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### **New PCT Contracting State**

### Angola (country code: AO)

On 27 September 2007, Angola deposited its instrument of accession to the PCT, and on 27 December 2007, will become bound by the PCT. Consequently, any international application filed on or after 27 December 2007 will automatically include the designation of Angola.

Also, because Angola will be bound by Chapter II of the PCT, it will automatically be elected in any demand filed in respect of an international application filed on or after 27 December 2007. Furthermore, nationals and residents of Angola will be entitled, as from 27 December 2007, to file international applications under the PCT.

### **Paris Convention**

### **Accession by Angola**

On 27 September 2007, Angola, deposited its instrument of accession to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property, thus bringing the total number of States party to that Convention to 172. Angola will become bound by the Paris Convention on 27 December 2007. This updates the list of States party to the Paris Convention that was published in *PCT Newsletter* No. 09/2007 (together with the list of States party to the PCT and Members of the WTO).

### Assemblies of the Member States of WIPO

The Assemblies of the Member States of WIPO, including the thirty-sixth session of the Assembly of the PCT Union, were held in Geneva from 24 September to 3 October 2007.

### **Assembly of the PCT Union**

Supplementary international search

The Assembly approved the introduction of a new system of supplementary inter-

national searches, which will give applicants the option to request, in addition to the "main" international search, one or more supplementary searches to be carried out by International Authorities, other than the International Searching Authority (ISA) that carries out the main international search. The system is intended to allow a more complete overview of the prior art to be achieved in the international phase, in particular including documents in languages which may not be searched effectively by the Authority conducting the main search. ISAs are free to decide whether to provide a supplementary search service and, if so, under what conditions.

The amendments to the PCT Regulations establishing the new supplementary international search system will enter into force on 1 January 2009, and will apply not only to international applications filed after the date of entry into force but also to pending applications for which it would still be practicable, having regard to the time limits involved, for a supplementary search request to be requested and carried out. Appointment and reappointment of International Authorities; quality management systems

The PCT Assembly appointed the Brazilian National Institute of Industrial Property and the Indian Patent Office as International Searching and Preliminary Examining Authorities. The appointments will take effect from the entry into force of the necessary agreement between the Offices and the International Bureau. The Offices will become the 14th and 15th International Searching and Preliminary Examining Authorities. The Assembly also reappointed all of the existing 13 Authorities for a further period of 10 years. In this context, the Assembly also noted status reports on the quality management systems of the International Authorities (PCT/A/36/3), which are now available on the PCT Resources page of the Patent-Scope website at:

National Institute of Industrial Property as an International Authority, this will permit the processing of international applications filed in these languages to be completed without requiring translations during the international phase. The amendments will apply to international applications whose international filing date is on or after January 1, 2009.

### Other matters

The PCT Assembly also adopted other amendments to the PCT Regulations which will enter into force on 1 July 2008, and apply to international applications the international filing dates of which are on or after that date, subject to transitional arrangements in relation to certain provisions. These amendments are as set out in document PCT/A/36/2 and relate to:

- use of results of earlier searches (the applicant may request the ISA to take into account, in carrying out the international search, not only, as at present, the results of an earlier search carried out by that Authority but also the results of an earlier search carried out by another ISA or any national Office) (see new PCT Rules 4.12 and 12*bis*);
- restoration of right of priority by the receiving office (permitting the receiving Office to extend the time limit for paying a fee for requesting restoration) (see amended PCT Rule 26bis.3(d)); and
- international applications considered withdrawn (clarification that international publication can only be reliably prevented by way of an express withdrawal received by the International Bureau prior to completion of technical preparations for international publication) (see amended PCT Rule 29.1(v)).

The PCT Assembly further requested the International Bureau to carry out a study on the eligibility criteria for determining the group of developing and least developed countries whose applicants should benefit from a reduction in the amount of PCT fees but did not agree on proposals for an across-the-board PCT fee reduction at this stage.

The PCT Assembly also decided that, with the adoption of the above amendments, the work of both the Committee on Reform of the PCT and the Working Group on Reform of the PCT had been completed and that the mandate of both bodies had come to an end. It approved a proposal to convene, should the need arise to consider a matter which required submission to the PCT Assembly, a new Working Group to do preparatory work rather than submitting the matter directly to the Assembly.

### **Digital Access Service for priority documents**

A joint session of the Paris Union Assembly, PCT Assembly, and Patent Law Treaty (PLT) Assembly noted that the system architecture, general principles

and framework provisions of a Digital Access Service for priority documents had been agreed and that work was under way to implement it. This service will allow applicants to meet priority document requirements by requesting an Office of second filing to access the document from a digital library instead of having to provide a physical certified copy from the Office of first filing.

### **Patent Law Treaty**

In addition to deciding the applicability to the PLT of two modifications of the PCT Administrative Instructions made in the past year (PLT/A/3/1), the PLT Assembly adopted model international forms, which can be used for the relevant purposes before the Office of any party to the Treaty (PLT/A/3/2). These cover:

- Request for Recordation of Change in Applicant or Owner;
- Certificate of Transfer;
- Request for Recordation/Cancellation of Recordation of a License; and
- Request for Recordation/Cancellation of Recordation of a Security Interest.

### Publication Schedule and Non-Working Days at the IB during the Holiday Period

### Non-working days at the IB

The non-working days at the International Bureau (IB) during the end-of-year holiday period, in addition to the weekends, will be 20, 25 and 26 December 2007, and 1 and 2 January 2008. The IB will be open for business on 21, 24, 27, 28 and 31 December 2007, and will then be open as usual as from 3 January 2008.

### Closing dates of the PCT Information Service

The PCT Information Service will be closed from Monday, 24 December 2007 to Wednesday, 2 Janu-

ary 2008. It will reopen on Thursday, 3 January 2008, at 9.00 a.m., Geneva (local) time.

Please note, however, that if you call the PCT Information Service (telephone no.: (+41-22) 338 83 38) during the holiday period, there will be a facility for leaving messages and a telephone number will be given for use in cases requiring urgent attention. It is recalled that the PCT Information Service answers general inquiries about the filing of international applications and the procedure to be followed during the international phase of the PCT.

Note that calls relating to specific international applications should be directed to the relevant processing team, the number for which is given on the IB forms. Correspondence relating to specific applications should be addressed to the PCT Operations Division, fax no.: (+41-22) 338 82 70 or to the specific fax number indicated on the IB forms.

### Publication schedule and technical preparations for publication

During the forthcoming holiday period, PCT applications will be published on the usual publication day, Thursday, except for those which would normally have been published on Thursday, 20 December 2007, which is a non-working day at WIPO – those applications will be published a day later, on Friday, 21 December 2007.

However, as from the publication date of 29 November 2007, the completion of technical preparations for publication will take place earlier than the usual 15 days before publication; the schedule for the completion of technical preparations will return to normal for international applications that will be published on 24 January 2008. For further details, see the following table, which gives the schedule for the publications that will be affected, and the respective dates by which any changes should be received by the IB.

Any applicant who, in respect of an international application to be published during the above-mentioned period, wishes to make any change which should be taken into account for the purposes of international publication, should be aware of the above-mentioned dates. For example, if the applicant wishes to withdraw the international application, a designation or a priority claim under PCT Rules 90bis.1(c), 90bis.2(e) or 90bis.3(e), in sufficient time to prevent international publication thereof, or if the applicant wishes to submit amendments to the claims under PCT Article 19 and the time limit under PCT Rule 46.1 will expire soon, or wishes to change an indication concerning the applicant, agent, common representative or inventor under PCT Rule 92bis – any such notice must reach the IB by the date indicated in the right hand column of the table if the changes are to be reflected in the international publication.

## FI Finland (acceptance of international applications with requests in PCT-EASY format)

The National Board of Patents and Registration of Finland has notified the IB that, with effect from 1 January 2008, any PCT-EASY applications (that is, appli-

Furthermore, from 1 January 2008, no international application filed with the Office as receiving Office will benefit from the fee reduction applicable to PCT-EASY applications.

### **Practical Advice**

The consequences of receiving a declaration of non-establishment of an international search report

Q: I have received Form PCT/ISA/203 declaring that no international search report will be established on

my international application because it relates to a subject matter on which my chosen International Searching Authority (ISA) will not carry out searches. What is the consequence of this for the international application? Also, as my receiving Office has specified several authorities as competent ISAs, is it possible to request that another search now be carried out by another ISA that will carry out searches on that particular subject matter?

A: A declaration of non-establishment of an international search report (ISR) (Form PCT/ISA/203) can be made if the ISA considers that a meaningful search could not be carried out because the international application relates to a subject matter which, under the PCT Regulations, the ISA is not required to search and, in the particular case, decides not to search (see PCT Article 17(2)(a)). ISAs often search only subject matter encompassed by the national/regional patent granting procedure under the provisions of their applicable national/regional law. A list of the subject matters which the ISA can decide not to search is provided in PCT Rule 39.1; information relating to the subject matters which will not be searched by a particular ISA can be found on the relevant page of the PCT Applicant's Guide, Annex D; however, for full details, it is preferable to contact the ISA concerned direct. It is recommended that before filing the international application applicants inform themselves about which subject matters the ISA they intend to choose will not search.

Note that a declaration of non-establishment of an ISR can also be made if the ISA considers:

- that the description, the claims, or the drawings do not comply with the prescribed requirements; or
- that a nucleotide and/or amino acid sequence listing and/or tables related thereto are not furnished in accordance with the prescribed standard and technical requirements or in an electronic form

to such an extent that a meaningful search could not be carried out.

Where no ISR has been established, this does not in itself have any influence on the validity of the international application, the processing of which will continue, including its publication and communication to the designated (or elected) Offices. Note, however, that if no ISR has been established, it will not be possible to file amendments to the claims under PCT Article 19, and, although you may in principle file a demand and amendments to the international application under PCT Article 34, the International Preliminary Examining Authority is not obliged to examine the claims concerned (see PCT Rule 66.1(e)). Upon entry into the national phase, however, you will be given the opportunity to amend the application before

the Office concerned under PCT Article 28(1) or 41(1). Note, however, that any amendments must not go beyond what was originally disclosed in the international application.

Where a declaration of non-establishment of an ISR under PCT Article 17(2)(a) is made, there would normally still be, as a formal matter, a written opinion (Form PCT/ISA/237) in accordance with PCT Rule 43bis.1(a), but it would not normally contain any opinion of substance, but rather a corresponding observation would be made by the ISA in Box No. III of the form that no meaningful opinion could be established since no ISR had been established. The International Bureau would make a similar observation on the International Preliminary Report on Patentability (IPRP Chapter I of the PCT) (Form PCT/IB/373). If the International Bureau receives any informal comments from the applicant following the ISA's notification on Form PCT/ISA/237, it would simply communicate them to the designated Offices (for further information on informal comments, see the Practical Advice in PCT Newsletter No. 10/2004, page 7).

As far as your ability to request a further international search by another ISA is concerned, under the current PCT Regulations, you are not permitted to do this. Notwithstanding, this will probably change in the near future, once the newly adopted regulations enter into force which provide for the supplementary international search system, and once at least one ISA has announced that it is prepared to carry out such supplementary international search reports (see cover page for further details). Even when this new system does become operational, however, where the first ISA has made the declaration referred to in Article 17(2)(a) and that declaration is available to the Authority specified for supplementary search before it starts the search, that Authority may decide not to establish a supplementary international search report, in which case it shall so declare and promptly notify the applicant and the International Bureau accordingly (see new PCT Rule 45bis.5 (e)). If you cannot obtain an ISR, it may be possible for you to request a private prior art search of the application.

Without an ISR, you will be in less of a position to make an informed evaluation about whether you are likely to obtain a patent in the national phase, noting however, that since this is a decision to be taken by the designated (or elected) Offices, and since the national/regional law applied by those Offices varies as to what subject matter is patentable, the fact that no ISR was established might have different consequences on the further patent granting procedure before the various Offices.


