#### PCT STATISTICS – 1 January to 31 December 1996

The year 1996 saw the greatest increase in the number of international applications filed under the PCT since operations began in 1978. In 1996, the International Bureau of WIPO received 47,291 international applications, filed with PCT receiving Offices worldwide, which is 8,385 (21.6%) more than in 1995. The figure on page 2 shows the number of international applications received each year since 1978.

The 47,291 international applications received in 1996 had the effect of 1,330,058 national applications, and of 104,410 regional applications, which in turn had the effect of 1,326,795 applications for patent protection in the member States of the regional patent systems, that is, a total equivalent effect of 2,656,853 national applications.

The table below shows the top 10 countries of origin of those international applications. (Note that 15.3% of the applications received were filed with either the European Patent Office or the International Bureau as

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

#### **PRACTICAL ADVICE**

#### Omission of States from regional designations; States which can be designated only for the purposes of a regional patent

Q: (a) If I do not wish to include certain States in a regional designation, is it possible to omit those States from that designation in the request form?

(b) How do I find out which States party to a regional patent treaty cannot be designated also for a national patent?

A: The characteristics of each regional patent system are different and each system should be treated separately. The above questions are answered below, under the headings of the four regional patents for the purposes of which it is presently possible to make designations under the PCT, and are also summarized in the form of a table, on page 6.

#### **ARIPO patents (AP)**

Designations for an ARIPO (African Regional Industrial Property Organization) patent have effect in States party to the Harare Protocol on Patents and Industrial Designs and to the PCT.

(a) Provided that at least one State in respect of which it is possible to obtain an ARIPO patent is designated, any other State may be omitted from that designation, preferably by crossing out the name(s) of the State(s) concerned from the list which follows "AP" in Box No. V of the request form (PCT/RO/101).

(b) Swaziland can only be designated for the purposes of an ARIPO patent - it has "closed the national route" and cannot, therefore, be designated for the purposes of a national patent. All other PCT Contracting States which are also party to the Harare Protocol can be designated either for a national or an ARIPO patent, or both a national and an ARIPO patent.

#### **Eurasian patents (EA)**

Designations for a Eurasian patent have effect in States party to the Eurasian Patent Convention (EAPC) and to the PCT. (a) Any designation of one or more States for a Eurasian patent will be treated as a designation of all States which are party to both the EAPC and the PCT for the purposes of a Eurasian patent - it is not possible to omit any State from the designation of a Eurasian patent.

(b) All PCT Contracting States which are also party to the EAPC can be designated either for a national or a Eurasian patent, or both a national and a Eurasian patent.

Note that, even though, initially, a designation for a Eurasian patent must include all States party to the EAPC and the PCT, such States can be subsequently excluded from protection under the Eurasian patent by way of non-payment of annual fees in respect of those States after the grant of the Eurasian patent.

#### European patents (EP)

Designations for a European patent have effect in States party to the European Patent Convention (EPC) and to the PCT.

(a) Provided that at least one State in respect of which it is possible to obtain a European patent is designated, any other State may be omitted from that designation, preferably by crossing out the name(s) of the State(s) concerned from the list which follows "EP" in Box No. V of the request form.

(b) The following PCT Contracting States which are also party to the EPC can only be designated for the purposes of a European patent: Belgium, France, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Monaco and the Netherlands – they have "closed the national route" and cannot, therefore, be designated for the purposes of a national patent. All other States in respect of which is it possible to obtain a European patent can be designated either for a national or a European patent, or both a national and a European patent.

#### OAPI patents (OA)

OAPI (African Intellectual Property Organization) patents have effect in States party to the Bangui Agreement and to the PCT.

(a) Any designation of one or more States for an OAPI patent will be treated as a designation of all States which are party to both the Bangui Agreement and the PCT for the purposes of an OAPI patent - it is not possible to omit any State from the designation of an OAPI patent.

(b) None of the PCT Contracting States which are also party to the Bangui Agreement can be designated for a national patent - they have "closed the national route" and can only be designated for an OAPI patent.

*Important:* Even though it is possible to omit States from designations for ARIPO patents and European patents, it is, nevertheless, strongly recommended to designate all States included in those designations since there are no additional costs associated with doing so - only one designation fee must be paid during the international phase for each regional designation made under PCT Rule 4.9(a)(ii), independently of how many States are covered by each such designation. Also, making all available designations will give you the added flexibility to delay your choice as to the States in which you wish to proceed with your application until the time of entry into the regional phase concerned.

The table below indicates for each State, in respect of which it is possible to obtain a regional patent under the PCT, whether it can be omitted from the regional designation and whether it can (also) be designated for a national patent.

#### EPO: FEE REDUCTIONS AND NEW TIME LIMIT FOR PAYING DESIGNATION FEES, AS FROM 1 JULY 1997

The Administrative Council of the European Patent Organisation decided, on 5 December 1996, that there will be a reduction in the fee payable for an international search by the European Patent Office (EPO), and in certain fees payable upon entering the regional phase before the EPO (the basic national fee, the European search fee and the European designation fee).

The Council also decided that European designation fees will be payable within a time limit of six months from the date on which the European Patent Bulletin mentions the publication of the European search report. Note, however, that **Euro-PCT appli***cations* (that is, PCT applications in which designations for a European patent are made) **are not affected by this change**; in such cases, payment of European designation fees remain due within the time limit of 21 or 31 months from the priority date (or international filing date, where there is no priority claim).

The reduced amounts and new time limit for paying designation fees will apply **only** to payments made **from 1 July 1997**, including those made in respect of applications filed before that date, provided the applicable time limit has not expired, and the fee has not already been validly paid, before 1 July 1997. The reduced amounts, in DEM, are indicated on pages 3 and 4, above, under the headings "EP European Patent Office (fees)" and "Search fee (...European Patent Office...)," respectively.


