NEW PCT CONTRACTING STATES

Algeria (country code: DZ)

On 8 December 1999, Algeria deposited its instrument of ratification of the PCT, and on 8 March 2000, will become bound by the PCT. Consequently, in any international application filed on or after 8 March 2000, Algeria may be designated and, because it will be bound by Chapter II of the PCT, may also be elected. Furthermore, nationals and residents of Algeria will be entitled from 8 March 2000 to file international applications under the PCT.

Antigua and Barbuda (country code: AG)

On 17 December 1999, Antiqua and Barbuda deposited its instrument of accession to the PCT. and on 17 March 2000, will become bound by the PCT. Consequently, in any international application filed on or after 17 March 2000, Antigua and Barbuda may be designated and, because it will be bound by Chapter II of the PCT, may also be elected. Furthermore, nationals and residents of Antiqua and Barbuda will be entitled from 17 March 2000 to file international applications under the PCT.

PCT-EASY UPDATE

The Invention Office of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea has notified the International Bureau that it is prepared to accept the filing of international applications containing requests in PCT-EASY format, together with PCT-EASY dis-

kettes. See Table I(a) for the amount of the corresponding PCT-EASY fee reduction.

PCT APPLICANT'S GUIDE UPDATE SHEETS

Pink provisional sheets included in last year's issues of the *PCT Newsletter*, which have been inserted in the *PCT Applicant's Guide* by its users, should be removed from the *Guide* and replaced with the January 2000 update sheets when they are received.

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The January 2000 update sheets for the *PCT Applicant's Guide* will also be incorporated shortly in the *PCT Applicant's Guide* on WIPO's Internet site.

PATENT OFFICE BRANCHES IN INDIA TO PERFORM RECEIVING OFFICE AND DESIGNATED AND ELECTED OFFICE FUNCTIONS

Certain functions of the Indian Patent Office under the PCT are now also carried out by that Office's Branches in Chennai, Mumbai and New Delhi. Each Branch Office, as well as the Head Office in Calcutta, now performs:

- 1) receiving Office functions in relation to any international application filed with it by the applicant, or first mentioned applicant in case of joint applicants, whose residence or domicile or place of business, or the place from where the invention actually originated, is within its territorial jurisdiction under the Indian patents legislation; and
- 2) designated and elected Office functions in relation to any international application entering the national phase in India for which:

OA African Intellectual Property Organization (means of telecommunication; name and address of inventor)

There has been a change in the requirements of the African Intellectual Property Organization (OAPI) as to the need to furnish the original of a document transmitted to that Office by fax and as to the time when the name and address of the inventor must be given if OAPI is a designated or elected Office, as follows:

must the original of the document be furnished in all cases?

yes, within two months from the date of the transmission, if the transmitted document is a power of attorney or a replacement sheet of the description, claims or drawings

yes, within six months from the date of entry into the national phase for documents relating to priority (instrument of assignment of priority and, only when PCT Rule 17.1(c) applies, priority document)

no, in the case of other documents

time when the name and address of the inventor must be given if OAPI is a designated (or elected) Office:

Must be in the request if the inventor has not renounced in writing the right to be named. If the data concerning the inventor are not in the request, the Office will invite the applicant to comply with the requirement and to pay a fee within a time limit fixed in the invitation. In any case, a patent may not be granted before the required corrections have been made.

There has been a change in the requirements of that Office as designated and elected Office concerning the contents of the translation for entry into the national phase, as follows:

under PCT Article 22:

request, description, claims (if amended, as originally filed or as amended, if the applicant wishes the amendments to form the basis for the proceedings, together with any statement under PCT Article 19), any text matter of drawings, abstract

under PCT Article 39(1):

request, description, claims, any text matter of drawings, abstract (if any of those parts has been amended, as originally filed or as amended by the annexes to the international preliminary examination report, if the applicant wishes the amendments to form the basis for the proceedings)

The only special requirement under PCT Rule51*bis* of that Office is now as follows:

appointment of an agent if the applicant is not resident in the Russian Federation

Search fee and other fees relating to the international search (Korean Industrial Property Office)

PARIS CONVENTION

Accession by Antigua and Barbuda

On 17 December 1999, Antigua and Barbuda (country code: AG) deposited its instrument of accession to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property. Antigua and Barbuda will become bound by that Convention on 17 March 2000.

Application of the Paris Convention, from 20 December 1999, to the Macau Special Administrative Region

The Government of the People's Republic of China has informed the Director General of WIPO of the following:

"In accordance with the Joint Declaration of the Government of the People's Republic of China and the Government of the Republic of Portugal on the Question of Macao signed on 13 April 1987, the People's Republic of China will resume the exercise of sovereignty over Macao with effect from 20 December 1999. Macao will, with effect from that date, become a Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China and will enjoy a high degree of autonomy, except in foreign and defence affairs which are the responsibilities of the Central People's Government of the People's Republic of China.

[...] "The Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property of 20 March 1883, as revised at Stockholm on 14 July 1967 and as amended on [28 September 1979] (hereinafter referred to as the Convention), to which the Government of the

People's Republic of China deposited the instrument of accession on 19 December 1984, will apply to the Macao Special Administrative Region with effect from 20 December 1999. The Government of the People's Republic of China also wishes to make the following declaration: the statement made on Article 28(1) of the Convention by the Government of the People's Republic of China will also apply to the Macao Special Administrative Region.

"The Government of the People's Republic of China will assume responsibility for the international rights and obligations arising from the application of the Agreement to the Macao Special Administrative Region."

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Confirming the precautionary designation of a State whose specific designation has been withdrawn (—not possible)

Q: I filed an international application on 1 November 1999, designating six PCT Contracting States. Shortly after, while reviewing the file, I decided that I was no longer interested in having a patent in one of the States which I had designated, and I notified the International Bureau that I wished to withdraw the designation in question. The International Bureau has since notified me that the designation has been withdrawn.

I have now received information which has led me to conclude that I was wrong to withdraw the designation of that State, and I would, therefore, like to reinstate the withdrawn designation. The time limit for confirming precautionary designations has not expired yet. Is it possible to reinstate the designation of that State by confirming its precautionary designation?

A: Unfortunately, it is not possible to confirm, under PCT Rule 4.9(c), a designation which has already been "specifically" made and subsequently withdrawn. This is due to the fact that, under PCT Rule 4.9(b), and as indicated in the precautionary designation statement in the bottom part of Box No. V of the Request Form, only those designations which were *not* specifically made under PCT Rule 4.9(a)—that is, only those designations which are not made in the top part of Box No. V of the Request Form or which are not indicated in the Supplemental Box of the Request Form as being excluded from the

scope of the precautionary designation statement—can be made in a "precautionary" manner and can subsequently be confirmed under PCT Rule 4.9(c).

The precautionary designation system was designed to protect applicants who forget to make specific designations, or who designate a

State erroneously upon filing the international application; it was not intended to and does not provide a remedy in a situation where a State has already been specifically designated, is later withdrawn or considered withdrawn, and the applicant subsequently wishes to reinstate its designation.

PCT FEE TABLES

The following Tables show the amounts and currencies of the main PCT fees which are payable to the receiving Offices (ROs) and the International Preliminary Examining Authorities (IPEAs) during the international phase under Chapter I (Tables I(a) and I(b)) and under Chapter II (Table II). Fees which are payable only in particular circumstances are not shown; nor are details of certain reductions and refunds which may be available; such information can be found in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. I/B, Annexes C, D and E. Note that all amounts are subject to change due to variations in the fees themselves or fluctuations in exchange rates. The total amount of the basic fee and designation fee may be reduced by CHF 200 under certain circumstances where the request is prepared using the PCT-EASY software; see footnote 2 for details. A 75% reduction in the basic fee, the supplement per sheet over 30, the designation fee and the handling fee, as well as the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States; see footnote 3 for details. (Note that if both the CHF 200 reduction and the 75% reduction are applicable, the 75% reduction is calculated after the CHF 200 reduction.) The key to the abbreviations used and the footnotes to the Fee Tables follow Table II.
