ARIPO (African Regional Industrial Property Organization) patent have effect in States party to the Harare Protocol on Patents and Industrial Designs and to the PCT.

- (a) Provided that at least one State in respect of which it is possible to obtain an ARIPO patent is designated, any other State may be omitted from that designation, preferably by crossing out the name(s) of the State(s) concerned from the list which follows "AP" in Box No. V of the request form (PCT/RO/101).
- (b) Swaziland can only be designated for the purposes of an ARIPO patent it has "closed the national route" and cannot, therefore, be designated for the purposes of a national patent. All other PCT Contracting States which are also party to the Harare Protocol can be designated either for a national or an ARIPO patent, or both a national and an ARIPO patent.

Eurasian patents (EA)

Designations for a Eurasian patent have effect in States party to the Eurasian Patent Convention (EAPC) and to the PCT.

- (a) Any designation of one or more States for a Eurasian patent will be treated as a designation of all States which are party to both the EAPC and the PCT for the purposes of a Eurasian patent it is not possible to omit any State from the designation of a Eurasian patent.
- (b) All PCT Contracting States which are also party to the EAPC can be designated either for a national or a Eurasian patent, or both a national and a Eurasian patent.

Note that, even though, initially, a designation for a Eurasian patent must include all States party to the EAPC and the PCT, such States can be subsequently excluded from protection under the Eurasian patent by way of non-payment of annual fees in respect of those States after the grant of the Eurasian patent.

European patents (EP)

Designations for a European patent have effect in States party to the European Patent Convention (EPC) and to the PCT.

- (a) Provided that at least one State in respect of which it is possible to obtain a European patent is designated, any other State may be omitted from that designation, preferably by crossing out the name(s) of the State(s) concerned from the list which follows "EP" in Box No. V of the request form
- (b) The following PCT Contracting States which are also party to the EPC can only be designated for the purposes of a European patent: Belgium, France, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Monaco and the Netherlands they have "closed the national route" and cannot, therefore, be designated for the purposes of a national patent. All other States in respect of which is it possible to obtain a European patent can be designated either for a national or a European patent, or both a national and a European patent.

OAPI patents (OA)

OAPI (African Intellectual Property Organization) patents have effect in States party to the Bangui Agreement and to the PCT.

(a) Any designation of one or more States for an OAPI patent will be treated as a designation of all States which are party to both the Bangui Agreement and the PCT for the purposes of an OAPI patent - it is not

possible to omit any State from the designation of an OAPI patent.

(b) None of the PCT Contracting States which are also party to the Bangui Agreement can be designated for a national patent - they have "closed the national route" and can only be designated for an OAPI patent.

Important: Even though it is possible to omit States from designations for ARIPO patents and European patents, it is, nevertheless, strongly recommended to designate all States included in those designations since there are no additional costs associated with doing so - only one designation

fee must be paid during the international phase for each regional designation made under PCT Rule 4.9(a)(ii), independently of how many States are covered by each such designation. Also, making all available designations will give you the added flexibility to delay your choice as to the States in which you wish to proceed with your application until the time of entry into the regional phase concerned.

The table below indicates for each State, in respect of which it is possible to obtain a regional patent under the PCT, whether it can be omitted from the regional designation and whether it can (also) be designated for a national patent.

EPO: FEE REDUCTIONS AND NEW TIME LIMIT FOR PAYING DESIGNATION FEES, AS FROM 1 JULY 1997

The Administrative Council of the European Patent Organisation decided, on 5 December 1996, that there will be a reduction in the fee payable for an international search by the European Patent Office (EPO), and in certain fees payable upon entering the regional phase before the EPO (the basic national fee, the European search fee and the European designation fee).

The Council also decided that European designation fees will be payable within a time limit of six months from the date on which the European Patent Bulletin mentions the publication of the European search report. Note, however, that *Euro-PCT applications* (that is, PCT applications in which designations for a European patent are

made) are not affected by this change; in such cases, payment of European designation fees remain due within the time limit of 21 or 31 months from the priority date (or international filing date, where there is no priority claim).

The reduced amounts and new time limit for paying designation fees will apply *only* to payments made *from 1 July 1997*, including those made in respect of applications filed before that date, provided the applicable time limit has not expired, and the fee has not already been validly paid, before 1 July 1997. The reduced amounts, in DEM, are indicated on pages 3 and 4, above, under the headings "EP European Patent Office (fees)" and "Search fee (...European Patent Office...)," respectively.



PCT REQUEST AND DEMAND FORMS ON THE INTERNET

The English versions of the current request (Form PCT/RO/101) and demand (Form PCT/IPEA/401) forms are now available, in PDF format, on WIPO's Internet site at the address indicated above. The request and demand forms in other languages will be included at a later date.

ELECTRONIC FILING OF PCT APPLICATIONS

In an endeavor to facilitate and accelerate the process of filing international applications and other PCT-related papers, WIPO is currently investigating several ways of filing documents electronically.

One technique being investigated is the filing of international applications via the Internet, the use of which has expanded very rapidly over the past few years. Under such a filing system, for which some developmental work has been done by the United States Patent and Trademark Office, an applicant would log on to an Internet site and input the bibliographic data normally included in the request form using software which would include an interactive help system to answer questions and flag apparent errors. Electronic files containing the international application (including description, claims and drawings) would then be transmitted on-line to the receiving Office. The transmission would, of course, need to be secure and confidential; it is envisaged that the system would use commercially recognized, certified standards and systems for authentication and data protection.

In another project relating to electronic filing, an interactive software product for preparing international applications (and/or European applications) is being developed, in cooperation with the European Patent Office, under the "EASY" (Electronic Application SYstem) project. EASY would help applicants to provide the necessary information and check data for errors when the application is being prepared. The system is being designed so that applicants can ultimately decide by what means they want to actually file the application (on paper, on diskette or on-line).

Developments in respect of filing using the Internet, the EASY software, or any other form of

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Computer-generated request and demand forms

Q: My company is a regular user of the PCT. To enable us to simplify the process of completing the request and demand forms, we would like to generate our own forms by computer. We understand that it is permitted under the PCT to file the request and demand in the form of computer print-outs, but we would like guidelines to follow in their preparation.

A: A substantial increase has recently been observed in the number of computer-generated forms produced by applicants, patent attorney firms and commercial services.

PCT Rules 3.1 and 53.1 require, respectively, that the request and demand be made on printed forms or be *presented as computer* print-outs. In the latter case, those forms must comply with the requirements of Section 102(h) of the Administrative Instructions under the PCT, the text of which is reproduced in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. I/B, Annex J.

The aim of those requirements is to ensure that the request and demand forms, as computer print-outs, resemble very closely, in layout and content, the printed versions of the request and demand forms which are promulgated under the PCT Regulations. Using a consistent format makes it easier to identify and understand the contents of the forms irrespective of which language is used (for example, during data capture by PCT Offices and Authorities).

When preparing computer-generated forms, you should take particular care to:

- in the request, ensure that all the countries that are included in Box No. V ("Designation of States") of the current version of the form are included in your computer-generated version, and that the country codes indicated in the latter are correct; if any State becomes bound by the PCT after the issuance of the current request form, the name of that State (together with its two-letter country code, if known to you) should be included in the space where dotted lines presently appear in the area reserved for that purpose at the foot of the right-hand column of designations in Box No. V.
- in the request, ensure that the text at the very bottom of Box No. V of the form effecting "precautionary designations" is included in your computer-generated version (to make sure that your company will benefit, if necessary, from the precautionary designation system under PCT Rule 4.9(b));
- in the demand, ensure that the check-box in Box No. V ("Election of States") of the form is pre-marked (to protect the applicant from omitting to elect any eligible States).

In addition to complying with the requirements mentioned above, it is recommended that you:

- include on all pages of the computergenerated versions of each form, in the bottom margin of each page, the date of issuing or reprinting that appears at the bottom of the printed version of the form (the current version is dated January 1997);
- include an indication identifying the source of the forms (preferably the name of your company), so as to allow staff of the receiving Office, the International Preliminary Examining Authority and the International Bureau to readily distinguish your versions from those produced by the International Bureau; this indication should be placed on each page, either on the same line as and next to the date, or immediately below the date.

Under Section 102 (h) of the Administrative Instructions under the PCT, you have the possibility of omitting explanatory notes printed in italics. This will, of course, enable you to gain space in the boxes. However, if you are filing with the United States Patent and Trademark Office as receiving Office, that Office recommends that you do **not** remove those notes which appear in Box Nos. II and III and the Supplemental Box of the request, so far as those notes relate to the question of residence of the applicant (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 11/1996, cover page).

You should always ensure that computergenerated versions of the request and demand forms, whether prepared by your company or obtained from an outside supplier, include all changes which have been included in the current versions of the forms (updated versions are normally issued twice a year, in January and July; the last page of each issue of the PCT Newsletter indicates the date of issue of the current versions). As a precaution, as from the issuance of an updated version, superseded versions of the forms should be removed from your computer system.

The International Bureau will be pleased to advise you whether your proposed computer-generated forms comply with the general requirements as to layout, but is not in a position to proofread such forms for their detailed contents. Responsibility for the accuracy of forms presented as computer print-outs, in matters of detail, including incorporation of modifications, necessarily rests with the applicants concerned.

As indicated on the cover page, the request and demand forms, in English, are now available in PDF format on WIPO's Internet site; forms in other languages will be available on the Internet at a later date. The International Bureau is also currently investigating several ways of filing documents (including the request form) electronically; see cover page for details.

NEW PCT CONTRACTING STATES

Zimbabwe (country code: ZW)

Zimbabwe deposited its instrument of accession to the PCT on 11 March 1997, and will become bound by the PCT on 11 June 1997. Therefore, in any international application filed on or after 11 June 1997, Zimbabwe may be designated and, because it will be bound by Chapter II of the PCT, may also be elected. Furthermore, as from 11 June 1997, nationals and residents of Zimbabwe will be entitled to file international applications under the PCT.

Since Zimbabwe is party to the Harare Protocol within the framework of the African Regional Industrial Property Organization (ARIPO), it will also be possible to designate Zimbabwe for the purposes of obtaining an ARIPO patent. Any designation in an international application for an ARIPO patent will, as from 11 June 1997, automatically include the designation of Zimbabwe for that purpose.

Sierra Leone (country code: SL)

Sierra Leone deposited its instrument of accession to the PCT on 17 March 1997, and will become bound by the PCT on 17 June 1997. Therefore, in any international application filed on or after 17 June 1997, Sierra Leone may be designated and, because it will be bound by Chapter II of the PCT, may also be elected. Furthermore, as from 17 June 1997, nationals and residents of Sierra Leone will be

entitled to file international applications under the PCT.

Note that, although Sierra Leone is a member State of ARIPO (the African Regional Industrial Property Organization), it is not also party to the Harare Protocol within the framework of ARIPO; therefore, it will not be possible to designate Sierra Leone for the purposes of obtaining an ARIPO patent.

MEETING OF INTERNATIONAL AUTHORITIES UNDER THE PCT

The Meeting of International Authorities under the PCT (PCT/MIA) held its sixth session in Canberra from February 17 to 21, 1997. The session was [continued on page 2]

attended by representatives of all Offices which act as International Searching Authorities (ISAs) and/or International Preliminary Examining Authorities (IPEAs), as well as by representatives of the International Bureau. The following matters were discussed:

Nucleotide and/or amino acid sequence listings: development of a common standard for the presentation of nucleotide and/or amino acid sequence listings which, once adopted, would be acceptable to all PCT Authorities and designated/elected Offices; it is envisaged that any language-dependent text in a sequence listing be permitted to be in English, whatever language is used in the body of the description.

Microbiological inventions: possible amendment of PCT Rule 13bis to replace the term "microorganism" by "biological material."

Demand for international preliminary examination: possibility under the PCT Regulations of

- providing for an extension of the present 19-month time limit for filing a demand;
- introducing a late payment fee for the benefit of the IPEA, for cases of late payment of the handling fee and/or the preliminary examination fee;
- providing for a procedure under which a demand filed with a non-competent IPEA (or filed erroneously with a receiving Office, an ISA or the International Bureau) would be transmitted to the competent IPEA without loss of its original date of receipt (similar to the procedure provided for in PCT Rule 19.4 where the international application itself is filed with a non-competent receiving Office).

Confidential nature of the international preliminary examination: possibility of a more liberal interpretation of PCT Article 38(1), whereby access to the file of the international preliminary examination by elected Offices would not be interpreted as being limited exclusively to the elected Offices themselves; in any elected Office whose applicable national Law makes

application files publicly accessible, the international preliminary examination report, and anything in the international preliminary examination file, could become part of the file of that Office and could be subject to public inspection to the same extent as the rest of that file.

PCT Search Guidelines: possible modifications on the basis of the Common Ground Rules for International Search agreed upon by the European Patent Office, the Japanese Patent Office and the United States Patent and Trademark Office in the course of their trilateral cooperation.

PCT Preliminary Examination Guidelines: possible modifications with a view to ensuring that they remain a useful tool for examiners in all IPEAs.

Other matters which were discussed included:

- renewal of the Agreements under which the ISAs and IPEAs carry out their functions;
- practice of International Authorities for international search and preliminary examination of international applications containing large numbers of sequence listings;
- questions relating to search in the case of a disproportionate number of claims or extremely broad, vague and/or imprecise claims;
- possible changes regarding payment of additional search and preliminary examination fees where lack of unity of invention is found;
- use of the Internet during international search and preliminary examination; and
- the impact that electronic transmission of documents (including international applications and international search reports) would have on the PCT procedure.

FIRST PAGE OF ALL PCT PAMPHLETS PUBLISHED BETWEEN 1978 AND 1996 AVAILABLE ON CD-ROM

The European Patent Office's (EPO) ESPACE-FIRST collection of CD-ROMs contains more than half a million facsimile first pages of PCT and EPO applications, including the abstract, drawing, and searchable bibliographic data. The EPO has recently included the backlog of applications published between 1978 and 1987, with the result that the collection now covers all the PCT and European applications from the beginning of operations in 1978 to 1996. The EPO is offering, for a limited period, the ESPACE-FIRST backlog at a special price. For users who already have the ESPACE-FIRST series 1988 to 1996, the price for the 1978 to 1987 backlog is DEM 1,000 (instead of DEM 1,750). The price for the complete collection from 1978 to 1996 is DEM 4,990 (instead of DEM 6,160).

The price for a subscription to the 1997 ESPACE-FIRST collection (published bimonthly) is DEM 490 (plus, for postage and packaging, DEM 50 in Europe or DEM 90 outside Europe).

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Waivers made by designated/elected Offices relating to the communication of the international application and other documents by the International Bureau

Q: I recently received from the International Bureau the pamphlet containing my published international application, accompanied by a notice informing me of the communication of the international application to the designated Offices (Form PCT/IB/308). On that form there is a list of designated Offices which have not been sent a copy of that pamphlet by the International Bureau because, as the form says, they "have waived the requirement for such a communication at this time." Why do some Offices make such a waiver? Are there any consequences as to the actions the applicant is required to take, for example, if an Office needs a copy of the international application during the course of the national phase before that Office? Does such a waiver exist for any other PCT documents and/or forms?

A: Many Offices, in their capacity as designated Offices, have waived the requirement that they be sent a copy of every PCT pamphlet containing the published international application and the international search report or, if no international search report is established, the declaration referred to in PCT Article 17(2)(a)). PCT Article 20(1)(a) states that the international application shall be communicated to each designated Office "unless the designated Office waives such requirement in its entirety or in part." Many designated Offices have also waived receipt of certain other documents and forms which would otherwise be sent to them by the International Bureau during the international phase, in particular:

- the notification of designation (Form PCT/IB/355) (see PCT Rule 47.1(a-bis));

and, in their capacity as elected Offices:

- the notification of election (Form PCT/IB/331) (see PCT Article 31(7));
- a copy of the international preliminary examination report (PCT/IPEA/409) (see PCT Article 36(3)(a)).

Those Offices have waived receipt of some or all of the above-mentioned documents and forms in order to reduce an ever-increasing administrative effort and minimize storage requirements. They have decided, instead, to receive such communications only upon their specific request in relation to particular international applications, after performance by the applicant of the necessary acts for entering the national phase of processing.

The increasing number of designated/elected Offices making such waivers results, particularly, from the continuing growth in the filing of international applications, which, in turn, results in any particular State being designated in an increasing number of applications. Another factor which contributes to States being increasingly designated is that many applicants take advantage of the possibility to designate all, or almost all, PCT Contracting States while only paying 11 designation fees, which enables them to delay the choice of States in which they wish to proceed with the application until the time of entry into the national phase.

Since designated/elected Offices only require documents and forms in respect of international applications which actually enter the national phase before them, the processing and filing of large quantities of documents and forms relating to international applications in which they were designated, but in respect of which applicants do not wish to enter the national phase, is a wasted effort. The administrative burden is particularly heavy in Offices with a low percentage of applications entering the national phase. For example, in 1995, in 16 designated/elected Offices, less than 1% of the applications in which those States were designated/elected actually entered the national phase; if those Offices had not made any waiver, the work relating to 99% of the applications would have been superfluous.

As far as copies of priority documents are concerned, they cannot be the subject of a waiver by the designated Offices – on the

contrary, Offices do not receive copies of priority documents unless they have made a specific request to do so. For reasons similar to those mentioned above relating to other documents and forms, many designated/ elected Offices have chosen not to receive copies of priority documents automatically, but to request them from the International Bureau only when necessary.

The fact that Offices have waived the requirement to receive pamphlets and international preliminary examination reports by no means restricts their access to those documents since they will continue to have the right to specifically request copies of the documents from the International Bureau. In addition, the information contained in all PCT pamphlets can always be obtained easily by the Offices through the use of the CD-ROM workstations and CD-ROMs provided to them, free of charge, by the International Bureau; information concerning applications, as well as the abstracts and bibliographic data, is also published in the PCT Gazette, which is sent to them, free of charge, by the International Bureau, in addition to the CD-ROMs.

Although many designated/elected Offices have waived the requirement to receive, respectively, notifications of designation and election, such forms are usually only required by them for statistical purposes, and their non-receipt does not, in any case, affect the processing of the international application.

If any of the designated/elected Offices which have waived the requirement to receive the pamphlet, international search report and/or international preliminary examination report decides that it wishes to see any of those documents, applicants are not **required to furnish such copies to them** – the designated/elected Offices should request the documents from the International Bureau. Provided that the requirements of PCT Rule 17 have been complied with, the applicant is similarly not required to furnish any designated/elected Office with a copy of the priority document, except where it requires the furnishing of a copy together with a certified translation thereof (see PCT Rule 17.2(a)).

Note, however, that local agents may ask applicants to provide copies of the abovementioned documents for their own files. For

further details on what the applicant should or should not have to furnish to the designated/elected Offices, see *PCT Newsletter* No. 08/1996.

The table in the center of this issue shows which designated/elected Offices have made a waiver, and the type of documents in respect of which those waivers have been made. The table also includes a list of designated Offices which do not receive copies of priority documents.

BRAZIL: "PIPELINE" PROTECTION

We remind PCT users that due to changes introduced in Brazil's new industrial property law (No. 9279), portions of which came into effect on 15 May 1996, it is possible to expedite patent protection for certain types of inventions and on certain conditions, by taking advantage of the provisions concerning "pipeline" protection.

Article 229 of the new law, which applies to pending applications, exempts certain subject matter from patentability, stating that inventions in those subject matter areas will only be patentable subject to the conditions set out in Articles 230 and 231 of the law (the provisions which delineate the process for obtaining and for the scope of pipeline protection). The following subject matter is affected:

- (a) substances, matter or products obtained by chemical means or processes;
- (b) foodstuffs;
- (c) pharmaceutical substances, matter, compounds or products and medicines of any type;
- (d) corresponding processes for obtaining or modifying categories (b) and (c).

In general, an applicant who has a pending patent application relating to the subject matter mentioned in Article 230 may file a new application with the Brazilian National Institute of Industrial Property (INPI), within the period of one year from the publication of the new law (that is, until 14 May 1997), for a patent under the conditions established in Article 230, and submit evidence of the relinquishment of the pending application (Article 230, paragraph 5). Note that other conditions also apply, including, for example, that the subject matter of the invention must not have been placed on the

market anywhere in the world on the direct initiative of the owner or by third parties with his consent and that third parties must not have carried out in Brazil serious and effective preparations for exploiting the subject matter of the invention prior to the date the application for the pipeline patent is filed in Brazil (Article 230).

PCT applicants who have pending international applications which contain the designation of Brazil and who wish to take advantage of pipeline protection in Brazil must, before 14 May 1997:

- (1) file with INPI an application in accordance with Articles 230 and 231 (with the text of the application in Portuguese);
- (2) pay the required fee (currently set at USD 10,000); and
- (3) inform INPI by letter, submitted through his representative in Brazil, that the applicant relinquishes the right to enter the national phase in Brazil in relation to the designation of Brazil contained in the earlierfiled international application.

According to the new law, once the legal formalities have been met, upon evidence that the patent was granted in the country in which the first application was filed, the patent will be granted by INPI in the same manner as it was granted in the country of origin (Article 230, paragraph 3). The granted patent shall "enjoy the remaining term of protection in the country of first application beginning with the date of filing in Brazil and limited to the term of protection laid down in Article 40" (20 years from the filling date) (Article 230, paragraph 4).



PCT STATISTICS

1 January to 31 March 1997

During the first three months of 1997, the International Bureau of WIPO received 12,042 international applications filed with PCT receiving Offices worldwide, representing an increase of 15.9% over the same period in 1996.

The number of demands for international preliminary examination filed under Chapter II during the same period amounted to 10,011, representing an increase of 26.5% over the same period last year.

Greatest monthly total of international applications received at the International Bureau

During the month of April 1997, the International Bureau of WIPO received 5,339 international applications filed with PCT receiving Offices worldwide, which is 1,398 more than the monthly average for last year. PRACTICAL ADVICE

Withdrawal of the priority claim to postpone entry into the national phase

Q: I filed a demand for international preliminary examination of an international application whose filing date is 6 September 1996 and which claims the priority of one earlier application, filed on 12 September 1995. Unfortunately, the demand was received by the International Preliminary Examining Authority only on 15 April 1997, three days after the expiration of 19 months from the priority date, with the effect that the time limit for entry into the national phase is not extended from 20 to 30 months from the priority date.

- (1) If I withdraw my priority claim, will the 19-month time limit for filing the demand be recalculated, with the effect that I can delay entry into the national phase until 30 months from the international filing date?
- (2) If the 19-month time limit for filing the demand is not recalculated, will I nevertheless receive the international preliminary examination report?
- A: (1) According to PCT Rule 90*bis*.3(a), an applicant may withdraw a priority claim at any time prior to the expiration of 20 months from the priority date (or, where PCT Article 39(1) applies, 30 months from the priority date). You may therefore withdraw the priority claim, provided the written notice of withdrawal reaches the receiving Office or the International Bureau prior to the expiration of 20 months from the priority date, that is, by 12 May 1997.

Withdrawing the priority claim would not, however, reinstate the 19-month time limit for filing the demand which must be met in order for entry into the national phase to be postponed until 30 months from the priority date, or any other time limit which has already expired. PCT Rule 90bis.3(d) states that, where the withdrawal of a priority claim causes a change in the (earliest) priority date, any time limit which is computed from the original priority date and

which has not already expired will be recomputed from the (new) priority date resulting from that change; in your case, the latter date would be the same as the international filing date.

On the other hand, the withdrawal of the priority claim would cause the (as yet unexpired) time limit for entering the national phase under Chapter I to be recalculated. Your new time limit for entering the national phase under Chapter I would become 20 months from the international filing date (there being no longer any priority claim and no timely filed demand which would postpone national phase entry under Chapter II), that is 6 May 1998.

Before withdrawing your priority claim, however, you must consider the *consequences that such withdrawal will have on the assessment of novelty and inventive step in the light of the relevant prior art,* which would then include anything published before the international filing date. You may, after considering this factor, prefer to maintain your priority claim rather than to extend the time limit for entry into the national phase.

(2) Even if a demand is filed after the 19-month time limit, an international preliminary examination report (IPER) will still be established and the IPER will be sent to you and to the elected Offices. In the present case, if you decide to withdraw the priority claim, the IPER should reach you prior to entry into the national phase under Chapter I since, according to PCT Rule 69.2(ii), the time limit for establishing the IPER is nine months from the start of the international preliminary examination if the demand was filed after the expiration of 19 months from the priority date. The time limit for establishing the IPER should, therefore, be around 15 January 1998, well before the expiration of the newly calculated 20-month time limit. (You may wish to check with the International Preliminary Examining Authority whether preliminary examination has started, and if it has not started, when it will start.)



PRACTICAL ADVICE

Lack of unity of invention: payment of additional search fees under protest; consequences of non-payment of additional search fees

Q: The International Searching Authority which is carrying out the search on my international application, having found that my application contains five inventions and thus does not meet the requirement of unity of invention, has sent me an invitation to pay four additional search fees.

I agree with their finding that my application contains more than one invention, but I disagree with the number of additional search fees which I have been requested to pay.

- (1) Is there any mechanism under the PCT for challenging the number of additional search fees requested?
- (2) What will happen to my application if I do not pay all the additional search fees?

A (1) Where the International Searching Authority (ISA) finds that an application does not comply with the requirement of unity of invention (for details of that requirement, see PCT Rule 13 and Annex B of the PCT Administrative Instructions) and invites the applicant to pay additional fees (see PCT Article 17(3)(a)), the applicant, if in disagreement with the finding of lack of unity of invention, may protest against that finding, or if he considers that the number of additional search fees he has been invited to pay is excessive, may protest against the number of additional search fees to be paid. To do so, the fees concerned must be paid within the time limit which the ISA fixed in the invitation to pay additional fees (Form PCT/ISA/206) (see PCT Rule 40.2(c)) and must be accompanied by a reasoned statement explaining why the applicant considers that those parts of the international application, for which he does not agree with the payment of additional search fees, comply with the requirement of unity of invention, and why, therefore, the number of additional fees required is excessive.

Where the applicant has paid additional search fees under protest, the ISA will review the justification for the invitation to pay additional fees. To the extent that the applicant's protest is found to be justified, the additional search fees will be totally or partially reimbursed. The applicant is notified of the decision on the protest by way of Form PCT/ISA/212.

Note that, where the ISA is the Chinese Patent Office or the European Patent Office, the review procedure may consist of two levels: a prior review of the justification for the invitation to pay additional search fees, followed by a formal examination of the protest. After the prior review, the ISA may require the applicant to pay a fee for the examination of the protest (the "protest fee"), the amount of which is indicated in the PCT Applicant's Guide, Vol. I/B, Annex D. The protest fee must be paid within one month from the date of the notification to the applicant of the result of the prior review. That fee will be refunded to the applicant only where the protest is found to be entirely justified. If the protest fee is not paid, the protest will be considered withdrawn.

The applicant may request that the texts of the protest and the decision thereon be notified by the International Bureau to the designated Offices, together with the international search report (see PCT Rule 40.2(c)). In that case, some designated Offices may require the applicant to furnish a translation of those texts together with the translation of the international application required under PCT Article 22, upon entry into the national phase.

(2) If no or only some of the additional search fees requested are paid within the time limit fixed in the ISA's invitation (Form PCT/ISA/206), the international search report will contain the results of the search only for those claims in respect of which search fees have been paid. It is important to note that, if a demand for international preliminary examination is subsequently filed, the International Preliminary Examining Authority need not examine any claims relating to unsearched inventions.

Non-payment of an additional search fee in respect of any claim or group of claims does not, in itself, amount to any abandonment of the claim or claims concerned during the international phase; the processing of the international application, including its communication to the designated Offices, will continue in respect of all claims.

However, the national law of any designated State may provide that, where the national Office of that State finds the invitation of the ISA to pay additional search fees justified, and where the applicant has not paid all additional fees, those parts of the international application which have not been searched will, as far as effects in that State are concerned, be considered withdrawn in the national phase, unless a special fee is paid by the applicant to the national Office of that State (see PCT Article 17(3)(b)). A few Offices (for example, the Swedish Patent Office) apply such provisions; for details, see the corresponding parts of the National Chapters of the PCT Applicant's Guide, Vol. II. A number of designated Offices may, instead of requesting a special fee, require the applicant to restrict the application to one invention or to divide the application into a corresponding number of divisional applications.



SPAIN TO BE BOUND BY CHAPTER II

Spain will become bound by Chapter II of the PCT on 6 September 1997 following the withdrawal of its declaration under PCT Article 64(1)(a) on 6 June 1997. When Spain becomes bound by Chapter II, all PCT Contracting States will then be bound by Chapter II.

The effect of Spain becoming bound by Chapter II will be that, on and after 6 September 1997, and irrespective of whether the international application was filed before, on or after that date:

- nationals and residents of Spain will be entitled to file demands for international preliminary examination of their international applications;
- Spain may be elected in a demand for international preliminary examination, or by way of a notice effecting a later election, in respect of an international application in which it is designated.

Where Spain has been designated for a national patent, the election of Spain (whether in the demand or in a notice effecting a later election) will postpone entry into the national phase before the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office until 30 months from the priority date, provided, of course, that the election of that State is made prior to the expiration of 19 months from the priority date.

Where Spain has been designated for a European patent and a demand is filed before 6 Sep-

tember 1997 (and within 19 months from the priority date) electing at least one other State party to the European Patent Convention for a European patent, the regional phase before the European Patent Office will be postponed in respect of all the designations for a European patent (including that of Spain) and no later election of Spain for a European patent will be required.

A demand filed on or after 6 September 1997 in respect of an international application containing the designation of Spain will, if the current version of the printed demand form is used, automatically include the election of that State unless the applicant specifically excludes it.

A notice of later election of Spain must be filed with the International Bureau. If it is received before 6 September 1997, and provided that the

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19th month from the priority date does not expire before 6 September 1997, the notice will be considered as having been received on 6 September 1997.

HONG KONG: NOTIFICATION BY THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

The Government of the People's Republic of China has informed the Director General of WIPO as follows:

"In accordance with the Joint Declaration of the Government of the People's Republic of China and the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland on the Question of Hong Kong signed on 19 December 1984, the People's Republic of China will resume the exercise of sovereignty over Hong Kong with effect from 1 July 1997. Hong Kong will, with effect from that date, become a Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China and will enjoy a high degree of autonomy, except in foreign and defence affairs which are the responsibilities of the Central People's Government of the People's Republic of China.

"The Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT) of June 19, 1970, as amended on September 28, 1979 and February 3, 1984 (hereinafter referred to as the 'PCT'), to

which the Government of the People's Republic of China deposited its instrument of accession on October 1, 1993, will apply to the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region with effect from 1 July 1997. The Government of the People's Republic of China also makes the following declarations:

- "1. The designation of China in any international PCT application filed on or after July 1, 1997, shall also cover the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China.
- "2. The modalities of 'entering the national phase' under Article 22 and Article 39 of the PCT as far as international applications filed on or after July 1, 1997, and designating China are concerned, will be communicated to the Director-General of the World Intellectual Property Organization not later than by the end of the current year (that is, by December 31, 1997).

"The Government of the People's Republic of China will assume responsibility for the international rights and obligations arising from the application of the Treaty to the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region."

the applicant receives, together with the international search report/international preliminary examination report, a copy of each document cited therein free of charge. In other cases, the fee is as follows:

for patent document,

per page: RUR 2,000 or USD 0.30

for non-patent

document, per page: RUR 8,000 or USD 0.30

There has also been a change in the conditions and extent of refunds given by that Office as International Searching Authority, where the international search report is based on an earlier international or international-type search, as follows:

- no supplementary search performed: refund of 75%;
- supplementary search performed in documentation relating to one or two additional IPC subgroups: refund of 50%:
- supplementary search performed in documentation concerning a new aspect of the invention claimed (for instance, the international application is based on several earlier applications only one of which was the subject of an international or international-type search): refund of 25%.

The following fee, payable to that Office as International Preliminary Examining Authority, has also changed:

PCT Applicant's Guide update sheets

The next half-yearly set of update sheets for the *PCT Applicant's Guide* (dated July 1997) is under preparation. Pink provisional sheets obtained from previous issues of the *PCT Newsletter* this year (Nos. 01-06/1997), which have been inserted in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, should be removed from the *Guide* and replaced by the July 1997 update sheets when they are received.

Bosnia and Herzegovina, Ghana and Yugoslavia: note that general information about BA Bosnia and Herzegovina, GH Ghana and YU Yugoslavia as Contracting States, information of interest if those States are designated (or elected), information on the Institute for Standardization, Metrology and Patents of Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Registrar General's Department of Ghana and the Federal Intellectual Property Office of Yugoslavia as receiving Offices and summaries of requirements for entry into the national phase in those States are included in the July 1997 update sheets of the PCT Applicant's Guide (see Vol. I/A, Annex B1 (BA), (GH) and (YU); Vol. I/B, Annex C (BA), (GH) and (YU); Vol II/A, National Chapters, Summary (BA) and (GH) and Vol. II/C, National Chapter, Summary (YU)).

The July 1997 update sheets for the *PCT Applicant's Guide* will be added to the *PCT Applicant's Guide* on WIPO's Internet site shortly.

CHANGE AFFECTING COMPOSITION OF US PRIORITY DOCUMENTS

In order to reduce the time required for processing requests for certified copies of

patent applications, the USPTO has introduced certain changes in its practice.

One such change is the move from microfilming national patent applications to optically scanning them. Under the old system, an application was microfilmed after all the required parts of it had been received; the certified copy of that application, therefore, typically included a copy of the oath or declaration of the inventor required under US national law. Under the new system, an application is scanned as soon as it is found to meet the minimum requirements for granting a filing date; this may take place before any oath or declaration is received. As a result of this change, PCT applicants claiming the priority of a recently filed US national application may notice that the certified copy of that earlier application (priority document) supplied by the USPTO may or may not include a copy of the oath or declaration, depending on when the oath or declaration was filed with the Office and on whether the application was scanned or microfilmed. The USPTO assures applicants that the inclusion or non-inclusion of the oath or declaration with the priority document does not affect the priority claim.

For further details, see the USPTO Official Gazette (1199 OG 38 of 10 June 1997).

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Parts of the request form missing upon filing the international application

Q: What are the consequences if part of the request form is missing at the time of filing of an international application, for example, if a fax machine malfunctions and does not transmit all sheets, or if the sheets are received by the receiving Office but are only partially legible?

A: Where the applicant has attempted to transmit a document by fax, but part of the document is not received, or is received but is illegible, the document will be treated as not having been received to the extent that the received document is illegible or that the attempted transmission failed (see PCT Rule 92.4(c)). Before discussing the consequences of this in the case where the request form is sent to the receiving Office by fax, reference is made to the "Practical"

advice" section in *PCT Newsletter* No. 11/1996, which discussed the question of whether drawings which were missing from an international application could be filed later without affecting the international filing date. Similar considerations as to later filed sheets apply in the case of missing parts of the description or claims (see PCT Rule 20.2).

As far as the request form is concerned, the situation is somewhat different: what is most important is that those parts of the request form which are actually received by the receiving Office contain sufficient information for an international filing date to be accorded. The indications which are required under PCT Article 11 for the according of an international filing date, and which should be included in the request form, are:

- an indication that the application is intended to be an international application (the statement "The undersigned requests that the present international application be processed according to the Patent Cooperation Treaty" is indicated at the top left-hand corner of the first page of the request form) (see PCT Article 11(1)(iii)(a) and Rule 4.2);
- the name of the applicant (Box Nos. II and III) (see PCT Article 11(1)(iii)(c) and Rule 20.4(b));
- the necessary indications of the applicant's nationality and residence, noting that at least one applicant must have the right to file the international application with the receiving Office (Box Nos. II and III) (see PCT Article 11(1)(i) and Rules 18 and 19);
- the specific designation of at least one PCT Contracting State (Box No. V) (see PCT Article 11(iii)(b) and Rule 4.9(a)).

Of course, in addition to the above-mentioned requirements, the other requirements of PCT Article 11 must also be fulfilled if an international filing date is to be accorded, notably, the application must include a description and a claim or claims and must to be in an admitted language (see PCT Article 11(1)(ii) and (iii)(d) and (e) and Rule 12.1).

It is also important that any priority claim, although not necessary for the according of an international filing date, be included at the time of filing since a priority claim cannot be added later, and if a priority claim is incomplete or erroneous, there are only limited possibilities for correction (see PCT Rule 4.10 (b) and (c) and *PCT Newsletter* Nos. 03 and 05/1994).

The following information which is also usually given in the request form can, if necessary, be furnished later, without affecting the international filing date:

- the title of the invention (Box No. I);
- the indication of (further) applicants or inventors (continuation of Box No. III);
- the name and address of an agent (Box No. IV);
- the specific designation of further States, by way of confirming precautionary designations under PCT Rule 4.9(b) (provided, however, that the request as filed contained the necessary statement regarding precautionary designations as required by PCT Rule 4.9(b); such statement is preprinted in Box No. V);
- the choice of International Searching Authority and details of any earlier search (Box No. VII);
- the indications in the check list (Box No. VIII);
- the signature of the applicant or agent (Box No. IX).

Therefore, depending on which indications are missing, it may even be possible to furnish, later, sheets of the request form which were missing in their entirety at the time of filing, provided that enough indications were present in the originally filed papers to enable an international filing date to be accorded, as explained above.

Even if certain indications required for the according of an international filing date are missing from the request form, it can happen that they are furnished with the application in some other way (such as in an accompanying letter). In such a case, it may still be possible for a filing date to be accorded, although the applicant would then be requested to furnish properly completed pages of the request form to ensure compliance with the formal requirements of the PCT Regulations.



PARIS CONVENTION

A number of States have adhered to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property since the publication in *PCT Newsletter* No. 08/1996 of a table setting out the States party to that Convention. An update of that table appears on page 3.

Bahrain

On 29 July 1997, Bahrain (country code: BH) deposited its instrument of accession to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property. Bahrain will become bound by that Convention on 29 October 1997.

BUDAPEST TREATY ACCESSION

Portugal

On 16 July 1997, Portugal deposited its instrument of accession to the Budapest Treaty on the International Recognition of the Deposit of Microorganisms for the Purposes of Patent Procedure. That Treaty will enter into force with respect to Portugal on 16 October 1997.

HONG KONG: NOTIFICATION BY THE UNITED KINGDOM

The Government of the United Kingdom informed the Director General of WIPO on 16 June 1997 as follows:

"_[I]n accordance with the Joint Declaration of the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the People's

Republic of China on the Question of Hong Kong signed on 19 December 1984, the Government of the United Kingdom will restore Hong Kong to the People's Republic of China with effect from 1 July 1997. The Government of the United Kingdom will continue to have international responsibility for Hong Kong until that date. Therefore, from that date the Government of the United Kingdom will cease to be responsible for the international rights and obligations arising from the application of the [Patent Cooperation Treaty done at Washington on 19 June 1970 as amended on 28 September 1979 and modified on 3 February 1984] to Hong Kong."

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TYPES OF PROTECTION AVAILABLE IN PCT CONTRACTING STATES

PCT STATISTICS

1 January to 30 June 1997

During the first six months of 1997, the International Bureau of WIPO received 26,482 international applications filed with PCT receiving Offices worldwide, representing an increase of 12.6% over the same period in 1996.

The number of demands for international preliminary examination filed under Chapter II during the same period amounted to 19,470, representing an increase of 19.2% over the same period last year.

An increasing number of international applications are being filed with the International Bureau as receiving Office_during the first six months of 1997, 823 international applications were filed with that Office, which represents an increase of nearly 30% over the same period in 1996.

DEMAND FORM AVAILABLE IN SPANISH

The demand form (PCT/IPEA/401) is now available for the first time in Spanish. This form is for use before those International Preliminary Examining Authorities which carry out international preliminary examination in Spanish. Currently, the only International Preliminary Examining Authority which accepts Spanish as a language for international preliminary examination is the Russian Patent Office, and the only receiving Office which has specified Spanish as a filing language and has specified the Russian

Patent Office as competent International Preliminary Examining Authority is the Cuban Industrial Property Office.

Copies of the demand form in Spanish can be obtained free of charge from the receiving Office and International Preliminary Examining Authority concerned and from the International Bureau; it will also be available on WIPO's Internet site in the near future.

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Time limit for filing amendments to claims under PCT Article 19

Q: On 26 February 1997, I filed an international application claiming priority of an earlier application filed on 1 March 1996. After receiving the international search report, which was transmitted to me on 15 May 1997, I decided to amend some of the claims under PCT Article 19. Due to unforeseen circumstances, however, I have missed the time limit for filing such amendments. Is it possible to request an extension of that time limit?

A: Although there is no possibility of extension, as such, of the time limit for filing amendments to the claims under PCT Article 19 (that is, two months from the date of transmittal of the international search report or 16 months from the priority date, whichever time limit expires later), even if that time limit has expired, PCT Rule 46.1 provides that any amendments to the claims filed under PCT Article 19 will be considered to have been received by the International Bureau on the last day of the applicable time limit, provided they reach the International Bureau before the technical preparations for international publication have been completed. Note that, in such a case, the applicant would be required neither to pay any fee nor to make any special request.

In your case, the time limit for filing PCT Article 19 amendments expired on 15 July 1997 (two months from the date of transmittal of the international search report, which is later than 16 months from the priority date). Provided that you have not requested early publication under PCT Article 21(2)(b), the international publication of your international application is due to take place promptly after 1 September 1997 (18 months from the priority date) (see PCT Article 21(2)(a)). International applications are usually published on Thursdays, and technical preparations for international publication are generally

completed 15 days before the actual publication date. The earliest publication date following 1 September 1997 is Thursday, 4 September 1997. Assuming that this date would be the publication date for your application, the technical preparations for publication would be completed on 20 August 1997. Provided that your amendments are received by the International Bureau **before** the date on which the technical preparations for publication are completed (that is, that they are received by midnight, Geneva time, on Tuesday, 19 August 1997), the date of receipt of your amendments will be considered to be 15 July 1997 and the amended claims will be published. In cases where the date of completion of technical preparations for publication is very close, you are strongly recommended to file the amendments by fax, in addition to sending, at the same time, the original of those amendments by mail.

If the amendments are received by the International Bureau after the completion of technical preparations for publication, you will be informed by way of Form PCT/IB/346 that they were received after the expiration of the time limit under PCT Rule 46.1 and that. consequently, the amendments will not be published and will not be considered for the international procedure. If you file a demand for international preliminary examination, however, you have the possibility, under PCT Article 34, of filing amendments to the claims and to other parts of the international application, directly with the competent International Preliminary Examining Authority together with the demand, or thereafter, during the course of international preliminary examination (see PCT Rule 66). Also, upon entry into the national phase before the designated/elected Offices, all parts of the international application may be amended under PCT Article 28 or 41 (see also PCT Applicant's Guide, Vol. I/A, para. 272, and Vol. II/A, para. 58).



PRACTICAL ADVICE

Different applicants for different designated States

Q: I am the agent for an international application in which several persons are to be named as applicants.

- (1) Can I name different applicants for different designated States. If so, how should this be indicated in the request?
- (2) One of the applicants is to be applicant for GB for a national patent. Can another person be applicant for GB for a European patent?
- (3) Where more than one type of protection (such as patent and utility model) is available for a particular Contracting State, may different persons be indicated as applicants for that State for the purposes of obtaining different types of protection?

A: (1) Yes, it is possible for different persons to be indicated as applicants for different designated States (see PCT Rule 4.5(d)). First of all, all applicants should be named, as usual, in Boxes Nos. II and III of the request form. Then, for any applicant not falling into the categories of applicant for the purposes of "all designated States," "all designated States except the United States of America," or "the United States of America only," the checkbox "the States indicated in the Supplemental Box" should be marked. Then, the following text should be added to the Supplemental Box on the supplemental sheet of the request form: "Continuation of Boxes Nos. II and/or III," followed by the name of each

applicant, the name(s) of the designated State or States for which that person is applicant, together with, for each designated State, where applicable, an indication whether that person is applicant in respect of the State designated for the purposes of obtaining a national patent or a regional patent, or both a national and a regional patent. Note that, where different persons are indicated as inventors for different designated States (see PCT Rule 4.6(c)), the Supplemental Box can also be used to indicate the designated State or group of States in respect of which each person is inventor.

2) No, where a particular State is designated for both a national patent and a regional patent, the same applicant(s) must be indicated for both designations. Thus, the person who is indicated as applicant for GB for a national patent must also be indicated as the applicant for GB for a European patent (see Administrative Instructions under the PCT, Section 203(b)).

(3) No, even if more than one type of protection for an invention is available in a designated State (in Germany, for example, it is possible to obtain a utility model instead of or in addition to a patent), different applicants may not be indicated for different types of protection in respect of the same Contracting State. Different types of protection in the same State are available only for the same applicant (see *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. I/A, paragraph 59).

MOST FREQUENT PCT USERS IN 1996

In 1996, 236 PCT applicants accounted for 33% (14,067) of the 42,186 international applications published, each with 20 or more such applications. This represents an increase over 1995 of 29% in the number of applicants in whose names 20 or more international applications were published. Of the 236 applicants, 54.2% were from the United States of America, 11% from Japan and 9.3% from Germany. There were 31 applicants in each of whose names more than 100 international applications were published. The largest PCT user in 1996 was Philips, which used the International Bureau as receiving Office for filling most of its international applications.

The list of the 236 most frequent PCT users in 1996, derived from the *PCT Gazette* Index for

that year (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 06/1997 for details), appears on pages 5 to 8. Note that the list does not include, in the figures given for corporate applicants, any applications filed by subsidiaries under a different name.



IDRIS TO SUCCEED BOGSCH AS DIRECTOR GENERAL OF WIPO

Dr. Arpad Bogsch (78), citizen of the United States of America, Director General of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) for the last 24 years, will retire on 30 November 1997.

On Monday, 22 September 1997, the General Assembly of the World Intellectual Property Organization by acclamation appointed Dr. Kamil Idris to the post of Director General.

Dr. Idris, the third Director General of WIPO, a national of Sudan, fluent in English, French and Arabic, has been appointed to serve a term of office for six years from 1 December 1997 through 30 November 2003.

REDUCTION IN PCT FEES AS FROM 1 JANUARY 1998

The Assembly of the International Patent Cooperation Union (PCT Union) held its twenty-fourth (11th ordinary) session in Geneva from 16 September to 1 October 1997, in the context of meetings of the Governing Bodies of WIPO.

The Assembly decided, with effect from 1 January 1998, to reduce the basic fee by about 15% and the designation fee by about 19%. For international applications filed on or after 1 January 1998, the basic fee will be CHF 650 (USD 455) instead of CHF 762 (USD 530) and the designation fee will be CHF 150 (USD 105) instead of CHF 185 (USD 128). The new amounts of those fees and the new equivalent amounts in

other currencies are shown in Table I(a).

It is interesting to note that between 1 January 1997 and 1 January 1998, the equivalent amount in USD of the basic fee will have decreased from USD 677 to USD 455, and the equivalent amount in USD of the designation fee will have decreased from USD 164 to USD 105, that is, a reduction of 33% and 36%, respectively.

of the PCT Regulations, in order to make procedures for the filing and processing of international applications simpler, safer, more flexible and more accessible to applicants, and to take into account rapidly changing technology.

A summary of the most important amendments adopted is given below, together with an indication of when those amendments will enter into force.

(1) Amendments which will enter into force on 1 January 1998

PCT Gazette: The Gazette will be made available in two forms:

- (a) in paper form, containing the bibliographic data included on the front page of the pamphlet as specified by the Administrative Instructions under the PCT; there will be a single bilingual paper version of the *Gazette* which will replace the present two separate editions (namely, the English edition *PCT Gazette* and the French edition *Gazette du PCT*);
- (b) in electronic form, containing the bibliographic data, any drawing appearing on the front page of the pamphlet, and the abstract; the electronic version will be made accessible, in English and French at the same time, by any electronic ways and means specified in the Administrative Instructions (which may, for example, be on the Internet or on CD-ROM).

The above changes to the *Gazette* will take place as soon as possible after 1 January 1998.

(2) Amendments which will enter into force on 1 July 1998

Language of the international application: The existing provisions as to the languages in which international applications may be filed will be broadened. Receiving Offices will be permitted to accept any language for the filing of international applications, and applicants may file such applications in any language so accepted. The different stages of processing of the international application will then, if necessary, be undertaken on the basis of a translation to be furnished by the applicant. Every receiving Office will, however, be obliged to accept filings in at least one language which is both a language accepted by the competent International Searching Authority and a language of publication, so that applicants would always have the option of filing the international application in a language from which no translation would be required for either search or publication purposes.

Priority claims and priority documents: The present requirements relating to the making of, and the correction of mistakes in, priority claims will be liberalized. Applicants will be able to correct or add a priority claim by a notice submitted to the receiving Office or the International Bureau within a time limit of 16 months from the priority date or. where the correction or addition would cause a change in the priority date, 16 months from the priority date as so changed, whichever 16-month period expires first. In any event, however, such a notice may always be submitted until the expiration of four months from the international filing date. The correction of a priority claim will be able to include the addition of any indication referred to in PCT Rule 4.10. Consistent with this more liberal approach, certain provisions relating to the furnishing of priority documents will also be amended.

Demand for international preliminary examination: The existing provisions will be amended so as to provide a safeguard in respect of the filing of a demand with an International Preliminary Examining Authority which is not competent to carry out international preliminary examination, or with a receiving Office, an International Searching Authority or the International Bureau. The

new procedure will be similar to that which has already been introduced in the Regulations in respect of the filing of the international application with a receiving Office which is not competent to receive it (namely, the transmittal to the International Bureau as receiving Office under PCT Rule 19.4).

Access to files: Copies of documents in the files of the International Bureau and the International Preliminary Examining Authority will become more readily available to third parties after international publication. Express authorization will be given to elected Offices to provide access to documents in the international preliminary examination file (as held by the International Preliminary Examining Authority), if permitted under the applicable national law. Note that this amendment will only apply to international applications filed on or after 1 July 1998.

Fees: In addition to the above-mentioned fee reductions which will take effect on 1 January 1998, the procedures for the fixing of equivalent amounts of certain fees in currencies other than Swiss francs will be streamlined from 1 July 1998. Also, the time limits for payment of the different fees during the international phase will be made more uniform, and amendments will be made to clarify what amount is payable where the amount of a fee changes before payment, to provide for refunds in certain cases, and to align the approach in relation to (late) payment of Chapter II fees with that followed in relation to (late) payment of Chapter I fees.

Nucleotide and amino acid sequence listings: A new legal framework will come into force for the implementation of a standard for the presentation of nucleotide and amino acid sequence listings in international applications under the PCT. This will allow applicants to draw up a single sequence listing which is acceptable to all receiving Offices and International Searching and Preliminary Examining Authorities for the purposes of the international phase, and to all designated and elected Offices for the purposes of the national phase. No translations or special versions of sequence listings will need to be prepared if the above-mentioned standard is complied with.

Deposits of biological material: The scope of PCT Rule 13bis, which provides for the furnishing of indications concerning depos-

ited microorganisms, will be broadened to take into account recent developments in the field of biotechnology by covering deposits of other biological materials.

(3) Amendments which will enter into force at a time other than (1) and (2), above

Electronic filing of international applications: The Regulations will be amended so as to contain broad enabling provisions which will, in the future, give applicants the option of electronically filing international applications and other documents and correspondence with those receiving Offices which are prepared to accept such filings. This will also allow for electronic communications between, and processing within. Offices and Authorities. The amended Regulations relating to this matter will enter into force when the corresponding Administrative Instructions, containing the standards and other details concerning the requirements for the filing and processing of international applications in electronic form and by electronic means, are modified.

Where to find the text of the adopted amendments

The report of the PCT Union Assembly, together with the text of the amendments of the PCT Regulations, will soon be available on WIPO's Internet site. The text of the latter will soon be published in a special issue of the PCT Gazette. A revised consolidated text of the PCT and Regulations (WIPO Publication No. 274) will also be published in due course. The PCT Newsletter will make an announcement when the above-mentioned texts are available.

INTERNATIONAL SEARCHING AND PRELIMINARY EXAMINING AUTHORITIES: EXTENSION OF APPOINTMENTS AND NEW APPOINTMENT

Extension of appointments

The PCT Union Assembly extended, until 31 December 2007, the appointments of the Australian Patent Office, the Austrian Patent Office, the Chinese Patent Office, the European Patent Office, the Japanese Patent Office, the Russian Agency for Patents and Trademarks, the Swedish Patent and Registration Office and the United States Patent and Trademark Office as International Searching Authorities and International Preliminary Examining Authorities, and of

the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office as International Searching Authority.

Appointment of the Korean Industrial Property Office as International Searching Authority and International Preliminary Examining Authority

The Korean Industrial Property Office was appointed as International Searching Authority (ISA) and International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA) at the abovementioned meeting of the PCT Union Assembly. That Office will become an ISA and IPEA as from the date of entry into force of the Agreement between the Korean Industrial Property Office and the International Bureau in relation to the functioning of the Office as an ISA and IPEA. That date of entry into force depends on the fulfillment by the Office of certain conditions.

Note that applicants cannot yet choose the Korean Industrial Property Office as ISA or IPEA. The date of entry into force of the Agreement and other details will be announced as soon as such information is known.

IDRIS TO SUCCEED BOGSCH AS DIRECTOR GENERAL OF WIPO [continued from cover page]

The WIPO Coordination Committee, on 19 March 1997, recommended the name of Dr. Kamil Idris, out of ten candidates, for appointment as the third Director General of WIPO.

Dr. Idris has had a remarkable career, from being an Ambassador of his country, a member of the United Nations International Law Commission (ILC) to a Deputy Director General of WIPO since 1994.

Emerging from within the Organization, Dr. Idris has intimate knowledge of the organization's activities as well as the views of the staff at all levels of the organization.

In his acceptance speech to the General Assembly, the Director General elect said WIPO "has a dual character" as an intergovernmental organization and as a market-oriented organization, requires "special operational and managerial principles in order to meet the expectations of its constituents." "WIPO generates substantial revenue. While this revenue is produced

through the provision of services to the market sector, it is not the private revenue of a private enterprise, but revenue held in trust by an intergovernmental organization. Accountability is thus a fundamental operational principle of the organization," he said.

Paying tribute to the vision and energy of Director General Arpad Bogsch, "an exceptional thinker and leader," Dr. Idris said: "It is he who, through his talent and drive, coupled with his profound knowledge, has given the organization the shape, vitality and strength it has today."

NEW PCT CONTRACTING STATES

The Gambia (country code: GM)

The Gambia deposited its instrument of accession to the PCT on 9 September 1997, and will become bound by the PCT on 9 December 1997. Therefore, in any international application filed on or after 9 December 1997, the Gambia may be designated and, because it will be bound by Chapter II of the PCT, may also be elected. Furthermore, as from 9 December 1997, nationals and residents of the Gambia will be entitled to file international applications under the PCT.

Since the Gambia is party to the Harare Protocol within the framework of the African Regional Industrial Property Organization (ARIPO), it will also be possible to designate the Gambia for the purposes of obtaining an ARIPO patent. Any designation for an ARIPO patent in an international application filed on or after 9 December 1997 will automatically include the designation of the Gambia for that purpose.

Guinea-Bissau (country code: GW)

Guinea-Bissau deposited its instrument of accession to the PCT on 12 September 1997, and will become bound by the PCT on 12 December 1997. Therefore, in any international application filed on or after 12 December 1997, Guinea-Bissau may be designated and, because it will be bound by

Chapter II of the PCT, may also be elected. Furthermore, as from 12 December 1997, nationals and residents of Guinea-Bissau will be entitled to file international applications under the PCT.

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Adding applicants and/or inventors to the international application after the international filing date

Q: I am one of a team of three inventors in respect of an international application which was filed and subsequently accorded an international filing date a few weeks ago. Each of us should have been named as applicant/inventor for all designated States, but unfortunately the sheet containing the "Continuation of Box No. III" (continuation sheet of the request form), containing the details about the third applicant/inventor, was erroneously omitted from the request when filed. Is it possible to add further applicants and/or inventors after the international filing date?

A: It is possible to add further applicants, as well as further inventors or agents, by requesting the recording of a change under PCT Rule 92bis. In general, PCT Rule 92bis provides for changes (whether additions, deletions or any combination thereof) in respect of the person, name, residence, nationality or address of the applicant, and in respect of the person, name or address of the agent, the common representative or the inventor.

It is important to note, however, that any applicants and/or inventors added after the international application has been filed will be considered as applicants and/or inventors only from the date on which their names are

added. Certain designated/elected Offices require that the name(s) of the inventor(s) be given in the request upon filing. However, some of those Offices may permit the addition of applicants and/or inventors under certain circumstances, depending on the national law.

In order to request the addition of a further applicant and/or inventor, a request under PCT Rule 92bis must be made by the applicant(s) of record (or on their behalf by their agent or common representative) in writing and may be sent either to the receiving Office or to the International Bureau. The International Bureau records the change if it receives the request before the expiration of 20 months or, if a demand for international preliminary examination has been filed within 19 months from the priority date, 30 months from the priority date. It should be noted that the applicable time limit is 20 or 30 months, even though a longer time limit for entering the national phase may be applicable in certain designated/elected Offices.

If it is intended that the international publication reflect the additional applicant and/or inventor, the request for recording the change should reach the International Bureau before the completion of technical preparations for publication (which generally takes place 15 days before the actual publication date).

Applicants who file a request for the recording of a change with the receiving Office are reminded that the decisive date is that of the International Bureau's receipt of the request transmitted by the receiving Office. Therefore, if the request is made shortly before the expiration of the time limits indicated above, it is recommended that it be sent direct to the International Bureau, preferably by fax.

For further details about which designated/ elected Offices require that the name(s) of the inventor(s) be given in the request upon filing, see *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. I/A, Annex B1 and *PCT Newsletter* No. 06/1996; for further details about technical preparations for publication, see *PCT Newsletter* No. 03/1995; for further details about requests for recording changes, see *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. I/A, paras. 352-355, and *PCT Newsletter* No. 10/1995).



MODIFIED REQUEST FORM (PCT/RO/101)

The request form (PCT/RO/101) has been modified with effect from 1 January 1998.

By that date, the following new PCT Contracting States will have become bound by the PCT since the last revision of the form in July 1997 and have been added to Box No. V under National Patent: GM Gambia, GW Guinea-Bissau and ID Indonesia. Under Regional Patent, GM Gambia has been added for an ARIPO patent. Minor modifications have been made to the notes to Box No. V of the request form, in respect of the list of States to which European patents may be extended, and certain kinds of protection for certain States.

Minor modifications have also been made to the notes to the fee calculation sheet, in respect of those new PCT Contracting States whose residents and nationals (natural persons) are eligible for a reduction of the basic, designation and confirmation fees, and a note has been added about the changes in the international fee which will come into effect on 1 January 1998 (that is, the reduction in the basic fee and the designation fee and the change in the equivalent amount, in certain currencies, of the supplement per sheet over 30).

The other sheets of the request form and of the notes thereto, as well as the fee calculation sheet and the other sheets of the notes thereto, have not been modified except for the inclusion on each sheet of an indication of either the date of reprinting or the date of printing due to repagination.

Modified versions of the second sheet of the request form (which includes Box No. V) in English and French are included in this issue as white tear-out sheets for insertion in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. I/B, Annex X. Also included in this issue are modified versions of the second sheet in German and Spanish. The inserted sheets may be photocopied and used, along with other sheets of the

The demand form (PCT/IPEA/401) has not been modified except for the inclusion of the date of reprinting (January 1998) on each sheet. There are minor modifications to the notes to the fee calculation sheet, which are annexed to the demand, in respect of those new PCT Contracting States whose residents and nationals (natural persons) are eligible for a reduction of the handling fee.

EXTENSION OF EUROPEAN PATENTS TO THE FORMER YUGOSLAV REPUBLIC OF MACEDONIA

An agreement between the European Patent Organisation and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia (MK) on the extension of the effects of European patent applications and patents to MK entered into force on 1 November 1997. Under that agreement, it is possible to obtain patent protection in MK by requesting the extension of a European patent to that State. The extension procedure is also available, if the necessary requirements are met, via the PCT. The agreement with MK is similar to those which are in force in respect of Slovenia, Lithuania, Latvia, Albania and Romania (see PCT Newsletter Nos. 01/1994, 04/1994, 05/1994, 05/1995, 12/1995, 02/1996, 10/1996 and 11/1996).

Note that MK is not party to the European Patent Convention (EPC) and cannot itself be designated for a European patent (EP). If protection is desired in MK via the PCT, MK must be designated for the purposes of a national patent, even where the applicant intends later to request protection through the extension of a European patent.

The extension of a European patent to MK via the PCT route is available in respect of international applications filed on or after 1 November 1997. A request for the extension of a European patent to MK may be made if: (i) both the designations EP (regional patent) and MK (national patent) are made, either as express designations under PCT Rule 4.9(a) or as precautionary designations confirmed under PCT Rule 4.9(c), and (ii) the PCT designation fees due for these designations (and confirmation fees, in the event of confirmation of precautionary designations) are paid within the time limit applicable under PCT Rule 15.4(b) or 15.5. No special indication concerning the extension should be made in the PCT request form. The applicant must then, within 21 months (Chapter I) or 31 months (Chapter II) from the priority date, enter the regional phase before the European Patent

Office (EPO) – a request for extension of the European patent is automatically deemed to have been made - and pay to the EPO the extension fee (currently DEM 200) for the extension of the European patent to MK. The extension fee may also be validly paid, with a surcharge of 50%, within a grace period of two months if the time limit of 21 or 31 months has been missed. The request for extension will be considered withdrawn if, upon entry into the regional phase before the EPO, the extension fee is not paid within the applicable time limit. Note, however, that no notification of non-observance of the basic time limit or expiry of the period of grace will be issued, and that re-establishment of rights is not possible in respect of the payment of the extension fee.

A European patent application for which extension to MK has been requested is equivalent to a duly filed national application in MK and, after publication, confers provisional protection, provided the applicant communicates to the invention's user in MK a translation of the claims into the national language (that is, Macedonian).

Upon completion of the European procedure, the EPO will inform the Industrial Property Protection Office of MK of the grant of the European patent. That patent will have the effect of a national patent granted by the latter Office, provided that, within three months from the publication by the EPO of the mention of grant of the European patent, a translation of the claims into the national language is filed with, and the prescribed publication fee is paid to, the Industrial Property Protection Office of MK. Renewal fees for the patent will have to be paid to the Industrial Property Protection Office of MK for the years following that in which the mention of the grant of the European patent was published by the EPO.

The option of entering the national phase directly before the Industrial Property Protection Office of MK within 21 or 31 months from the priority date, instead of proceeding with a request for the extension of a European patent to MK, remains available for any international application containing the designation of MK.

PCT STATISTICS

1 January to 30 September 1997

During the first nine months of 1997, the International Bureau of WIPO received 41,576 international applications filed with PCT receiving Offices worldwide, representing an increase of 16.3% over the same period in 1996.

The number of demands for international preliminary examination filed under Chapter II during the same period amounted to 29,719, representing an increase of 20.7% over the same period last year.

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Changing the type of protection requested in an international application

Q:I am preparing an international application for national phase entry in two months. At the time of filing I was unsure whether, for certain designated States, I wished the application to be treated as an application for a patent or as an application for a utility model. For the States whose national law provides for it. I indicated in Box No. V of the request form that I wished the international application to be treated as an application for both a patent and a utility model; for the States whose national law provides that they may be designated either for a patent or for a utility model, I indicated in Box No. V that I wished that the international application be treated as an application for a patent. However, after reading the opinion expressed in the international preliminary examination report, I decided that it would be a better approach to apply for a utility model in those States which could have been designated for the purposes of a utility model but which were designated, instead, for the purposes of a patent. Can I change the indication of the type of protection sought in relation to a given designation?

A:The basic rule is that, if the applicant wishes an international application to be treated in any designated State (whose national law provides for that type of protection) as an application not for a patent but for another type of protection referred to in PCT Article 43 (for example, a utility model), this should be indicated in the request (see PCT Rule 4.12).

If you had wanted to change the type of protection requested for a designated State or group of States for another type of protection before the expiration of 15 months from the priority date, you might have been able to do this by confirming the precautionary designation of each designated State for the purposes of that particular type of protection and, at the same time, withdrawing the designation of that State for a patent (see PCT Rule 4.9(b) and *PCT Newsletter* No. 04/1994). It is, however, too late to do this now.

Another possibility which exists in connection with the *national phase* before certain designated/elected Offices, is to request the

conversion of the patent application into an application for another type of protection (for example, in Japan it is possible to convert a patent application into a utility model application; in Australia it is possible to convert a patent application into an application for a petty patent). The request for conversion should normally be made in writing and many designated/elected Offices require the payment of a conversion fee. The time at which the request should be made varies a great deal, depending on the designated/elected Office concerned-it may be made upon entry into the national phase or at some time after entry into the national phase, but before the publication of the decision to grant a patent; it may, in some cases, be made even later. The table, opposite (printed on a tear-out sheet), indicates those designated/elected Offices before which conversions are available and the types of conversion possible. For further details, see the PCT Applicant's Guide, Vol. II, National Chapters, where information is given, for each designated/elected Office concerned on the conditions under which a request for conversion may be made, on the types of conversion which are possible, and on the procedure for making a request for conversion.

A number of designated/elected Offices, for example, Austria and Spain, provide for conversion in both directions, that is, from a patent application into a utility model application and from a utility model application into a patent application. However, since there are more possibilities for conversion from a patent application to a utility model application than in the other direction (see table), more options are open if a designation for a patent is made to start with. In any case, as mentioned earlier, applicants are advised to indicate the type of protection required, wherever possible, in the request at the time of filing.

Note that the information in the table, opposite, and in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. II, National Chapters, is based on information provided to the International Bureau by the Offices concerned and may not be exhaustive. An absence of information regarding a particular State is therefore not necessarily an indication that no conversion is possible. Applicants are advised to check with the Offices concerned.



REMINDER: REDUCTION IN PCT FEES WITH EFFECT FROM 1 JANUARY 1998

Applicants are reminded that, following the decision of the Assembly of the International Patent Cooperation Union (PCT Union) on 1 October 1997, the amounts in Swiss francs of the basic fee and the designation fee will be reduced by about 15% and 19%, respectively, for international applications whose date of receipt is on or after 1 January 1998 (see PCT Newsletter No. 10/1997). Note that, although the amounts in Swiss francs of the supplement per sheet over 30 (a component of the basic fee) and the handling fee have not changed, the equivalent amounts of those fees in certain currencies will change. The new amounts/ equivalent amounts of the above-mentioned fees are indicated in Table I(a), on pages 8 to 11. The new amounts of the basic fee and designation fee are also indicated in the amended Schedule of Fees annexed to the PCT Regulations, as amended (see below). For further explanations about which amounts are applicable when there has been a change in the amount of those fees, see "Practical advice," on page 5.

PCT SCHEDULE OF FEES

The Schedule of Fees which is annexed to the Regulations under the PCT should be replaced by the amended Schedule of Fees included as a looseleaf insert in this issue. (That sheet also contains the text of

amended PCT Rule 86-see below for details.)

The amended Schedule of Fees. which was adopted by the Assembly of the PCT Union on 1 October 1997, reflects the above-mentioned fee reductions. It will enter into force on 1 January 1998 and will be applicable only until 30 June 1998, since it has been further amended with effect from 1 July 1998 in order to take into account amendments to the PCT Regulations which will enter into force on that date (and which are not related to amounts of fees).

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Q: I am going to file an international application claiming the priority of an earlier application filed on 30 January 1997. If I were to file the international application, say, on 15 December 1997, would I be able to pay the new, lower, basic and designation fee amounts, which will become applicable on 1 January 1998, in view of the fact that the due date for payment of those fees would be after that date?

A: The new amounts of the basic and designation fees will be applicable only for international applications whose date of receipt by the receiving Office is on or after 1 January 1998. Since the envisaged date of receipt of your application would be before 1 January 1998, the current, higher, amounts of those fees would be payable, even though the due dates for payment

would be 15 January 1998, in respect of the basic fee (that is, one month from the date of receipt of the international application), and 30 January 1998, in respect of the designation fee (that is, 12 months from the priority date).

It is important to be aware that, in the case of a fee amount which is applicable on the date of receipt of the international application, that date is not necessarily the same date as the "international filing date" (although it is the same in most cases). It may happen that they differ, for example, if the drawings were missing from your application and were then received, say, on 5 January 1998, then that date would be the international filing date. The due date for the payment of the basic fee would, nevertheless, be calculated as from 15 December 1997the date of receipt of the first papers-and the amount payable would be that applicable on 15 December 1997 and not on 5 January 1998. The due date for payment of the designation fee would remain 30 January 1998, that is, 12 months from the priority date) and the amount payable would be that applicable on 15 December 1997.

If the lower amount of the basic and/or designation fees is paid by mistake instead of the higher amount, the receiving Office will, according to PCT Rule 16*bis*.1, invite the applicant to pay, within one month from the date of the invitation, the missing amount required to cover those fees. The receiving Office may, in this case, charge a late payment fee (see PCT Rule 16*bis*.2).

Note that the current PCT Regulations provide only for the situation where there is an increase in fees, so that, under PCT Rule 15.4(c), the applicant is protected against an increase in the basic and designation fees if those fees are paid within one month from the date of receipt of the international application. If, however, as may be the case with the designation fee, the fee is paid later than one month from the date of receipt of the international application, the higher amount is due. The amendments of the PCT Regulations which enter into force on 1 July 1998 include an amendment to PCT Rule 15.4(c), which will, from that date, cover cases of decreases, as well as increases, in fees. Further details will be given in the *PCT Newsletter* nearer the time of entry into force of the amendments.



AMENDMENTS OF THE REGULATIONS UNDER THE PATENT COOPERATION TREATY (PCT)

[as in force from January 1, 1998]

Rule 86 The Gazette

86.1 Contents and Form

- (a) The Gazette referred to in Article 55(4) shall contain:
- (i) for each published international application, the data specified by the Administrative Instructions taken from the front page of the pamphlet published under Rule 48, the drawing (if any) appearing on the said front page, and the abstract,
- (ii) the schedule of all fees payable to the receiving Offices, the International Bureau, and the International Searching and Preliminary Examining Authorities,
- (iii) notices the publication of which is required under the Treaty or these Regulations,
- (iv) information, if and to the extent furnished to the International Bureau by the designated or elected Offices, on the question whether the requirements provided for in Articles 22 or 39 have been complied with in respect of the international applications designating or electing the Office concerned,
- (v) any other useful information prescribed by the Administrative Instructions, provided access to such information is not prohibited under the Treaty or these Regulations.
 - (b) The information referred to in paragraph (a) shall be made available in two forms:
- (i) as a Gazette in paper form, which shall contain the data specified by the Administrative Instructions taken from the front page of the pamphlet published under Rule 48 ("bibliographic data") and the matters referred to in paragraph (a)(ii) to (v);
- (ii) as a Gazette in electronic form, which shall contain the bibliographic data, the drawing (if any) appearing on the said front page, and the abstract.

86.2 Languages; Access to the Gazette

- (a) The Gazette in paper form shall be published in a bilingual (English and French) edition. It shall also be published in editions in any other language, provided the cost of publication is assured through sales or subventions.
- (b) The Assembly may order the publication of the Gazette in languages other than those referred to in paragraph (a).

(c) The Gazette in electronic form referred to in Rule 86.1(b)(ii) shall be made accessible, in English and French at the same time, by any electronic ways and means specified in the Administrative Instructions. The translations shall be ensured by the International Bureau in English and French. The International Bureau shall ensure that the making accessible of the Gazette in electronic form shall be effected on, or as soon as possible after, the date of publication of the pamphlet containing the international application.
