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Withdrawal of Notifications of Incompatibility of Certain PCT Articles and Rules with National Laws

Sweden (PCT Article 22(1) and PCT Rules 49ter.1(g) and 49ter.2(h))

Further to its notification of incompatibility of PCT Article 22(1), as modified with effect from 1 April 2002, with its national law (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 02/2002), the Swedish Patent and Registration Office, in its capacity as designated Office, has notified the International Bureau (IB) that it has withdrawn its notification with effect from 1 July 2007.

Furthermore, pursuant to PCT Articles 22(3) and 39(1)(b), the Office has notified the IB that the time limit applicable for entry into the national phase before it as designated Office and as elected Office is, with effect from 1 July 2007, 31 months from the priority date. (Updating of table of time limits for entering the national/regional phase under PCT Chapters I and II).

Further to its notifications of incompatibility under PCT Rules 49ter.1(g) (effect of restoration of right of priority by receiving Office) and 49ter.2(h) (restoration of right of priority by designated Office) as modified with effect from 1 April 2007, with its national law (see PCT Newsletter No. 03/2006), the Office, in its capacity as designated Office, has notified the IB that it has withdrawn the said notifications with effect from 1 July 2007. PCT Rules 49ter.1(a) to (f) and 49ter.2(a) to (g) therefore apply with respect to the Office with effect from that date.

Furthermore, the Office, in its capacity as designated (or elected) Office, has notified the IB under PCT Rule 49ter.2(g) that it applies the "due care" criterion to requests for restoration of the right of priority.

Canada (PCT Rule 51bis.2(c))

Further to its notification of incompatibility of PCT Rule 51 bis.2(a)(ii) with its national law (see PCT Newsletter No. 02/2001, page 2), the Canadian Intellectual Property Office, in its capacity as designated Office, has notified the IB that it has withdrawn its notification with effect from 2 June 2007. PCT Rule 51 bis.2(a)(ii), concerning certain circumstances in which documents or evidence may not be required by the designated Office, therefore applies from that date.

New PCT Wheel

A new PCT Wheel, covering priority dates from January 2006 to December 2007, was inserted at the last minute in the paper version of the May 2007 issue of the *PCT Newsletter* (No. 05/2007).

The PCT Wheel, which was created by patent attorneys from Davies Collison Cave, Melbourne, Australia, enables PCT users to quickly calculate the time limits for submitting priority documents (when necessary), filing amendments under PCT Article 19, filing a demand

Update on the States of Serbia and Montenegro: the PCT and Extended European Patents

In a notice dated 23 May 2007, the European Patent Office published information concerning the Co-operation and Extension Agreement with the former State Union of Serbia and Montenegro. Please find below information about the applicability of the PCT in Serbia and in Montenegro (see 1(a) and 2(a)) and a summary of the information published by the EPO in connection with the extension of European patents (see 1(b) and 2(b)).

(1) Serbia

(a) Applicability of the Patent Cooperation Treaty (reminder)

As published in *PCT Newsletter* No. 10/2006, cover page, as a result of the declaration of independence adopted by the National Assembly of the Republic of Montenegro on 3 June 2006, Serbia deposited, on 19 September 2006, a declaration to the effect that the PCT continues to be applicable as from 3 June 2006 in that State. It is recalled that, pursuant to that declaration, nationals and residents of Serbia can file international applications, and Serbia is automatically designated in international applications filed on or after 4 June 2006. Any international application the international filing date of which is prior to 4 June 2006 and in which the State Union of Serbia and Montenegro was designated will be recognized in Serbia. (b) Extension of European patents

It is recalled that prior to 3 June 2006 it was possible to extend a European patent to Serbia and Montenegro. The government of the Republic of Serbia informed the European Patent Office (EPO) on 27 November 2006 that Serbia continues to exercise its rights and meet its commitments under the Agreement between the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia and the European Patent Organisation on Cooperation in the Field of Patents of 26 November 2001, signed and ratified by the State Union of Serbia and Montenegro. It therefore remains possible to extend a European patent to Serbia. For further information, see the Notice from the EPO dated 23 May 2007 listed under "Updates" at:

(2) Montenegro

(a) Applicability of the Patent Cooperation Treaty

Further to the publication in *PCT Newsletter* No. 01/2007 of information concerning the declara-

tion of independence by Montenegro (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 10/2006) and the declaration by Montenegro that the PCT continues to be applicable, as from 3 June 2006, in respect of that State (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 01/2007), we inform you that the International Bureau (IB) has made comments on draft regulations submitted by the Montenegrin authorities that would provide the legal basis giving international applications effect in Montenegro where Serbia and Montenegro was designated and which were filed before its independence. These draft regulations also provide for international applications currently being processed in Serbia, and patents already granted in Serbia based on international applications. The IB is awaiting further news from Montenegrin officials.

As soon as the final text of the Regulations has been notified to the IB, a notice will be published to clarify these outstanding matters, and what steps, if any, need to be taken by applicants who wish their international applications or patents to have effect in Montenegro.

(b) Extension of European patents

The EPO has announced that, although it remains possible to extend a European patent to Serbia (see above), the EPO has not, up to now, been contacted by the government of the Republic of Montenegro with regard to the Co-operation and Extension Agreement between the European Patent Organisation and the former State Union of Serbia and Montenegro. As soon as the EPO has any further news on this matter, it will make another announcement, but in the meantime, it has published the following information:

"...the European Patent Office bases the applicability of the Co-operation and Extension Agreement on the following assumptions:

"Serbia is the legal successor to the State Union as regards the Co-operation and Extension Agreement. As of 4 June 2006 the Co-operation and Extension Agreement no longer applies to the territory of Montenegro. European patent applications and PCT applications filed after 3 June 2006 and entering the European phase, and European patents resulting from such applications, can be extended to the territory of Serbia only.

"The protection conferred by pending European patent applications and PCT applications filed up to 3 June 2006 and entering the European phase, and by European patents resulting from such applications, can be extended to the territory of Serbia. The European Patent Office will endeavour, in co-operation with the Serbian

and Montenegrin authorities, to clarify whether the protection resulting from such applications and patents can also be extended to the territory of Montenegro."

Filing and Processing of International Applications in Electronic Form

Possible problem with page count when using PCT-SAFE/epoline® Online Filing Software

It has come to the attention of the International Bureau (IB) that where the PCT-SAFE software or the epoline® Online Filing Software has been used for fully electronic filing of an international application (especially when using versions of the software incorporating changes required in accordance with amendments to the PCT Regulations which entered into force on 1 April 2007), there may, in the case of a limited number of international applications, be a discrepancy between the number of pages constituting the request form on the client side (applicant's computer using the software) and the number of pages on the server side (the receiving Office server). Several international applications have been identified where differences in style sheets have resulted in greater line-spacing on the client side than on the server side.

In the event of any discrepancy in the number of pages of the request caused by problems with the software, the IB does not want the applicant to be put at a disadvantage as far as the "fee per sheet over 30" is concerned. The IB as a receiving Office has therefore adopted the following procedure, and is proposing to other receiving Offices that they adopt a similar means to resolve any such fee issues that may arise:

- Where the client side shows more pages than on the server side, the applicant may have overpaid the amount of the "fee per sheet over 30" component of the international filing fee, in which case the receiving Office should refund the difference to the applicant.
- If the server side has more pages than counted on the client side, the receiving Offices should not charge a fee for the "extra pages".

A patch for the PCT-SAFE software, which stabilizes line-spacing, was released on 25 May 2007 and all PCT-SAFE registered users have been notified of this (see PCT-SAFE update, below, for details).

The EPO will, as soon as possible, issue a patch for its software which fixes the problem. This only concerns *epoline*® users filing PCT applications with the Patent Office of the Republic of Poland, the Industrial Property Office (Slovakia) and the IB as receiving Offices under the PCT. It will be made available through the "EOLF live update" for users filing with the Patent Office of the Republic of Poland and the Industrial Property Office (Slovakia) as receiving Offices, and on the EPO website for users filing with the IB as receiving Office. Users concerned may find more information on the EPO website.

PCT-SAFE Update

Release of PCT-SAFE Client Patch

An update patch, dated 25 May 2007, for the PCT-SAFE Client software may now be downloaded from the PCT-SAFE website at:

Note that this patch will only update the 1 April 2007 full installation of the PCT-SAFE Client software (version 3.51.018.193) and must not be used to update any other version of the Client software.

The patch includes the following updates: the possibility of creating 1 April 2007 request forms with the receiving Offices of Denmark, Finland, the Netherlands, Poland, Romania, Slovakia, Spain, Sweden and the United Kingdom, modified character sets to im-

prove East European character display in the request, the stabilization of line-spacing in the request form, and the possibility of on-line filing with the German Patent and Trade Mark Office as receiving Office using the PCT-SAFE software.

Warning About Requests for Payment of Fees (Reminder)

Further to the many previous warnings that have been published in the *PCT Newsletter*, it has come to the attention of the International Bureau (IB) that PCT applicants and agents are continuing to receive invitations to pay fees that do not come from the International Bureau of WIPO and are unrelated to the processing of international applications under the PCT. Whatever services might be offered in such invitations, they bear no connection to WIPO or to any of its official publications.

The invitations often identify a particular PCT application by its international publication number (for example: WO 05 xxxxxx), publication date, title of the invention, international application number, priority information and IPC symbols. The invitations typically refer to a payment, which is to be made in euro or US dollars, by cheque and/or money transfer to addresses in various countries. Recent invitations which have been sent to the IB (from ODM – Office Data Management and IOPTS – International Organization for Patent and Trademark Service) refer to payments of EUR 981.50 and EUR 1,499.50, respectively, to banks based in Slovakia and the USA, on forms similar to the examples which can found at:

The WIPO website (www.wipo.int/pct/en/warning/pct_warning.htm) also lists the names of other companies from which PCT users have received similar invitations, and gives examples of the invitations from these sources. The other companies were also listed in *PCT Newsletter* No. 01/2007, on page 6.

PCT applicants and agents should note that it is the International Bureau of WIPO alone which publishes all PCT applications promptly after the expiration of 18 months from the priority date (see PCT Article 21(2)(a)); there is no separate fee for such international publication, and the legal effects of international publication are set out in PCT Article 29. If

they have not already done so, PCT applicants and agents are advised to bring this information to the attention of the people responsible for handling payments of fees within their organizations. Practical Advice

Submitting replacement drawings where no invitation to correct defects has been issued

Q: Upon filing an international application, I submitted drawings which had been drawn up hastily, and which I do not think were good enough quality. However, I have not yet received an invitation by the receiving Office to submit replacement drawings of better quality. Is it possible to file replacement drawings even if an invitation to correct defects (Form PCT/RO/106) has not yet been issued by the receiving Office? If so, what is the time limit for doing this? Also, if they are received by the International Bureau after international publication, will they be forwarded to the designated Offices?

A: If the quality of the drawings you have submitted is poor, you do not need to wait for the receiving Office to issue an invitation to correct defects in the international application because substitute sheets under PCT Rule 26 may be submitted to correct formal defects in the drawings, on the applicant's own initiative (see PCT Receiving Office Guidelines, paragraph 209, at: www.wipo.int/pct/en/texts/pdf/ro.pdf). The ability to submit replacement sheets without invitation by the receiving Office is not limited to drawings – it applies equally to the text matter of the international application. As far as your drawings are concerned, it may even be the case that the receiving Office does not intend to invite correction. You should bear in mind, however, that the omission by the receiving Office to invite correction does not prevent the designated (or elected) Offices from inviting the applicant to comply with the requirements under PCT Rule 11 in the national phase.

In order to assess whether the quality of any drawings or text matter filed in paper form is sufficient, you should bear in mind that the sheets will be scanned by the International Bureau (IB) for publication purposes. Furthermore, certain receiving Offices which do not require applications to be filed in more than one copy may prepare a copy of the application them-

selves for search purposes (whether by photocopying or scanning), and you should be aware that that a bad reproduction of the drawings might even affect the quality of the search.

It is recalled that replacement sheets should be sent directly to the receiving Office, and not to the IB-it is the receiving Office which forwards the sheets to the IB for international publication. Where there has been no invitation from the receiving Office to correct defects, there is no fixed time limit for sending the replacement sheets to the receiving Office. However, they must be sent early enough so that the receiving Office can transmit them to the IB before the completion of technical preparations for publication (normally 15 days prior to the publication date). If they are received in time, they will be published as part of the international application.

If the formal drawings are received late by the IB and are not published, they will not be forwarded to the designated Offices, and you would need to furnish the replacement sheets separately to each designated Office concerned later, during the national phase. Nor would the formal drawings be available on the database of International Patent Applications (Patent-Scope) published on the WIPO website. They would,

nevertheless become part of the file held by the IB, and would be available as follows:

- under PCT Rule 94.1(a) they would be available, at any time, to anyone authorized by the applicant, subject to the reimbursement of the cost of the service; and
- under PCT Rule 94.1(b) they would be available to third parties after international publication of the international application, subject to the reimbursement of the cost of the service.

It is therefore recommended that the replacement drawings be submitted as soon as possible in the PCT procedure, even if you have not received an invitation to correct defects from the receiving Office, particularly if the originally filed sheets are such that if they are reproduced, the clarity and sufficiency of the disclosure might suffer.

The international filing fee may be reduced by CHF 100 under certain circumstances where the request is prepared using the PCT-EASY features of the PCT-SAFE software or by CHF 200 or 300 where the international application is filed in electronic form, as prescribed; see Item 3(a), (b) and (c) of the Schedule of Fees (annexed to the Regulations under the PCT) and the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, paragraph 202(A). A 75% reduction in the international filing fee (including the fee per sheet over 30) and the handling fee, as well as an exemption from the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States—see footnotes 2 and 12. (Note that if the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction, as the case may be, and the 75% reduction are applicable, the 75% reduction is calculated *after* the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction.) The footnotes to the Fee Tables follow Table II.
