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# Important Change in the Publication of the PCT Newsletter

The PCT Newsletter has been published as a monthly paper, subscription-based publication since March 1994. It has also been published, free-of-charge, on the WIPO website since January 1997 (www.wipo.int/pct/en/newslett/).

It is recalled that in the first half of 2006 the paper PCT publications - the PCT Gazette and the PCT Applicant's Guide - became fully online publications. Moreover, many other WIPO publications (and Newsletters) are also available in electronic form only. It therefore seems natural that the PCT Newsletter should follow current publishing trends and proceed in electronic form only. WIPO has therefore decided to discontinue the paper version of the Newsletter with effect from 1 January 2008. This decision was taken after consultation with a significant number of PCT users who supported this move. Thus, as from January 2008, the PCT Newsletter will be available only on the Internet, and there will no longer be any subscriptions payable for the Newsletter.

Readers of the electronic Newsletter can access it much earlier than readers of the paper version have been able to do (due to the time it has taken to print, bind and deliver the paper Newsletter). The former can also benefit from the PCT e-mail updating service, subscribers to which are informed as soon as each issue becomes available on the Internet by way of an e-mail containing a link to the relevant issue. # Withdrawal of Notifications of Incompatibility of Certain Modified PCT Rules with National Laws

EP European Patent Office (PCT Rules 4.10(d), 20.8(a), 20.8(b), 26*bis*.3(j), 49*ter*.1(g) and 49*ter*.2(h), 49.6(f) and 51*bis*.1(f))

As a result of the entry into force of the revised version of the European Patent Convention (EPC 2000) on 13 December 2007, the European Patent Office, in its capacity as receiving Office, or where applicable, designated Office, has withdrawn a number of notifications of incompatibility with its national law with effect from that date, as follows:

• PCT Rule 4.10(d) (right of priority for members of the World Trade Organization which are not members of the Paris Convention) as modified since 1 January 2000 (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 12/1999, cover page);

### PCT E-mail Updating Service: Possible Problems for Certain Subscribers

It has come to our attention that some subscribers to the PCT e-mail updating service have not been receiving the e-mails announcing the publication of the *PCT Newsletter* on the Internet, as well as other important announcements. We have looked into this problem and it is possible that the persons affected are no longer receiving the e-mails because their firm has an e-mail filter system that is picking up the notification and treating it as spam.

Some filters are set up to delete all "yelling" e-mails, that is, those containing upper case in the title, and others tend to be suspicious of html with graphics. Our e-mail notifications contain both of these elements. We are looking into ways of avoiding this problem but unfortunately different filters look for different spam identifiers and it is difficult to predict how individual systems are set up. Some spam filter systems allow some choice as to how the spam is filtered. Such systems leave the final decision about what is or is not spam up to each end-user so that e-mails can be tailored and configured down to that last user. If, however, an e-mail is identified (albeit mistakenly) by someone as spam, any future mails will not get through.

### PatentScope Search Service

### Technology Focus: a closer look at recent developments in selected technologies

This new service provides, through technology reports as well as pre-defined searches of the latest published PCT international patent applications, a quick visualization of developments in selected technologies. The technologies have been selected on the basis of public interest or relevance to prominent areas of public policy.

The search terms are based mainly on the International Patent Classification, the international standard for classifying patent documents according to its technological subject. For each technology search, you can refine the search by entering relevant keywords.

This service, linked to the PatentScope Search Service, enables you, for selected technologies, to:

track the overall rate of international patent activity;

- monitor the different players, including private firms, public institutions and individual inventors working in the selected technology area;
- review the geographical spread of patenting activity;
- access related documents, such as international search reports;
- follow up patenting activity at the national level in certain countries;
- conduct more specific searches linked to a defined subclass you are interested in; and
- subscribe to regular RSS updates of new patent activity in your area of interest.

Presently, the following topics are available, or will be coming soon: energy, textiles and traditional medicine. Further topics will shortly be added to this list and, as the technologies evolve, some topics might be removed.

### **Practical Advice**

### Publication of a rectification of an obvious mistake after international publication

Q: I filed an international application on 16 April 2007, claiming priority of an earlier application filed on 25 April 2006. It was only after my international application was published recently that I noticed that there was a mistake in the description of the invention. I therefore immediately submitted to the International Searching Authority (ISA) a request for rectification of an obvious mistake. If that request for rectification is authorized by the ISA, will the international application be republished with the corrected text? If it is not authorized, can the request for rectification itself be published so that designated Offices and third parties can be made aware of that mistake?

A: Since your international application was filed after 1 April 2007, PCT Rule 91, as amended with effect from that date, applies (it is important to note that for international applications filed before 1 April 2007, PCT Rule 91 as applicable prior to that date applies\*).

It is recalled that under new PCT Rule 91.2, the applicant may request the competent authority to authorize a rectification of an obvious mistake within 26 months from the priority date (note that depending

on the part of the international application concerned, or depending on the stage in the proceedings during the international phase, authorities other than the ISA (the receiving Office, the International Bureau (IB) or the International Preliminary Examining Authority) may be competent to authorize the rectification – see PCT Rule 91.1(b) for details). The authority will authorize the rectification if it is obvious to that authority that, as at the international filing date (or other applicable date under PCT Rule 91.1(f)), something else was intended than what appears in the document concerned and nothing else could have been intended than the proposed rectification (PCT Rule 91.1(c)).

If your request for rectification of an obvious mistake in the description is authorized by the ISA, the IB will, in accordance with PCT Rule 48.2(i), publish the following as soon as possible, free of charge:

- a revised version of the front page of the published international application;
- the replacement sheets (marked with the words "RECTIFIED SHEET (RULE 91)"; and
- a statement reflecting the rectification and/or the applicant's letter requesting rectification.

The documents concerned will be available under the "Documents" tab of the relevant published international application at: www.wipo.int/pctdb/en/

Designated (or elected) Offices (as well as the receiving Office and international authorities, as required) will be aware of the rectification through its publication on PatentScope. Generally, a designated Office must process the international application in the national phase "as rectified", unless the Office:

- has already started the processing or examination of the international application before the date on which that Office is notified by the IB of the authorization of the rectification concerned (PCT Rule 91.3(e)), or
- finds that it would not have authorized the rectification if it had been the competent authority (however, it must give the applicant the opportunity to make observations) (PCT Rule 91.3(f)).

If your request for rectification is refused by the ISA, you may request the IB in writing, within two months from the date of the notification of refusal, to publish, together with the international application, information concerning the request for rectification and its refusal, namely:

the request for rectification,

- the reasons for refusal by the authority; and
- any further brief comments that you may wish to submit.

This request is subject to the payment at the same time of a special fee (currently 50 Swiss francs plus 12 Swiss francs for each page in excess of one) which is indicated in Annex B2 (IB) of the *PCT Applicant's Guide* (www.wipo.int/pct/guide/en/gdvol1/annexes/annexb2/ax\_b\_ib.pdf) (see PCT Rules 91.3(d) and 48.2(k)). If a rectification of an obvious mistake is refused prior to completion of technical preparations for publication, and the applicant requests the IB to publish information concerning the request for rectification and its refusal, this information is published together with the international application.

Once information on a refused request for rectification has been published, the applicant may pursue it further before the designated (or elected) Offices according to their national law and practice for the rectification of obvious mistakes.

\* PCT Rule 91, as in force prior to 1 April 2007, allows less time for submission of requests for rectification of obvious "errors", and the way in which the time limit is calculated is different: apart from cases where the authorization of the rectification is given by the IPEA, a request for rectification will be effective if authorization by the competent authority reaches the IB before the expiration of 17 months from the priority date; under current PCT Rule 91, it will be effective if the request for rectification is submitted to the competent authority before the expiration of 26 months from the priority date. The following Tables show the amounts and currencies of the main PCT fees which are payable to the receiving Offices (ROs) and the International Preliminary Examining Authorities (IPEAs) during the international phase under Chapter I (Tables I(a) and I(b)) and under Chapter II (Table II). Fees which are payable only in particular circumstances are not shown; nor are details of certain reductions and refunds which may be available; such information can be found in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Annexes C, D and E. Note that all amounts are subject to change due to variations in the fees themselves or fluctuations in exchange rates. The international filing fee may be reduced by CHF 100 under certain circumstances where the request is prepared using the PCT-EASY features of the PCT-SAFE software or by CHF 200 or 300 where the international application is filed in electronic form, as prescribed; see Item 3(a), (b) and (c) of the Schedule of Fees (annexed to the Regulations under the PCT) and the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, paragraph 202(A). A 75% reduction in the international filing fee (including the fee per sheet over 30) and the handling fee, as well as an exemption from the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States—see footnotes 2 and 12. (Note that if the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction, as the case may be, and the 75% reduction are applicable, the 75% reduction is calculated *after* the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction.) The footnotes to the Fee Tables follow Table II.
